GUIDED TOURS of the museum will be held on July 2nd and July 4th at 12:30 p.m., 2 p.m., and 3 p.m. Watch a short video and discover why our nation's tradition of celebrating July 4th began in Piscataway! Tour the museum and discover our Township's remarkable history. Advance registration is required - \$5.00 per person. The Dutch Door Gift Shop will be open July 1st and July 2nd.

**The newest addition to the museum's permanent collection is a Federal period <u>linen press</u> built by Matthew Egerton, Jr., a late 18th century New Brunswick joiner and cabinetmaker. Worth noting is that when an artifact is accessioned into the museum's permanent collection, it becomes the property of Piscataway Township (i.e., its residents). Three generations of Egertons were furniture makers in New Brunswick from the 1760s to 1838 and were highly sought after for their beautifully made desks, cradles, tables, sideboards, bookcases, clock cases, and more. The Egerton's shop and house was located on Burnet Street, near the Raritan River.

Note: Department of Public Works WILL NOT pick up leaf bags until the fall. Residents may bring them to the Mini-Dump during regular noted hours (above).

Required (1) Coupon per bag. GRASS DISPOSAL COUPONS: Each bag of grass, leaves, bagged brush, and vegetation being dropped off at the Mini-Dump is required to have a GRASS DISPOSAL COUPON. Coupons can be purchased for \$1.00 per coupon (minimum purchase two (2) coupons) and are available for purchase in the Tax Office – Monday-Friday, 8:30 a.m. – 12:30 p.m. and 1:30 p.m. – 4:30 p.m. or by mail. Send SASE and check made out to: Tax Office, 455 Hoes Lane, Piscataway, NJ 08854. COUPONS ARE ONLY VALID FOR THE YEAR IN WHICH THEY ARE ISSUED. Please purchase only the coupons you think you will use. There are no refunds.

*Recycling Trash Center Coupons and Recycling Center ID passes and rules and regulations have been mailed to all residential owners. The 2017 Coupon MUST BE PRESENT AT THE GATE, along with Driver's License as Proof of Residency.

*Coupons are required for lumber, household debris, carpeting, furniture and all other non-recyclable materials. Coupons are NOT required for disposal of recyclable material, including batteries, tires, motor oil, branches, metal (washers, dryers, dishwashers, hot water heaters, refrigerators, air conditioners) and all recyclables picked up curbside. **NOT ACCEPTABLE:** Paint, Hazardous Waste, Kitchen Garbage, Contractor Debris, Dirt/Rocks/Stones. Televisions, VCRs, Computers, Printers and Monitors may be brought to the Recycling Center.

*Residents entering the Center must have their vehicle properly insured, inspected and registered. The largest vehicle allowed is a half-ton pick up truck. NO COMMERCIAL VEHICLES OR TRUCKS WITH SIDE BOARDS ARE PERMITTED AND NO BOXED U-HAULS OR MOVING TRUCKS ARE PERMITTED. PICK UP TRUCKS REQUIRE TWO (2) COUPONS.

*Homeowners may schedule two (2) CURBSIDE trash pickups, and one (1) branch pickup from January to the middle of October. To schedule a curbside pickup, call DPW @ 732-562-2390.

UPDATE ON THE HALPER PROPERTY

Litigation regarding the Halper property is still ongoing in the Superior Court concerning environmental issues. Halper family members are resisting the Township's efforts to clean up the significant and wide-spread contamination on the property which took place when the Halpers owned the property

Once the property has been remediated plans are to create a nature park that will include a reforesting of the property, creating a nature area with a variety of plants, flowers, and trees and providing natural walking trails. The Township has already put in place numerous safeguards to protect the property.

The Township is prohibited by the Superior Court from disturbing the contaminated parts of the land but the Township is seeking to demolish the existing buildings on the property.













