Police Services Citizen Survey

Beginning the week of September 16th, a very brief citizen survey will be available on www.schwenksville-pa.org on the topic of Police Services along with the background information that Borough Council has been evaluating. The survey may be completed on line through October 31, 2019. The survey is only for residents of Schwenksville Borough or someone who owns property in the borough and each adult can only complete the survey once.

For those residents who prefer to complete a paper survey, a duplicate survey has been included in a Pathways printed newsletter that should be in the mail to residents by the end of this week. The survey can be returned to Borough Hall at the address listed above to be included in the electronic results.

Voter Polling Location to Change

Due to pre-construction and construction activities at 300 Main Street (the former Schwenksville Fire Company) and the future change in use, a new Election Polling location for Schwenksville Borough residents is being finalized

All Schwenksville Borough registered voters will be mailed a new Voter ID Card listing the new location once it has been finalized. We will be sending out future e-newsletters with the new location once it has been announced by Montgomery County. It will also be posted on the electronic sign on Main Street to remind voters where to go to vote.

Main Street Resurfacing

As most people are aware, Main Street is also State Route 29 and is maintained by the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation. It is on the list of state highways that was contracted to Highway Materials Inc. for resurfacing this year. To the best of our knowledge, the contractor still anticipates resurfacing to occur this fall. As State Representative Marcy Toepel updates the Borough, we will pass along that information to you.

Sign up for Alerts!

Be alert... Be Informed... Be ReadyMontco!

ReadyMontco is your official source for notifications about emergencies, severe weather, crime alerts and disasters in Montgomery County, Pennsylvania.

ReadyMontco is administered by the Montgomery County Department of Public Safety and comes to you free of charge (text messaging and voice rates may apply). All it takes is ten minutes to create a profile and you'll



be READY to go! You will receive time-sensitive messages wherever you specify, such as your home, mobile or business phones, email address, text messages and more. You pick where, you pick how.

STAY INFORMED, STAY SAFE PENNSYLVANIA!

Join the AlertPA notification system by signing up for CodeRED for emergency and weather related alerts, health notifications, building alerts and other updates from PA Commonwealth and federal agencies. A CodeRED Weather Warning will automatically alert you if your address falls in the path of severe weather, as determined by the National Weather Service. *This service is provided to you at no cost by your organization.

511PA

511PA can send email to travelers who sign up for Personal Travel Alerts, and lets you tailor your notifications for all roadways on the 511PA core network. It is easy to sign up to tailor your alerts to only those roadways in which you're interested. Don't want alerts on weekends? No problem. You can specify that you only want email alerts on weekdays. Only want email alerts before you start your daily commute? Just say what time of day you'd like them to start (and end!).
