

Murray County Parks & Recreation Advisory Commission Minutes

June 14, 2018

The Murray County Parks & Recreation Advisory Commission convened on June 14, 2018 outside the Murray County Government Center in Slayton. The following voting members were present: Leroy Reese (Chair), Rae Storm (Vice Chair), Doug Stewart (Secretary), Justin Hoffmann, Tom Kappes, and Les Speckmeier. Ex-officio members in attendance were Jean Christoffels and Amy Rucker.

All boarded a Murray County Transportation bus which left for Corabelle Park at 5:30 p.m.

Reese called the meeting to order at 5:30 p.m.

Agenda:

MSP: Hoffmann and Speckmeier to approve the agenda.

Secretary's Report:

MSP: Kappes and Storm to approve the minutes of the April 19, 2018 meeting.

Park Director's Report:

- Hoffmann applied for a permit to kill weeds at the boat access and fishing pier at Seven Mile Lake Park. The Fulda Fish & Game Club applied the chemical.
- The Lakers 4H Club is going to donate 5 park benches to Swenson Park.
- Storm asked why buoys on Shetek are positioned differently than last year. He said that questions regarding buoys should be asked of the Sheriff's Office as they put the buoys in the water.
- Hoffmann showed a few examples for a sign for Marsh's Landing. The kiosk will be moved and the 4x4's will be used to mount the sign.
MSP: Kappes and Storm to go with the sign designed by the school.
- MVTV has finished installing wireless internet at Swenson, Seven Mile Lake, and Sundquist Parks.
- The toilet was running non-stop at Lime Lake Park. A new filter was added to capture particulate.
- It is possible that some of the funds set aside for the dam repair at Lime Lake Park can be used for the monument.
- The camp host at Swenson Park showed the playground plans to campers and they were well received. Campers would like to see a basketball hoop added as well.
- Plans for the East Sarah playground were sent to the PALS Club for comment.

The group returned to Slayton.
