

EXECUTIVE ORDER #10

WHEREAS, the Center for Disease Control (CDC) had recommended individuals to use face coverings and maintain a six (6) feet distance from other individuals in order to slow the spread of the Covid-19 virus; and

WHEREAS, to protect residents from Covid-19 and on the recommendations of medical experts, the City of Plainfield issued Executive Order #9 on December 21, 2021; and

WHEREAS, a number of months after the surge and due to the increase in individuals that have been vaccinated, the number of Covid-19 cases have decreased to low levels; and

WHEREAS, it is no longer necessary to mandate a face covering requirement within businesses in the City of Plainfield; and

WHEREAS, the health, safety, and welfare of unvaccinated individuals must still be protected while visiting City property; and


WHEREAS, to protect employees and members of the public, any unvaccinated employees or individuals that enter City property, including but not limited, to City Hall, Municipal Court, etc., must be masked; and

WHEREAS, based on the advice of medical experts, the Executive Order #9 issued on December 21, 2021 should be rescinded.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, in consultation with the Department of Health and Social Services and the Office of Emergency Management, I hereby take the following actions:

1. Executive Order #9 is hereby rescinded, effective immediately.
2. Unvaccinated employees and individuals visiting any City owned building must be masked; and

This Executive Order shall remain in effect indefinitely as of March 21, 2022.
