

WOOD STOVE REQUIREMENTS

A Building Permit is required to install a woodstove or heating appliance.

All new and used woodstoves shall be U.L. listed.

There shall be only the woodstove vented into a chimney. No other appliance shall be vented into the woodstove flue or chimney.

There shall be 3 sheet metal screws installed in each joint of the chimney connector piping.

Always follow exactly what the manufacturer's instructions state when installing the woodstove.

A woodstove should not be located any closer than 3 feet to any combustible wall or furnishings unless the manufacturer's instructions show less clearance.

A woodstove should not be installed directly on a combustible floor.

Ordinary connector piping (galvanized smoke pipe) shall be located at least 18" from combustible surfaces (walls, beams, floor joists, etc.).

When installing insulated a metal chimney system or a chimney liner, use only the parts and pieces that are supplied with the kit. This is a system that has been tested and "U.L. Listed" as a complete unit.

It is highly recommended that a Carbon Monoxide (CO) Detector be installed.

There should be at least one Smoke Detector on each level of the house.
