Program Statistics

- Total households initially identified
- Total current exemptions
- Total households currently serviced
- Incoming calls 467; 24:42:03
 - Doesn't include outgoing/callbacks
 - Doesn't include the calls multiple other staff have taken
- Thousands of emails



Challenges and Successes

- Current owner/resident names and addresses
- Coordinating 3 haulers
- Overall roll-out
- Pivoting and dealing with many one-off situations or unexpected processes
- Structural changes (misses)
- Resident communication/interactions





Utility Billing Credit

Overview

- In late 2021, the County awarded the City \$32,193.57 in organics-specific SCORE funding.
- City staff are recommending the use of this 2021 funding as a resident credit for the curbside organics program.





Option #1: Credit all households in the program

For ~9,950 households
\$32,193.57/\$9,950=\$3.2
4 per account

 Does offset the cost for those not participating in the program, which might encourage
 others to participate





Option #2: Credit households participating in organics

collection

 For ~2,300 households \$32,193.57/2,300=\$14 per account

Just credits residents
 participating in the
 program, which is how
 funding is allocated
