# Mayor's "Making a Difference" Community Service Award

Mayor Joseph Giunta asked Borough Council to create an award program to recognized volunteers who make a difference in the Schwenksville community. In 2019, Ronald Clossin became the first recipient of the award.

No award was given out in 2020 but the Mayor made up for that by



awarding the 2021 award jointly to Harry and Gail Philips - because "Everyone knows that Harry and Gail Philips are a 'package deal'." They were chosen by Mayor Giunta because "they support each other and their family members in every way possible: loyalty, confidentiality, dependability, compassion, advocacy, and a

willingness to do whatever it takes to improve, assist or problem solve for their family, friends, and community; these are the values and attitude they exemplify at home, at work and in their community." Harry is very active in the Patriotic Order, Sons of America *Washington Camp* as well as helping the Borough with special projects; and Gail is heavily involved with the Activities Committee, and Property Maintenance that extends well beyond her professional duties as the Borough's Secretary-Treasurer.

At their July Council Meeting Borough Council adopted Resolution 2021-14 Recognizing Harry and Gail Phillip's Community Service and their names were added to the plaque at Borough Hall. Thank you to Harry & Gail for their contributions to their community.

#### **Consider Serving on the Board of Auditors**

The Borough Code requires a Board of Auditors composed of three individuals elected at large for a six-year term each. Their primary responsibility is the preparation of the Borough's Annual Financial Statements and completing the Department of Community and Economic Development's [DCED's] Finance Report . The statements and report are prepared following an audit of the completed fiscal year in accordance with DCED guidelines that are easy to follow.

The Borough is fortunate to have a strong and very qualified "lead Auditor" in Paula Steiger who has agreed to run for re-election and will be on the Ballot this November. Unfortunately, no other candidates filed papers for candidacy and there will be two vacancies. There needs to be a board majority to complete the audit and ideally three members. They are the only elected officials in Schwenksville who get paid for their time, at a rate of \$10.00 per hour.

If the Borough is unable to elect or appoint two additional Auditors, Borough Council will need to adopt an Ordinance redirecting the Audit/Financial Reporting duties to a Certified Public Accountant firm and will have to budget the considerable expense annually.

# **ARE YOU READY MONTCO?**



If you want to be alerted to emergencies and be informed, consider being "ReadyMontco"! Schwenksville Borough is striving to use ReadyMontco to send its emergency notifications. It's your official source for notifications about emergencies, severe weather, crime alerts and disasters. With ReadyMontco, you can choose to receive alerts via text, email and/or phone. You can

also choose to receive alerts from other parts of Montgomery County -maybe from where you work or whether other family members live.

ReadyMontco is administered by the **Montgomery County Department of Public Safety** and comes to you free of charge (text messaging and voice rates may apply). All it takes is about 10 minutes to create a profile and you'll be READY to go! **To sign up go to** <u>www.readymontco.org</u> and click on **the Sign Up tab at the top of the page.** If you need assistance, consider reaching out to a family member or neighbor. There is also a short "how to sign up" video you can watch. You will need to provide an email address to register, if you don't use email regularly, consider asking a friend to help you set up a GMAIL Account. You'll be prompted to enter basic contact information about how you would like to be contacted. If you have a smart phone, you can download the Everbridge Mobile Member from the App Store on your iPhone or Android. ## Smart 911 is here!

**In an emergency, seconds count!** Montgomery County has partnered with Smart911, allowing you to create an online profile that provides key information to 911, and first responders. You can upload as much, or as little information as you would like. Your profile can include information about your address, members of your household (2 and 4 legged!), or any medical information such as preexisting conditions or medication.

How does the system work in an emergency? When you dial 911, your profile will appear for the 911 call taker and dispatcher allowing them to access the information you have shared. Pertinent information can then be relayed to first responders. The information is safe, secure, and is only available when you call 911-The system is not accessible without the completion of a 911 call.

## **Reservations for Borough Facilities**

The Borough is now accepting <u>applications</u> for reservation of the various borough facilities available for public use. These include the Meadow Park Pavilion, the Schwenksville Community Room, the Borough Hall Meeting Room and the Main Street Plaza/Pavilion. Groups wishing to reserve these facilities should complete an on-line application. The Borough staff will determine availability and provide a link to the Facilities Usage Policy/Fee Schedule and Waiver of Liability Form. Groups larger than 25 persons for an organized outdoor assembly are required to get a permit.



## Woodland Avenue on the 2022 List

As the Borough works to complete 2021 construction projects, we are

already planning for 2022. The Borough was recently notified that its application for funding to repair the stormwater conveyance system and resurface the roadway has been recommended for approval for Woodland Avenue improvements. Design work will be completed over the winter and the project will be publicly bid in spring 2022.

# **Swimming Pools Should not be drained into the Street**



<u>Schwenksville Borough, PA (schwenksville-pa.org)</u> Storm drains carry stormwater directly to the Perkiomen Creek without treatment. Chemically treated water from swimming pools, greywater and soapy water from car washes are not to be drained to a street where it can enter the storm drain and flow to the creek. This is a leading cause of non-point pollution to our waterways. <u>DEP Swimming Pool Information</u>
