VACCINES - COVID-19 vaccines are highly effective at preventing severe illness, hospitalizations, and death.

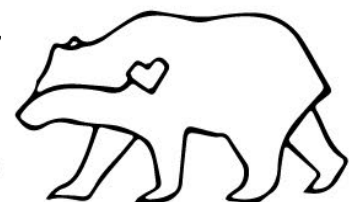
- CDC recommends that everyone 5 years and older protect themselves by getting fully vaccinated.
- CDC recommends that everyone ages 16 years and older get a booster shot after completing their primary COVID-19 vaccination series. You are eligible for a booster at 5 months after completing Pfizer-BioNTech primary series, 6 months after completing Moderna primary series, and 2 months after the initial J&J/Janssen vaccine. Individuals ages 16-17 are only eligible for the Pfizer-BioNTech COVID-19 vaccine.

MASKS - Masks offer protection against all variants

- CDC continues to recommend wearing a mask in public indoor settings in areas of substantial or high community transmission, regardless of vaccination status.
- NOTE* Red Cliff Health is working to distribute KN95 masks to the community. These will be distributed to elders as a priority and then to the general population.

TESTING – Tests can tell if you are currently infected with Covid-19

- Red Cliff currently utilizes both the PCR and the antigen tests to diagnose infection.
- Self-tests can be used at home or anywhere, are easy to use, and produce rapid results. If your self-test has a positive result, stay home and isolate for 10 days, wear a mask if you have contact with others, and call the Red Cliff Public Health Team at (715) 779-3707.
