

Washington State is all vote by mail. There is no need to request an absentee ballot. Every active registered voter in Washington is automatically mailed a ballot.

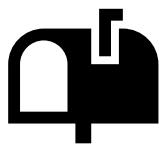
How does vote by mail work?



All active registered voters are sent a ballot at least 18 days prior to the election. The ballots can be mailed anywhere in the world. Registered voters are encouraged to ensure that their mailing address is current. Please visit voter.votewa.gov to review or update your address or contact us at 509-422-7240.



Vote from the comfort of your own home. Mark your ballot and place in the security envelope (in Okanogan County these are the pink envelopes). Then place the sealed security (pink) envelope with your ballot into the return envelope. Be sure to sign and date the return envelope.



Ballots have pre-paid postage so no need for a stamp. Mailed ballots must be postmarked by election day. We also have drop boxes throughout our county. Ballot drop boxes are open until 8pm on election night. The list of ballot box locations is on your ballot or you can visit our website at www.okanogancounty.org/auditor for a list of ballot box locations.
