ORDINANCE 2023 - 6

AN ORDINANCE revising Okanogan County Code (OCC) Chapter 1.28 General Penalty, Section 1.28.010 Designated.

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners is in the process of reviewing and updating the Okanogan County Code.

WHEREAS, OCC 1.28.010 enacted by 1976 ordinance 1976-001, establishes that the general penalty for violating any of the provisions or failing to comply with any of the mandatory requirements of the ordinances of Okanogan County is a misdemeanor offense.

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners after consideration has determined that an infraction should be the default penalty for violating any of the provisions or failing to comply with any of the mandatory requirements of the code of Okanogan County.

WHEREAS the Board of County Commissioners conducted a public hearing on Monday, March 27, 2023 at 1:50 p.m. 2023 to consider whether Ordinance 1976-001 should be repealed and OCC Chapter 1.28 General Penalty, Section 1.28.010 Designated should be revised.

NOW THEREFORE, THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF OKANOGAN COUNTY ORDAINS AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Repeal. Ordinance 1976-001 is hereby repealed.

Section 2. Revise. OCC Chapter 1.28 General Penalty, Section 1.28.010 Designated is hereby revised as described in Attachment A;

Section 3. Effective date. This ordinance takes effect immediately;

Section 4. Codify. The Clerk of the Board is directed to proceed with codification of the revision described in Attachment A.

Chapter 1.28 GENERAL PENALTY

Sections:

1.28.010 Designated. 

~~Any person violating any of the provisions or failing to comply with any of the mandatory requirements of the ordinances of the county is guilty of a misdemeanor. Except in cases where a different punishment is prescribed by any ordinance of the county, any person convicted of a misdemeanor under the ordinances of the county shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$250.00, or by imprisonment not to exceed 90 days, or by both such fine and imprisonment. (Ord. 76-1 § 1, 1976).~~

1.28.010 Designated.

All violations of county ordinances are infractions punishable by a maximum fine of two hundred fifty dollars (\$250.00) unless expressly made otherwise pursuant to county ordinance.
