MINUTES

April 22, 2021

MEMBERS ATTENDING: June Gagne Chair, Roz Chviek Vice Chair, Frank Mills, Lynn Desjardins and Virginia Sampietro.

CALL to ORDER: Chairwoman Gagne called the meeting to order at 6:30 PM and led members in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Approval of Minutes of 3/18/2021 meeting: Lynn Desjardins **Motioned:** to approve the Minutes of the 3/18/21 meeting as written. Second by Roz Chviek. Unanimously Approved.

Public Hearing: The following comments were heard from the public:

Charles W. Staples Jr. – Discussed removing the Police Commission from the Charter

Irene Bessette – Democratic Registrar of Voters suggested consolidation of voting districts. This would save money for the town.

Cheryl Roberts – Suggested hiring for the positions of Town Clerk and Tax Collector rather than have these being elected positions.

First Selectman Kevin Cunningham – Suggested the Commission invite both the Democratic & Republican Registrar of Voters to address the Commission at the next meeting. He suggested one polling place at the High School but not at this time. He supports combining Wauregan and Central Village into one polling place. He asked the Commission to consider increasing the dollar amounts (2-5b. and 2-5d) needed for public vote.

MOTION: To close the Public Hearing was made by Lynn Desjardins and seconded by Roz Chviek. Motion was unanimously approved.

Mr. Cunningham suggested a revised schedule of meetings for the Charter Revision Commission to be ready to bring to voters at the November 2nd election which the Commission accepted.
