**Red Cliff Associate Judge
Appointed to MMIW Task Force**

Red Cliff Tribal Court Associate Judge Gwendolyn Topping has been appointed to Wisconsin's Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women Task Force. The task force is charged with helping to fight the abduction, homicide, violence and trafficking of Indigenous women in Wisconsin.



"For too long our missing and murdered have gone under recognized, not given the time and attention deserved especially up here in northern Wisconsin," said Topping. "This is long overdue in Indian Country and we have some serious hurdles to overcome."

In partnership with the Wisconsin Department of Justice (DOJ) and Wisconsin's Indigenous communities, the task force plans to focus on examining the factors that contribute to missing and murdered Indigenous women (MMIW) and the response from social service organizations, understanding the roles federal, state and tribal jurisdictions play, and improving and implementing robust data collection and reporting methods.

"It's great to see many Tribal Nations represented on this newly formed Task Force as this is a very important topic to everyone throughout Indian Country and Across the world," said Red Cliff Vice Chairman Nathan Gordon. "Associate Judge Gwen Topping will do great to represent Red Cliff and share her views to bring awareness. They selected a great person that is passionate and will use her voice for those who cannot."

3 Stay informed about the latest election information by checking your latest state laws and rules through your state's election office website

4 Research the candidates and initiatives before voting

4 Vote early if voting by mail to avoid USPS mail delays or use a voter drop box

5 Organize transportation to polling places

6 On Election Day, bring a state-approved ID card and follow CDC and tribal-approved COVID-19 protocols

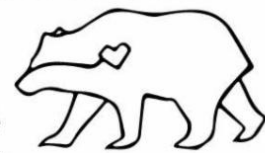

October is Depression Awareness Month!



October is also Bullying Prevention Month and October 10th is World Mental Health Day!

It is estimated that one in 15 adults (6.7%) will experience depression in any given year and one in six people (16.6%) will suffer from depression at some point in their lifetime. As you can see, depression is more common than most people think. Like other diseases, people suffer depression through no fault of their own. There is no reason to be ashamed of behavioral health issues and every reason to seek help as soon as possible. Also, like other health challenges that may occur, it is a good idea to get screened for depression if you feel you may be at risk. Screening is available at Red Cliff Community Health Center, or you can go online to www.mhascreening.org or visit www.HelpYourselfHelpOthers.org to take an online screening.

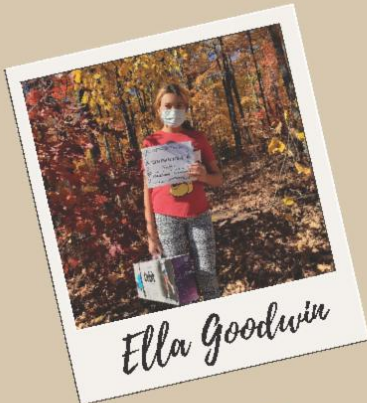

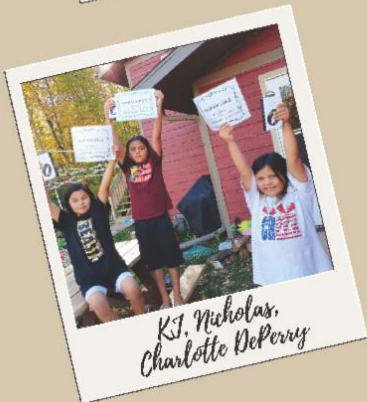

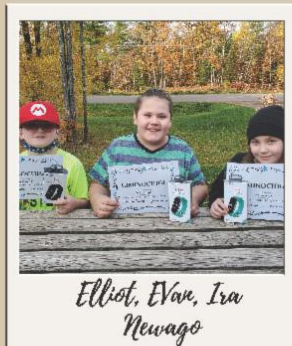

A Moment with Mercie Gordon Snap-Education Nutritional Educator

Boozhoo Friends, as the Grandmother of a very active four-year-old, I have been looking at ways to increase his participation in the kitchen with some simple healthy recipes that are both fun and nutritional. This is a recipe I used to create some creative cooking with my Grandson and the fun part is that you don't have to stick to just broccoli or carrots. You can use as many vegetables as you like and modify to fit your family's favorite veggie. Enjoy.



English Muffin Veggie Pizza

Create your own easy-to-make personal pizza and add your favorite veggie toppings. Choose whole wheat muffins to make this recipe even better!

Makes 4 servings.

Ingredients

- 1 cup **broccoli** (cooked chopped)
- 4 English muffins
- 1 cup pizza sauce (or spaghetti sauce)
- 1/2 cup mozzarella cheese, shredded, part skim

- 1/4 cup **carrot** (4 Tablespoons, shredded)
- 1/3 tablespoon Parmesan cheese (1 teaspoon, grated)

Directions

1. Cut the broccoli to make 1 cup of chopped broccoli.
2. Put the broccoli in a saucepan with water. Cook on medium until tender.
3. Drain the water from the saucepan. Let the broccoli cool.
4. Cut 4 English muffins in half. Toast the 8 muffin halves.
5. Shred the mozzarella cheese to make ½ cup of shredded cheese.
6. Peel and shred the carrots to make 3 tablespoons shredded carrots.
7. Spoon 2 tablespoons pizza sauce over each English muffin half.
8. Sprinkle 1 tablespoon shredded mozzarella cheese on top of each half.
9. Put 2 tablespoons broccoli and 1 teaspoon shredded carrots on top of each half.
10. Sprinkle each half with 1 teaspoon grated parmesan cheese
11. Toast in the toaster oven for 2 minutes, until the cheese melts.

Notes: Try making these pizzas with whole wheat muffins.

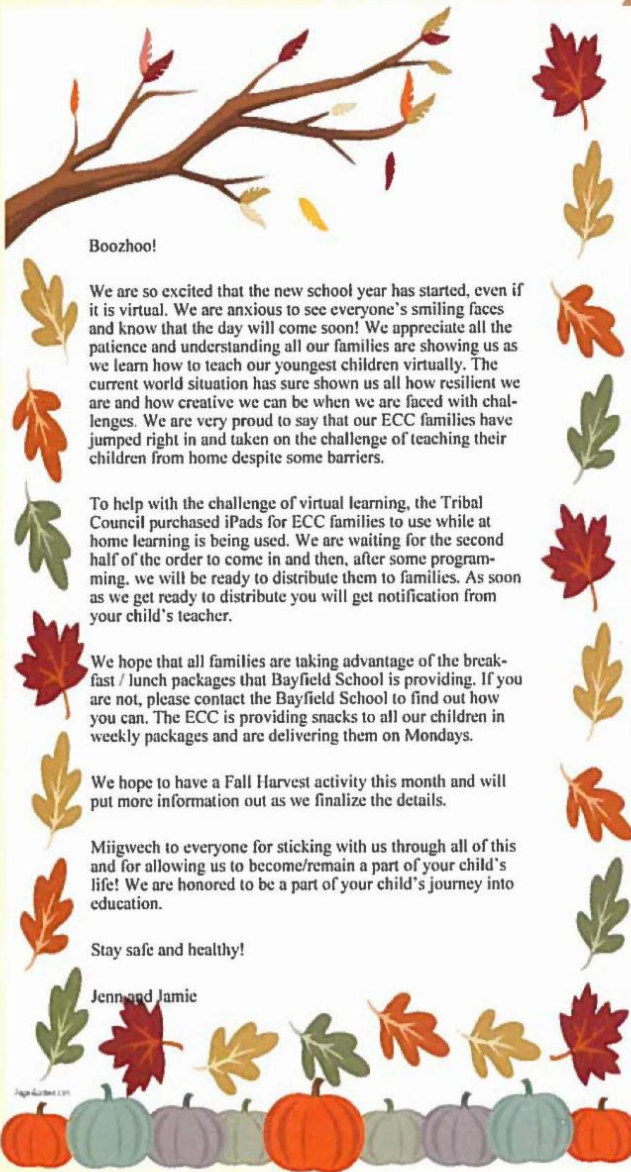

- We are now releasing Draft 3 along with short video presentations to the community with the hope that community members will review and provide feedback to help us finalize the plan.
- The current community comment period for this draft Plan is open until Oct 31. 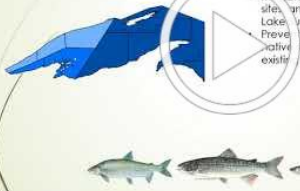

Dairy Margin Coverage Program Enrollment for 2021 Opens Oct. 13

Enhancements to Online Dairy Decision Tool Now Available

The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) will begin accepting applications for the **Dairy Margin Coverage** (DMC) program on Tuesday, October 13, 2020 for 2021 enrollment.

“This year has been a market roller coaster for the dairy industry, and the Dairy Margin Coverage program is a valuable tool dairy producers can use to manage risk,” said Bill Northey, USDA’s Under Secretary for Farm Production and Conservation, during a roundtable at a dairy in Chippewa Falls, Wisconsin. “We were excited to roll out this new and improved program through the 2018 Farm Bill, and if you haven’t enrolled in previous years, we highly encourage you to check it out.”

Signup runs through Dec. 11, 2020. DMC is a voluntary risk management program that offers protection to dairy producers when the difference between the all-milk price and the average feed price (the margin) falls below a certain dollar amount selected by the producer. DMC payments triggered for seven months in 2019 and three months so far in 2020. More than 23,000 operations enrolled in DMC in 2019, and more than 13,000 in 2020.

Updated Dairy Decision Tool

To determine the appropriate level of coverage for a specific dairy operation, producers can utilize the recently updated online dairy decision tool. The **decision tool** is designed to assist producers with calculating total premium costs and administrative fees associated with participation in DMC. An **informational video** is available, too.

Improvements to the decision tool, made in cooperation with representatives from the University of Minnesota and University of Wisconsin, include historical analysis that illustrates what DMC indemnity payments might have been had the program been available over the previous two decades. The analysis indicates that over the course of time, DMC payments made to producers exceed premiums paid. These decision tool enhancements provide a more comprehensive

decision support experience for producers considering DMC.

Additional Support for Dairy Producers

In addition to DMC, USDA offers a variety of programs that have helped dairy producers, including insurance, disaster assistance, and conservation programs. Most recently, the Coronavirus Food Assistance Program 1 provided \$1.75 billion in direct relief to dairy producers who faced price declines and additional marketing costs due to COVID-19 in early 2020. Now, signup is underway for the Coronavirus Food Assistance Program 2, which provides another round of assistance for dairy producers and many other eligible producers.

After 2018 anchor strike, Consumers Energy takes cables out of Straits of Mackinac

Long decommissioned Consumers Energy electric cables are no longer running under the Straits of Mackinac, the company announced on Oct. 12.

Discussions over what to do with the cables started in 2018 after damage to a Consumers Energy cable was discovered.

"After learning of the 2018 alleged anchor strike on our cable, we began to investigate the best way to leave the Straits of Mackinac and the entire state in a better place," said Dennis Dobbs, Consumers Energy's vice president of Enterprise Project Management and Environmental Services.

The damage to the Consumers Energy line was discovered in April 2018, after two American Transmission Company (ATC) lines were damaged by a tug and barge that dragged its anchor. The ATC lines leaked dielectric fluid - more than 600 gallons of the fluid, or mineral oil - but the Consumers lines contained no fluid because they hadn't been in use for so long.

The damage to the Consumers Energy and ATC lines came as tensions surrounding Enbridge Energy's Line 5 pipeline were increasing. A portion of Line 5 sends crude oil and natural gas liquids through the Straits of Mackinac. The same vessel believed to have caused the ATC and Consumers Energy damage, was also believed to have put three small dents into Line 5, though the line did not leak.

While the Consumers Energy lines did not leak, the company put a cap on the severed cables so they wouldn't move, said Consumers Energy spokeswoman Katie Carey. But the company was still trying to decide what to do long-term about the cables.

"They're not active. We don't use them anymore. So how can we, you know, does it make sense to pull them out? Does it not make sense?" Carey said of the conversations with state, federal and local stakeholders. The decision was eventually made that the cables had to go.

Consumers Energy spent from May through mid-September pulling four to eight 46 kV cables from the water. The exact number is unclear, Carey said, because some of the cables were severed at various points through the straits and brought up previously since 1990, and the company also had smaller grounding cables that support the larger 46 V electric cable.

The cables had been installed in 1956 to carry electricity to the Upper Peninsula. Consumers Energy stopped servicing the Upper Peninsula, and shut down the lines in 1990.
