‘BUSINESS IS BOOMING IN THE BOROUGH OF PROSPECT PARK’

New Businesses Officially Opened in the Borough of Prospect Park

(PROSPECT PARK, NJ) - Mayor Mohamed T. Khairullah, Municipal Council, and The Economic Development Department of the Borough of Prospect Park and Prospect Park community - at - large had the pleasure of joining together in the past few weeks to conduct multiple ribbon cutting ceremonies to officially welcome a wave of three new businesses to the Prospect Park community.

“The Borough of Prospect Park is thriving! We were proud to support the grand opening of not one but three new businesses in our community,” said Mayor Mohamed T. Khairullah. “The Governing Body remains committed to promoting economic development and the growth of new businesses in commercial corridors,” Mayor Khairullah added.

The Borough’s governing body conducted a ribbon cutting ceremony for the grand opening of ‘Lorin’s Shop’ on June 16th, located at 308 North 8th Street which houses a woman’s boutique shop inside a storefront of the Veterans housing project on North 8th Street. This grand opening reflects the vision of the governing body via a redevelopment agreement secured a few years ago to the old silk factory that is now rehabilitated into a 44 residential unit and two commercial space mix-use development anchoring the North 8th commercial corridor designed and built by Bleeker Architectural Group LLC. Lorin’s Shop, a minority-woman owned business is the first to occupy the commercial real estate as a part of the Borough’s historic redevelopment agreement for the housing project.

Prospect Park is also known for its unique ethnic eateries such as “Tempura Place” on 356 Haledon Ave as the Borough re-welcomed the business on June 30th established in 2018 that is now new management. The soft opening displayed some of the best Sushi cuisine that has gained major notoriety and now Korean food on the menu around in the region.
