he picture above depicts one of the recent Eye on Piscataway programs that are aired live, once a month, on PCTV, (Channel 15) and Verizon, (Channel 40) and On Demand at www.piscatawaynj.org/PCTV. The program is an opportunity for residents and others to see and hear about what is happening in our community, our county and our state. Through the years our guests have included US Congressmen, State Senators, council members, county officials, Rutgers University and Piscataway High School football coaches, and at one time or another, every Township department has been represented – many more than once. Even Santa Claus manages a visit to the December program. Our PCTV crew films current events and clips of these events are bundled into each program as well as announcements of upcoming Township events. On the day the program is live, residents are encouraged to call in to speak to me or my guests. It does not have to be on the program's topic. Each month's program is rebroadcast on

Mondays (8 p.m.), and Fridays and Sundays (7 p.m.).

Piscataway has many things to be proud of and one, in particular, is our independent living, low and moderate housing facility, **Sterling Village**. Owned by Piscataway Township, **Sterling Village** was dedicated on January 5, 1992 as safe, fun apartment living for seniors to age in place with their friends and neighbors. **Sterling Village** is located at 1 Sterling Drive, directly behind the J. F. Kennedy Library and our Senior Citizen Center. **Sterling Village** is made up of 150 apartments throughout five floors. The

apartments have plenty of windows, plenty of kitchen cabinets and a spacious bathroom. The first floor has a laundry room, recycling room, common area bathrooms, an outdoor patio and a large, beautiful Community Room. The maximum allowable income is \$62,700 and monthly rental ranges from \$939 - \$1,320. You do not have to be a Township resident to apply.

TUESDAYS – 2 P.M. TO 8 P.M. (Gate closes at 7:45 p.m.) THURSDAYS – 2 p.m. – 8 p.m. (Gate closes at 7:45 p.m.) SATURDAYS – 8:30 a.m. – 4:30 p.m. (Gate closes at 3:45 p.m.) NOTE: Further details are on the Website: www.piscatawaynj.org.

- * Recycling/Trash Center Coupons and Recycling Center ID passes have been mailed to all residential property owners. The Piscataway Township 2017 recycling ID Card MUST BE PRESENTED AT THE GATE, along with Drivers License as proof of Residency. The Rules and Hours of the Center were enclosed in the mailing.
- * Coupons are required for grass disposal and may be purchased in the Tax Office starting March 27, 2017 8:30 a.m. 12:20 p.m. and 1:30 p.m. 4:30 p.m., and are good for the current year ONLY. Cost per coupon: \$1.00 minimum purchase two (2). The Recycling Center will accept bagged grass with coupons starting April 4, 2017.
- * Coupons are not required for disposal of recyclable materials. This includes all recyclables picked by curbside, in addition to batteries, (2) tires, motor oil, antifreeze and metal. Brush may be brought to the Mini Dump but cannot be longer than five (5) feet lengths or greater than four (4) inches in diameter.
- * Residents are encouraged to recycle hazardous household material and paint at Middlesex County locations on the designated dates and times. REMINDER: WE DO NOT ACCEPT ANY HAZARDOUS WASTE OR TOXIC WASTE MATERIALS, CHEMICALS OR PAINTS AT THE DPW MINI DUMP.
- * All residents entering the Mini Dump must have their vehicles properly insured, inspected and registered in Piscataway. NO TRUCKS LARGER THAN HALF- TON PICKUPS ARE ALLOWED AND NO TRUCKS WITH SIDEBOARDS WILL BE ALLOWED. Pickup trucks and full size vans are required to surrender two (2) passes per visit.
- * ELECTRONIC WASTE is now accepted at the recycling center.
- * Residents can schedule two (2) Bulk Trash pick ups and one (1) Brush pick up from January to mid-October. Branches must be bundled and tied NO BAGGED BRUSH IS ALLOWED. During the summer months there may be a 6-8 week wait. Middlesex County Textile Recycling Bags are available in the DPW office.

NOTE: The Piscataway Sewer System is designed to flow from your home through the Township owned sewer lines to the treatment plant in Sayreville. In some areas, due to the topography, flow has to go uphill and must be assisted by lift stations known as pump stations. At this point certain elements have to be excluded as the pumps get jammed by materials such as fabrics, both woven and non-woven. Type of products include: baby wipes, chemically treated wipes, sanitary napkins, and most paper towels. Although most manufactures of these products list them as flushable, in reality THEY ARE NOT. We ask that you dispose of these non-flushable materials via your regular garbage collection for deposit at a landfill. By complying, you will eliminate the possibility of you having a plumbing company rectify a sewer blockage at an estimated cost of \$125 per hour.


