STATE OF CONNECTICUT PISTOL PERMIT

To obtain your State of Connecticut Pistol Permit, you must first apply for a Temporary State Permit with the Plainfield Police Department. The Temporary Permit process takes approximately eight (8) weeks to complete and will ultimately be approved or denied by the Chief of Police. If approved, you will be issued the Temporary State Permit and you must then obtain the State of Connecticut Permit within sixty (60) days. In the event your permit is denied, you can request a hearing with the Board of Firearms Permit Examiners within ninety (90) days of the denial to begin the appeals process.

The State of Connecticut has launched a new system to begin the pistol permit process. The new process requires you to obtain a tracking number online prior to being fingerprinted and applying at the Plainfield Police Department. Please follow the following steps to begin the process:

1. Obtain State of Connecticut Pistol Permit ID Number

- a. Go to https://ct.flexcheck.us.idemia.io/CCHRSPreEnroll/
- b. Enter the following Plainfield PD Service Code: Service code will be provided at the department at the time of fingerprinting. Please bring a mobile device for this step.
- c. Please complete BOTH **Blue** and **Green** Highlighted Fields (This will speed up the process when fingerprinted.)
- d. Pay associated State/FBI fees using a Debit/Credit Card (\$88.25 but subject to change)
- e. Once completed you will receive an **Applicant Tracking Number** that must later be submitted to the Plainfield Police Department when fingerprinted.

2. Complete State of Connecticut Pistol Permit Application

- a. Complete FBI Privacy Act Statement
- b. Complete Noncriminal Justice Applicant's Privacy Rights
- c. Complete State of Connecticut Pistol Permit form DPS-77-C in its entirety (Attached)
- d. Once completed, form must be **NOTARIZED**

3. Bring the following with you to the Plainfield Police Department

- a. Applicant Tracking Number form
- b. Notarized Pistol Permit Application
- c. Certificate indicating you completed a Handgun Safety Course to include Live Fire
- d. Government Issued Photo Identification Card
- e. Full-Size Birth Certificate (Short-Form birth certificates are not accepted)
- f. Certified Check, or Money Order for \$70.00 payable to the Town of Plainfield

4. Fingerprinting/Document Submission

- a. You must come to the Plainfield Police Department to be fingerprinted during the attached fingerprinting hours
- b. Once you complete your fingerprints, you will submit all the required documentation above to the on-duty dispatcher.
