Buckeye Hybrids* <i>Aesculus sp.</i>			Tall white or yellowish panicles	Depends on variety. Potential for rusty-red	X
European Hornbeam <i>Carpinus betulus</i>				Yellow or yellow-brown, not reliable	
Goldenraintree <i>Koelreuteria paniculata</i>			Long yellow clusters	Orange-yellow, not reliable	X
Amur Maackia <i>Maackia amurensis</i>			White clusters	Greenish, not showy	
Flowering Cherry <i>Prunus sp.</i>			White/pink flowers	Potentially orange or red, not reliable	
Persian Parrotia <i>Parrotia persica</i>				Yellow to orange or reddish, not reliable

Serviceberry <i>Amelanchier sp.</i>			White flowers	Potentially orange or red	
American Hornbeam <i>Carpinus caroliniana</i>				Potentially orange or orange-red	
Eastern Redbud <i>Cercis canadensis</i>			Pink flowers on branches early in season	Yellow or yellow-green	X
Chinese Fringetree <i>Chionanthus retusus</i>			White, abundant clusters	Yellow or yellow-green	X
Cornel Dogwood (aka Corneliancherry) <i>Cornus mas</i>			Early bloomer, yellow flowers	Variable, yellow or occasionally reddish-purple	
Sweetbay Magnolia <i>Magnolia virginiana</i>				Yellow-green, not showy	
Crabapple* <i>Malus sp.</i>			White or pink flowers	Variable, generally not showy	X
Japanese Tree Lilac <i>Syringa reticulata</i>			Large creamy clusters	Yellow-green or brownish
