Virginia Regional Transit

Brief History

- *1990 - Loudoun Ride-On (1 bus and a few volunteer drivers)*
- *1994- growing organization became primary public transportation provider in Leesburg Area and began seeking federal and state funding (VDRPT)*
- *1995- Funds received and organization began serving the entire public (public transit)*
- *1996 - ADA compliance with "access to all" concept now required both fixed route and curb-to-curb service*
- *1997- Loudoun Ride-On became Loudoun Transit under new professional management*



Virginia Regional Transit

- *1998- established first partnership with town of Warrenton launching a whole new approach to public transportation in the Commonwealth*
- *2001- New Purcellville Transit Facility opened serving as headquarters and central maintenance facility for its expanded fleet of 60 vehicles*
- *2002- Officially became Virginia Regional Transportation Association -VRTA*
- *2005 - Celebrated 15th Anniversary - growing to 120 employees and serving over half a million riders*
- *2006 - Construction started on new Culpeper Transit Facility*
- *2007 - Restructured once again -added new staff-changed name to Virginia Regional Transit*

Area Transit Service Operations




Culpeper Connector



Culpeper Multi-modal Facility



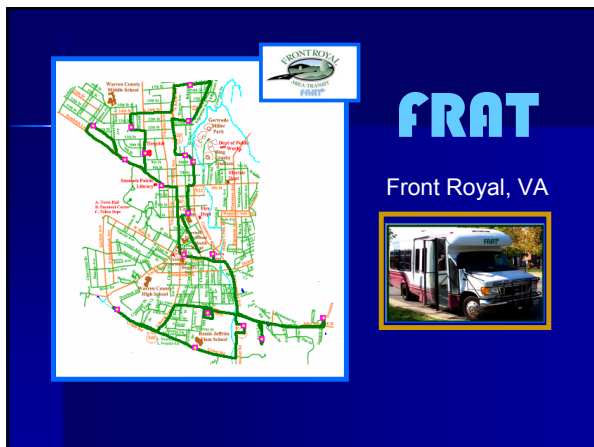
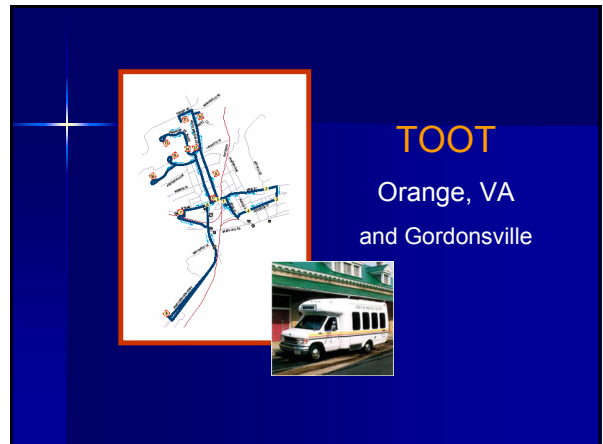
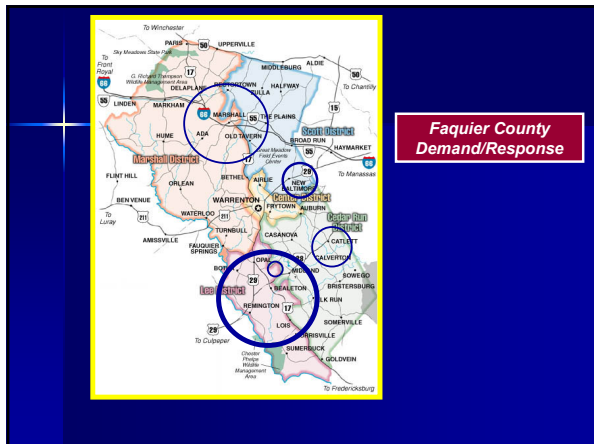
