MAYOR'S MESSAGE

In the wake of the recent violence that happened in Charlottesville and in other communities more than 250 bipartisan mayors from the U. S. Conference of Mayors (USCM) and the Anti-Defamation League (ADL) unveiled 10 principles to fight discrimination and injustice and promote tolerance and inclusion. It is amazing that in 2017 this is something that we, as mayors around this country, have to come out with a set of principles to have a teaching moment for respective communities. Regardless of what your political stripes are, this is a bipartisan

group of mayors unanimously supporting this. This compact calls for mayors to use the bully pulpit to speak out against racism, extremism, xenophobia, white supremacy and all forms of bigotry and hate crimes while investing in programs and training to promote inclusion and build trust across communities. We are being challenged again and again with extremism views and violent bigotry and we must not permit those individuals who hold such views to succeed. Have we forgotten how hard people fought to defend principles? One thing they did not fight for was the right to spew racism and bigotry. I believe that many elected officials in Washington, D.C. have not been sending the right message to the country

and to their own constituents. As Americans we all believe in free speech – but you don't have the right to spew racism and hate. And it is certainly not ok when chaos and violence erupts. What does it say for a society as a whole when you have adults, and elected officials, that are tacitly condoning racism and bigotry – or not coming out against it? Quite honestly I never thought I would see the day that we would have to come out with a set of principles against racism and bigotry. Within the compact it says that "Mayors and their cities must continue to be a beacon for inclusion, tolerance, and respect for all. We will continue to create stronger cultures of kindness and compassion in our communities, and expect our federal and state partners to join us in this endeavor." Already endorsed by our Township Council, the 10-point plan of principles will be shared with the Police Department, Municipal Government, Boards and Commission, particularly the Civil Rights Commission, all of whom will have and adhere to the principles.

This initiative is centered on 10 principles:

1. Expressly Rejecting Extremism, White Supremacy and All Forms of Bigotry
2. Denouncing All Acts of Hate Wherever They Occur
3. Ensuring Public Safety While Protecting Free Speech and Other Basic Constitutional Rights
4. Calling for Fully-Resourced Law Enforcement and Civil Rights Investigations of Domestic Terrorism and Hate Crimes
5. Elevating and Prioritizing Anti-Bias and Anti-Hate Programs in Our Nations' Schools
6. Supporting Targeted Communities and Bringing Together Civic and Community Leaders to Build Trust
7. Celebrating Diversity, Promoting Inclusivity and Challenging Bias
8. Promoting Law Enforcement Training on Responding to and Reporting Hate Incidents, Hate Crimes and Domestic Terrorism
9. Encouraging Residents in their Communities to Report Hate incidents and Crimes, including Using Hot Lines and Online Tools
10. Maintaining Civil Rights Enforcement and Strengthening Hate Crime Laws When Necessary

***RECYCLING CENTER COUPONS:** Coupons are mailed on a yearly basis to residents along with the required rules and regulations. Duplicate coupons may be obtained at the Public Works office. Coupons must be presented at the gate as well as a driver's license and proof of residency. Residents entering the Recycling Center must have their vehicle properly insured, inspected and registered.

***GRASS COUPONS:** 2017 is the final day that residents will be required to present coupons at the Recycling Center.

***CURBSIDE/BULK PICK-UP:** October 13, 2017 is the final day for scheduled curbside/bulk pick up. The program will resume on January 9, 2018.

***LEAF BAGS:** Biodegradable leaf bags will be available October 2, 2017 through December 15, 2017 at the DPW yard, door #11, Monday – Friday from 7 a.m. to 6 p.m. In addition, leaf bags will be available on Saturday, November 4, 2017 from 8:30 a.m. to 4:15 p.m. The two (2) free leaf bag coupons were included in the 2017 Recycling Usage Package mailed to residents in January 2017. Leaf bag pick-up will commence on October 16, 2017 and will continue until December 28, 2017. Leaf bags are for leaves only. Additional coupons may be purchased per \$6.00 per bundle. Leaf bags will not be issued without coupons and proof of residency.

***CHRISTMAS TREES:** Christmas trees will not be picked up curbside. You may bring them to your nearest firehouse, devoid of decorations, or to the Recycling Center during regular hours until January 31, 2018.

Now that school is in session, neighborhood streets near our schools and school zones will experience an increase in both vehicular and pedestrian traffic. The POLICE DEPARTMENT wants to remind you to adjust your commute. Leave early for your destination – buses are picking up and dropping off school children. ALWAYS heed the red flashing warning signals of a school bus that is stopped. State law requires motorists to stop at least 25 feet away if traveling on a two-lane road or a multi-lane highway

where lanes are only separated by lines, or on a privately maintained road. When traveling on a dual-lane highway, a motorist should slow to 10 mph if on the other side of a safety island or raised median. Please obey the speed limits – PUT YOUR PHONE DOWN and focus on the traffic and the road. Watch for students at crosswalks and obey the signals of Crossing Guards and traffic control devices. Always "expect the unexpected."

2018 REASSESSMENT UPDATE

Piscataway Township is in the process of completing a reassessment which will become effective January 1, 2018. All property will be assessed at 100% of its market value.

Realty Appraisal Company was hired by the Township to conduct the reassessment. They had field inspectors going to each property to conduct interior and exterior inspections. If your property has not been inspected you should contact Realty Appraisal Company immediately at 201-867-3870 to make an appointment. If your property is not inspected your assessed value will be estimated and may be higher than had it been inspected.
