RESOLUTION 32 - 2022

A resolution declaring Sheriff K9 Havoc as retired, surplus, and authorizing the sale of K9 Havoc to his handler Sergeant Tait Everett

WHEREAS, the Okanogan County Sheriff's Office owns one Belgian Malinois named Havoc, who has faithfully and loyally served Okanogan County and its citizens; and

WHEREAS, due to age, is no longer fit for duty; and

WHEREAS, Havoc is a police service dog that has received training in police canine apprehension procedures as well as drug detection procedures and tactics and as a result of such training and use as a police service dog, or for other reasons, Havoc may pose a risk of causing serious injury and/or death and/or property damage; and

WHEREAS, Havoc has been trained by and has been under the constant care of Sergeant Tait Everett for his working life; and

WHEREAS, it is in Havoc's best interests to remain in the Everett household, and Sergeant Everett has requested that Havoc be sold to him.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of Okanogan County Commissioners that K9 Havoc be retired from service and declared surplus to the needs of Okanogan County.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that Havoc shall be sold to Sergeant Tait Everett for the sum of one dollar.
