

CHUWEAH CREEK FIRE UPDATE

NORTHWEST INCIDENT MANAGEMENT TEAM 12

Operations:

Firefighters continue to mop up, monitor and diligently patrol the fire perimeter. Due to limited active fire behavior, no water drops were needed Monday, and air resources were able to support firefighting efforts on the Summit Trail Fire.

Monday night was the last night shift on the Chuweah Creek Fire. The Central Peak Fire (Incident #90) continues to smolder and creep, but containment lines remain secure. All evacuations orders have been lifted, as have all road closures.

Today, Northwest Team 12 will begin transitioning to California Team 10, who will assume command of the Chuweah Creek Fire Wednesday at 6:00 a.m., as well as continuing to manage the Summit Trail Fire.

This is the last Update Team 12 will produce for the Chuweah Creek Fire.
