Allee® Elm (Ulmus parvifolia)

Origin: Parent tree in Georgia; species native to China

Mature Size: Medium to Large (35 - 45' tall)

Description: Allee® elm is a relatively slow growing tree (in MI) that was selected for its rounded to vase-shaped canopy, attractive bark, and adaptability to varied soil conditions. It is resistant to pests and diseases and is drought tolerant once established. It has small leaves that turn yellow in the fall. The bark develops an attractive mottled pattern as the tree ages. Allee® elm will produce seeds.
