### **Progam Info For the Month**

- Traditional Nature Activities: Club youth work with Indigenous Arts and Sciences Coordinator Alex Breslav. Club youth take part in lessons such as making bear fat candels, to harvesting a beaver, making snow shealter and much more. Club youth learn about nature, culture and arts and sciences while taking part in this program.
- ❖ <u>Traditional Beading Hour:</u> Club youth work with Aubrey Defoe and work on beading and their beading skills, it is a great way for Club youth to get a chance to work on beading and even learn a new skill.
- ❖ <u>Walking Club:</u> Walking Club is where youth will go with staff and walk around the area and even take little hikes around local hiking trails.
- ❖ <u>Power Hour:</u> A comprehensive homework help and tutoring program, POWER HOUR is designed to raise the academic proficiency of Club members ages 6 to12.
- ❖ SNAP ED: Club youth work with SNAP Nutrition Educator Larkin Smith on nutriton education, with a focus on nutrition and art. Club youth learn about nutrion values and learning about healthy lifestyle that came help better themselves.
- Police Mentorship: Club youth work with Red Cliff Police Department Officers on prevention and just community mentorship. Officers will work with youth on drug and alchol prevention, decision making, peer pressure, dating violence prevention or just being a person to talk to. Club youth will be able to create a relationship with Red Cliff Police Department and it's officers.
- ❖ <u>Basketball Sessions:</u> Club youth work on individual skills along with group skills. These sessions also work on strength and conditioning with the youth by using body weight and working on cardio.

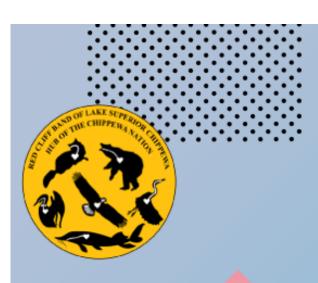

## Walmart Foundation Food Grant

#### Coming to an End

Red Cliff, WI- August 18, 2021, Red Cliff Boys and Girls Club was awarded \$12,000 back in November of 2020 for food for Club youth. The Club helped provided meals to many other programs and activities to help other youth with food as well. Funds from this grant covered the following: Family Spearing Night, ICW's Nenandawi'iweg/ Scouts Trip, Red Cliff Language Camp and food that was supposed to go to Wolf Camp. But due to COVID-19 concerns the food for Wolf Camp was swapped and made for the regular lunches that are provided by the Food Distribution. Food was also provided to youth that attended the Club and attended Club trips as well. The Boys & Girls Club is very grateful to Walmart Foundation for allowing us to have these funds! These funds are coming to an end by the end of the month, but they will continue to provide meals to youth that attend the Club and Club Trips. The Club would also like to thank Red Cliff Food Distribution, Red Cliff Tribal Council, Red Cliff Family & Human Services, and others for all the help and support with this fund. Finally, we would like to state that we have served over 1,741 meals with this fund as of August 18, 2021. We are hoping by the end of August that we will have served over 2,000 meals!

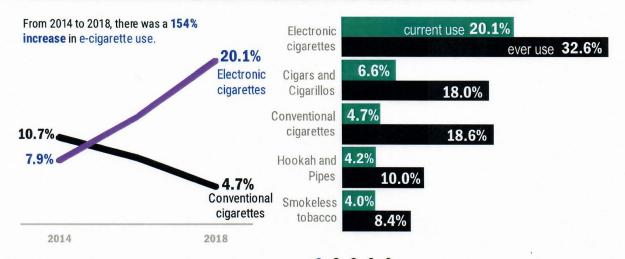
### Summer Snapshot

As conventional cigarette use is declining, e-cigarette use is rising.



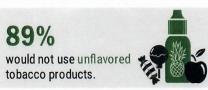
#### 1 in 5 M/M/M/M/M
