

Protecting Privacy

- Footage owned by Agency/City and will never be sold or shared by Flock
- 30 day data retention, then deleted
- Short retention period ensures that all data not associated with a crime is automatically deleted & unrecoverable
- Takes human bias out of crime-solving by detecting objective data, and detecting events that are objectively illegal (ex. Stolen vehicles)

- All data is stored securely in the AWS Cloud, with end to end encryption of all data
- Search reason is required for audit trail
- NOT facial recognition software
- NOT predictive policing
- NO PII is contained in Flock
- NOT used for traffic enforcement
- Not connected to registration data or 3rd party databases (Carfax, DMV)
- Transparency Portal (optional)



Case Study: Attempted Homicide

- Beaver Dam PD 🖸 Beaver Dam, WI
- Beaver Dam Police responded to the parking lot of the Walmart Supercenter on Saturday 10/15 at 9 p.m.
- a 17-year-old girl had been run over in the parking lot and the driver had fled the scene.
- Witnesses saw the small SUV in the parking lot and observed a human body lying under it. The vehicle then left the parking lot out of Frances Lane
- An officer accessed the FLOCK camera system and was able to determine the vehicle was a 2009 Pontiac Vibe.
- The license plate number led the police to Lenz's home within an hour

Solving Violent Crimes in Wisconsin

义 West Allis PD - West Allis, WI

- → Armed robbery: West Allis officers received an alert that a Kia SUV wanted in connection with an armed robbery in Milwaukee was in the area. Officers initiated a traffic stop. The three suspects, two of whom had several felony warrants, were arrested.
- → Homicide: Another alert on a stolen Hyundai sedan came in connection to a Milwaukee homicide. Officers quickly responded but the suspects fled. The chase concluded in Milwaukee where the suspects were arrested.



Case Study: Child Abduction

Del Rio PD



- Investigators said on Jan. 5, they were called to a home in Del Rio where her parents reported her missing.
- home video showed the girl being picked up by 24-year-old... then drove the young girl nearly 350 miles away from her home to Stafford, Texas.
- Investigators got his license plate from home and neighborhood surveillance video and were able to plug his plate into a license plate reader network.
- They were able to Locate the vehicle traveling back to Houston using the ALPR network and let local investigators know where they thought the suspect was headed.
- The entire abduction lasted less than seven hours. Ramirez said the 12-year-old girl was found in good health and unharmed.

Case Study: Smash and Grab Robbery



- San Bruno, CA
- January 2022 Five suspects attempt a Smash & Grab at a Jewelry store but are chased off by the owner
- But here's what didn't make the news...
- Suspect vehicle identified using Flock
- SBPD thought the suspects would try again, potentially more violently
- Vehicle placed on a hotlist
- SBPD receives a real time alert that the suspects are returning
- Officers locate the vehicle within seconds preventing another attempt

- At **2:58 PM** the vehicle passed a Flock Camera in Port Washington and a notification was immediately sent to officers who were able to locate the vehicle and reunite the person with their family.


