RESOLUTION 141-2023

A resolution authorizing funding to the City of Brewster From the .09 Infrastructure Fund for Emerging Opportunity Project at Anderson Field Airport

WHEREAS, RCW 82.14.370 authorizes the legislative authority of a rural county to impose sales and use tax at a rate not to exceed .09 percent; and

WHEREAS, Okanogan County Code 3.11.010 imposes the collection of sales and use tax for public facilities in rural counties as authorized by RCW 82.14.370; and

WHEREAS, said tax is to be used to finance public facilities serving economic development purposes; and

WHEREAS, the City of Brewster submitted an Emerging Opportunity application for their Anderson Field Airport project which is currently under construction and has secured funding through a Federal FAA source contingent on the city providing the 10% match; and

WHEREAS, the city has funding for 5% of the required match and requests the other 5% from county Infrastructure funds in the amount of \$62,062.39; and

WHEREAS, Resolution 54-2008 allows for disbursal of the sales and use tax funds collected for the purposes outlined in RCW 82.14.370 to finance public facilities serving economic development purpose; and

WHEREAS, the Economic Alliance Infrastructure and Executive Committees both reviewed and voted to approve the City of Brewster's Emerging Opportunity application for a project involving airport expansion with hangar development, relocation of runway, and provisions of safety improvements required by FAA standards project and on October 16, 2023 the application was approved for funding by the Board of Okanogan County Commissioners; and

WHEREAS, the Emerging Opportunities account has sufficient funds for this request;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of Okanogan County Commissioners that the acquisition by the City of Brewster is consistent with RCW 82.14.370 and will encourage economic development in the City of Brewster; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that funding not to exceed \$62,063 is hereby authorized from the county Infrastructure Fund 117 be used by the City of Brewster for the 5% match money needed for Anderson Field Airport improvement project.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Clerk of the Board work with the Chief Civil Deputy to draft the interlocal agreement between Okanogan County and the city of Brewster for the funding.

1. Please provide a brief description of the project:							
This project, which is currently under construction, will involve expansion of the airport							
infrastructure at Anderson Field in Brewster, WA, including construction of a portion of							
the future parallel taxiway on the east and west side of the existing apron, and new							
taxilanes providing access to future hangar development areas. In addition to the							
taxilanes, a relocated runway connector will be constructed to enhance safety of airport							
operations.							
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6. How does this Project improve local infrastructure capacity?

This project will provide hangar development areas, enabling increased use of the airport and capacity for additional based aircraft. The relocated runway connector included in this project is a safety improvement required to meet FAA design standards and ensure the continued safe operation of the airport.

7. How does your project incorporate planning and implementing economic and community resilience initiatives?

Expanding the airport revenue base will help assure the long-term viability of the airport which supports essential services such as medivac and organ donation and local businesses such a agricultural operations which operate up to 19 helicopters out of the airport.

8. Will this project help you solve a health or safety problem or come into compliance with an EPA or DOE order? If so, please specify?

The runway connector relocation portion of this project will provide improved safety over the existing configuration in two ways. The existing connector position provided direct access from the aircraft parking apron to the runway. This configuration is considered undesirable by FAA design standards as an aircraft can taxi in a straight line directly from a parking area and inadvertently enter the runway. This existing connector was also located in the center of the runway. FAA design standards recommend connectors are not located in the middle third of the runway, as this is where high energy aircraft operations occur. The proposed relocated configuration will resolve these issues and ensure continued compliance with FAA design standards.

9. Will this Project result in the creation of new jobs or the retention of existing jobs? Will workforce training be available? Please explain and quantify if possible.

The construction phase of this project will create temporary construction, supplier, and construction support related jobs.

The development-ready hangar area constructed as part of this project could attract aviation related businesses such as aircraft maintenance or agricultural operations which would provide permanent jobs. Additional temporary construction jobs will be created as hangars are constructed.
