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three drop off locations within losco County. We have extended our contract with RRS to assist us with implementation of the program. Next steps include host site agreements, determining the final site for the Tawas area, and an agreement with the Alpena Authority for processing.

2. **Election Commission** – Mr. Sutton – We completed IOSCO COUNTY'S APPROVED MULTI-JURISDICTIONAL EARLY VOTING PLAN 2024 which will host early voting for the entire county at the Tawas Township Hall.



GRAND RAPIDS, Mich., Sept. 25, 2023 – Michiganders have not been immune to severe weather changes happening around the globe. Ice storms, 60+ mph winds and multiple late summer tornadoes are part of a broader trend challenging energy grids nationwide. The last four-year period in Michigan has seen wind-speed averages twice as high as any similar period in the last 20 years.

"Job #1 for us is to keep the lights on regardless of the weather," said Tonya Berry, Senior Vice President of Transformation & Engineering at Consumers Energy.

"Consistent with our commitment to improve service reliability, Consumers Energy has established new grid performance expectations that better reflect the reality of what Mother Nature is sending our way," Berry continued. "We are sharing these customer service commitments for the first time, reinforcing our 'Count on Us' promise to the nearly 2 million electric customers we have the privilege of serving."

- **Grid modernization:** Enhancing the ability for smart meters, sensors and automation devices to work together to help monitor, isolate and automatically respond to interruptions more effectively.
- **Equity and environmental justice:** Sustaining our commitment that all communities will experience the benefits of the Reliability Roadmap and can participate in the clean energy transformation.

"We've identified the steps we can take to move forward, and we know the result will be an electric grid that can better withstand extreme weather and serve our customers around the clock," said Chris Laird, Consumers Energy's vice president of electric operations.

"Our commitment is strong," said Greg Salisbury, Consumers Energy's vice president of electric distribution engineering. "We will not stop until our grid is more resilient and reliable. We look forward to working with the Michigan Public Service Commission and others to make this happen."



## **Getting the Grid**

Our vast system, which includes more than 90,000 miles of electric lines and about 1,100 substations, is made up of high-voltage distribution (HVD) and low-voltage distribution (LVD) components.

The HVD system receives electricity from the transmission system (not owned by us) at large substations and carries it at either 46 kilovolt (kV) or 138 kV. We can serve only a handful of large industrial customers at that level.

So, our network of distribution substations and smaller transformers step the electricity down progressively for safe delivery to homes and businesses along LVD lines.

## **Our Roadmap**

We're serving our 1.9 million electric customers throughout Michigan's Lower Peninsula with a system that's even more safe, reliable, affordable and clean. Our five-year plan improved reliability performance by focusing primarily on:

**Infrastructure upgrades:** We're making prudent, proactive investments to replace or rebuild poles, better understand how to bury power lines in a cost-effective way and organize circuits more efficiently to ensure fewer customers are impacted by outages.

**Forestry management:** Traditional tree trimming is still the most effective way to prevent and shorten power outages and improve system reliability. Our plan significantly increases spending to keep distribution lines clear.

**Grid modernization:** Smart meters, sensors and automation devices are working together to help us monitor our system more effectively, optimize power delivery and solve problems faster, often before customers notice.

**Equity and Environmental Justice:** We will continue to weigh how different communities experience reliability and resiliency, as well as future implications for grid access when it comes to EVs and other technologies.

**Resiliency:** Michiganders are experiencing more frequent and severe storms thanks, in part, to climate change. We're designing a tougher, harder grid built to face whatever Mother Nature throws our way. Our poles, for example, will soon sustain winds over 100 miles per hour without ice.

#### HURON SHORE REGIONAL UTILITY AUTHORITY BOARD RESOLUTION OF REDESIGNATION OF PRIMARY MAIN AS SECONDARY MAIN

#### **RESOLUTION 2023-02**

WHEREAS, a 2,100 foot section of 16-inch water main beginning on the north side of the Lake and Division master meter pit, continuing north on Lake Street to East Michigan Avenue, then running west on East Michigan Avenue to US-23, was constructed by the Huron Shore Regional Utility Authority (HSRUA) in 1997-98 and classified subsequently as a primary main, and;

WHEREAS, said main is located in Oscoda Township and currently is required to improve fire protection in the area as well as to provide for future development, and;

WHEREAS, under existing policy only secondary mains can be utilized for such taps, and;

WHEREAS, under existing policy secondary mains are owned, operated, and maintained by the local municipal entity, and;

WHEREAS, Oscoda Township has made a request of HSRUA, that such main be designated as a secondary main, and;

WHEREAS, by such designation Oscoda Township has agreed to allow such taps subject to installation by a licensed professional with a HSRUA contract employee present, and;

WHEREAS, Oscoda Township has agreed all residential and commercial taps would be approved by Oscoda Township at its expense with necessary connection fees determined by and paid to the Township, and;

WHEREAS, Oscoda Township will assume and be responsible for all future operation, maintenance, and replacement of said secondary main, subject when applicable to any policies applicable to such mains, and;

WHEREAS, on January 23, 2023 the Township Board of the Charter Township of Oscoda passed Resolution 2023-02 accepting the terms and conditions as represented to HSRUA and as stated herein, and;

WHEREAS, the HSRUA board by such representations and acceptance of responsibility does agree to this change in designation;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by action of the HSRUA BOARD on October 3, 2023, does hereby agree said 2,100 foot section of 16-inch water main beginning on the north side of the Lake and Division master meter pit, continuing north on Lake Street to East Michigan Avenue, then running west on East Michigan Avenue to US-23 as depicted on the attached exhibit be redesignated as a secondary main with full responsibility assumed by Oscoda Township as set forth herein.
