Consideration and Necessary Action on Resolution Authorizing City Manager to Execute Deeds and Associated Documents Implementing Sales Agreement with Harris Ranch Beef Company, a Corporation

DISCUSSION: On April 20, in closed session, with one member absent, the City Council unanimously approved a sales agreement for the former Animal Shelter Property owned by the City of Selma to Harris Ranch Beef Company, a Corporation (Harris). That approval was announced in open session. The City Manager and Harris have executed the sales agreement. An escrow has been established.

This is the same surplus property that was the subject of a proposed, but ultimately aborted sale to the City of Kingsburg. In anticipation of that sale occurring, the City Council authorized execution of two deeds, from the City of Selma to the City of Selma, which accomplishes a lot line adjustment retaining to the City a 48 foot strip of the property consisting of an area of approximately .14 acres where sewer improvements required to be owned and maintained by the City are located. Because the sale was aborted, those deeds were not recorded and the lot line adjustment did not occur. Those deeds were prepared in 2014 and in 2015, new legislation changed the requirements relating to the form of the notary certificate that needs to be attached to a deed to allow for it to be recorded. As a result, those deeds need to be redone, and the authorization of the City Manager to execute those deeds and have them recorded needs to be reaffirmed.

Accordingly, the attached Resolution authorizes, the City Manager to execute the two grant deeds that will effectuate the lot line adjustment. The lot line adjustment needs to occur before a grant deed conveying the remainder of the property, consisting of approximately .66 acres can be recorded and the transaction closed.

Further, because the original authorization to the City Manager was to execute a deed in favor of the City of Kingsburg, as opposed to Harris the authorization needs to be altered to specifically provide for the authorization to execute a Grant Deed in favor of Harris. Otherwise, there is a possibility that the County will refuse to record the deed and prevent the sale from closing. Accordingly, the Resolution both ratifies the City Manager's execution of the sales contract and authorizes the execution of a grant deed by the City Manager to Harris.

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SELMA APPROVING AND AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO EXECUTE GRANT DEEDS AND ASSOCIATED ACCEPTANCES IN CONNECTION WITH SALE OF SURPLUS PROPERTY TO HARRIS RANCH BEEF COMPANY, A CORPORATION

WHEREAS, the City owns the approximate .8 acres in the County of Fresno, State of California at or near Clarkson and McCall Avenues, APN 393-014-63, has declared that property to be surplus property and solicited in accordance with applicable law bids from public entities and other interested agencies at a specified minimum bid price; and

WHEREAS, the front strip of the aforementioned real property containing an area of approximately .14 acres, more or less, is the site of sewer improvements that are required to be retained as public property by the City of Selma, staff had the area surveyed and has prepared two grant deeds both by and to the City of Selma which effectively separate the strip where the sewer improvements are located from the remainder of the property to effectuate a lot line adjustment that allows the City to retain the approximate .14 acres where the sewer improvements are located and to convey the remaining .66 acres to Harris Ranch Beef Company, a corporation; and

WHEREAS, the City Council previously approved, in closed session, as announced in open session, a Purchase and Sale Agreement by and between the City and Harris Ranch Beef Company providing for the conveyance of the .66 acres remaining following the lot line adjustment in exchange for purchase price of \$26,000 and an agreement of purchase and sale was subsequently executed on behalf of the City by the City Manager, a copy of which is attached as Exhibit A; and

WHEREAS, the two grant deeds which accomplish the lot line adjustment and enable the City to retain the approximately .14 acres where sewer improvements are located and to sell the remaining .66 acres to Harris Ranch Beef Company, a corporation, together with Certificates of Acceptance for each grant deed are attached as Exhibit B.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED AS FOLLOWS:

1. The foregoing recitals are true and correct.

- 2. The Council approves and authorizes and ratifies the City Manager's execution of the Agreement of Purchase and Sale that is attached as Exhibit A to this Resolution and authorizes the City Manager to execute any deed or any other document required to close escrow according to the terms of the Agreement of Purchase and Sale.
- 3. The City Council further approves and authorizes its City Manager to execute the two deeds attached and incorporated by reference as Exhibit B to this Resolution which affect the parcel split so that the City retains the approximate .14 acres (consisting of a 48 foot strip of the parcel) where sewer improvements are located.

AGREEMENT OF PURCHASE AND SALE

THIS AGREEMENT OF PURCHASE AND SALE ("**Agreement**") is made as of the 20th day of April, 2015, by and between The City of Selma, a Municipal Corporation, ("**Seller**"), and Harris Ranch Beef Company, a Corporation ("**Buyer**").

RECITALS

- A. WHEREAS, Seller is the owner of certain land located in the County of Fresno, State of California, legally described on <u>Exhibit "A"</u>, attached hereto ("Land"), together with all improvements thereon and appurtenances thereto ("Improvements"). (The Land and Improvements are hereinafter collectively referred to as the "Property").
- B. WHEREAS, Seller desires to sell the Property to Buyer, and Buyer desires to purchase the Property from Seller, all on the terms and conditions of this Agreement.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the covenants and Agreements contained herein, the parties hereto agree as follows:

- 1. <u>PURCHASE AND SALE</u>. Seller agrees to sell the Property to Buyer, and Buyer agrees to purchase the Property from Seller, on the terms and conditions hereinafter set forth in this Agreement.
- 2. <u>PURCHASE PRICE</u>. The total purchase price ("**Purchase Price**") for the Property shall be Twenty Six Thousand Dollars (\$26,000.00), payable by Buyer to Seller as follows:

The cash sum of Twenty Six Thousand Dollars (\$26,000.00) shall be deposited in Escrow upon the opening thereof, the cash sum of \$26,000 shall be deposited in escrow upon the opening thereof for delivery to Seller upon Close of Escrow.

CONDITION OF TITLE TO PROPERTY.

- 3.1 Title to the Property shall be conveyed to Buyer upon the Close of Escrow.
- 3.2 Title to the Property shall be conveyed to Buyer by Grant Deed (on the Title Company's standard form Grant Deed), free and clear of all liens except for (I) liens securing real property taxes and assessments (which constitute liens not yet due and payable); and (ii) such other exceptions and reservations shown on a Preliminary Title Report ("Preliminary Report") issued by Placer Title Company ("Title Company") which are approved by Buyer. (All exceptions to title permitted pursuant to this Paragraph 3.2 are referred to in this Agreement as "Permitted Exceptions".) Seller agrees to furnish Buyer with a copy of the Preliminary Report, together with a copy of all recorded exceptions to title, ten days after opening of escrow. Buyer shall have ten (10) days after receipt of the Preliminary Report and the recorded exceptions to title within which to notify Seller in writing of Buyer's disapproval of any exceptions set forth in the Preliminary Report. in the event of Buyer's disapproval of the Preliminary Report, Seller, at its sole election (to be exercised by written notice to Buyer within five (5) days after receipt of Buyer's said notice of disapproval), shall have ten (10) days after Buyer's said disapproval within which to remove or otherwise remedy the disapproved exceptions. If Seller cannot eliminate or otherwise remedy the disapproved exceptions within said ten (10) day time period, this Agreement shall thereupon

terminate and all sums and documents deposited in Escrow shall be returned to the parties who respectively deposited the same, and Buyer and Seller shall each pay one-half (1/2) of the Escrow costs. Failure of Buyer to provide written disapproval of the Preliminary Report within the above time period shall be deemed approval.

- 3.3 Buyer agrees to consent to and will not object to annexation of the Property to the City of Selma in the event the Seller, or any other person, applies to the Local Agency Formation Commission to annex the Property to the City of Selma. Buyer acknowledges that the Property is not within its Sphere of Influence and that if and when the Property is annexed to a City, it shall be annexed to the City of Selma, Seller. Buyer further acknowledges and agrees that the Property was previously used by Seller as an animal shelter and that if Buyer uses the Property for the same or similar purpose, Buyer will cause all structures on the Property and all enclosures or fences to be brought into compliance with all applicable building codes and/or standards and any Code, Standard or Regulation of any local or State agency relating to the operation of an animal shelter or pound. These acknowledgments and agreements in this Section 3.3 of this Agreement by Buyer shall survive the Close of Escrow and recordation of the Grant Deed and Seller shall have the right, to enforce these acknowledgments and agreements and to obtain an order of the court requiring the specific performance thereof.
- 3.4 Title to the Property shall be evidenced by the commitment of the Title Company to issue a standard California Land Title Association policy of title insurance with liability in the amount of the Purchase Price showing title to the Property vested in (or as designated by) Buyer subject only to the Permitted Exceptions.

4. <u>CONTINGENCIES</u>.

- 4.1 Buyer's obligation to purchase the Property is subject to the following contingencies described in subparagraphs (a) through (f), below in this <u>Paragraph 4.1</u> ("**Contingencies**"), Each and all of the following Contingencies are for the sole benefit of Buyer and may be waived or deemed satisfied by Buyer in Buyer's sole and absolute discretion.
- (a) Buyer's review and approval or objection of the Preliminary Report and all recorded exceptions to title as provided in <u>Section 3.2</u> of this Agreement.
- (b) Buyer's inspection and examination of the physical condition of the Property. Buyer shall have access to the Property at reasonable times and shall have the right to conduct, at Buyer's expense, soil tests, engineering feasibility studies, environmental investigations and such other studies with respect to the physical condition of the Property as Buyer may desire. Buyer shall have until April 30, 2015, to conduct such tests and studies, and to give written notice to Seller of any conditions unacceptable to Buyer for any reason or for no reason. Buyer shall hold and save Seller harmless from and against any and all loss, cost, damage, liability, injury or expense, arising out of or in any way related to damage to Property, injury to or death of persons, or the assertion of lien claims caused by such entry, inspection and implementation of soil tests, environmental investigations and other studies with respect to the physical condition of the Property conducted by Buyer. If Buyer elects to terminate this Agreement by reason of failure of the Contingency set forth in this subparagraph (b), Buyer shall promptly upon such election deliver to Seller all written reports, studies and information prepared by third parties for Buyer which pertain to the physical condition of the Property.

- (c) Buyer's determination that zoning and other governmental regulations affecting the use of the Property are satisfactory for Buyer's intended use. Buyer shall have until April 30, 2015 to make such determination and to give written notice to Seller of any zoning or governmental regulations which are unacceptable to Buyer for any reason or for no reason. If Buyer disapproves of the satisfaction of any Contingency within the applicable time period provided above, Buyer's sole remedy shall be to terminate this Agreement and Seller shall have no obligation to remedy any Contingency which Buyer disapproves. If this Agreement terminates as a result of the failure of the satisfaction of any of the Contingencies, all sums and documents deposited in Escrow shall be returned to the parties who respectively deposited the same, and Buyer and Seller shall each pay one-half (1/2) of the Escrow costs.
- (d) All representations and warranties of Seller contained in this Agreement shall be true and correct in all material respects as of the date of this Agreement and as of the Close of Escrow.
- (e) The Title Company shall be committed to issue to Buyer the Title Policy identified in Section 8.4 of this Agreement.
- (f) Seller has performed and satisfied all material agreements and covenants required to be performed by Seller under this Agreement prior to or at the Close of Escrow.
- 4.2 If Buyer fails to give written notice to Seller of its disapproval of the Contingency set forth in Section 4.1(b) or (c) within the respective applicable time limit set forth above in Paragraph 4.1(b) or (c), it shall conclusively be deemed that Buyer has waived such Contingency and such Contingency shall conclusively be deemed satisfied.

5. REPRESENTATIONS AND WARRANTIES BY SELLER.

- 5.1 Seller makes the representations and warranties in this <u>Paragraph 5</u>, each and all of which shall survive any and all inquiries and investigations made by Buyer and shall survive the Close of Escrow and recordation of the Grant Deed.
- 5.1.1 Seller is a Municipal Corporation duly organized, validly existing and good standing under the laws of the State of California, and has the power and authority to enter into this Agreement and to consummate the transactions contemplated hereby. Seller and the specific individual parties signing this Agreement on behalf of Seller represent and warrant that the parties signing this Agreement on behalf of the Seller have the full legal power, authority and right to execute and deliver this Agreement.
- 5.1.2 Neither the entering into this Agreement nor the performance of any of Seller's obligations under this Agreement will violate the terms of any contract, agreement or instrument to which Seller is a party.
- 5.1.3 Seller has not actually received any formal written notice and Seller is unaware of any claims of any pending widening modification or realignment of any street or highway contiguous to the Real Property or any existing or proposed eminent domain proceeding which would result in a taking of all or any part of the Property.

- 5.1.4 Seller has not actually received any formal written notice and Seller is unaware of any claims that any of the easements, covenants, conditions, restrictions or agreements to which the Property is subject interferes with or is breached by the use or operation of the Property as presently used and operated.
- 5.1.5 Seller has not been served (by means of formal, legal service of process as required by law) with any litigation, and no arbitration proceedings have been commenced, and Seller is unaware of any claims which do or will affect any aspect of the Property or Seller's ability to perform its obligations under this Agreement. In addition, within the last year, Seller has not been threatened in writing with any litigation (or arbitration) by a third party which would affect any aspect of the Property or Seller's ability to perform its obligations under this Agreement.
- 5.1.6 Seller has not actually received any formal written notice of and Seller is unaware of any claims, any presently uncured violation of any law, ordinance, rule or regulation (including, but not limited to, those relating to zoning, building, fire, health and safety) of any governmental, quasi-governmental authority bearing on the construction, operation, ownership or use of the Property.
- 5.1.7 There are not any written commitments to, or written agreements with, any governmental or quasi-governmental authority or agency materially affecting the Property which have not been heretofore disclosed by Seller to Buyer in writing.
- 5.1.8 Seller has not been served (by means of formal, legal service of process as required by law) or formally notified in writing by any governmental or quasi-governmental authority and Seller is unaware of any claims (i) that the Property or any adjoining property, contains or may contain any "Hazardous Materials" in violation of any "Environmental Regulations" (as those terms are defined in Paragraph 5.1.9, below); or (ii) that the Seller has not received or been served with any formal Notice of any storage, use or maintenance of Hazardous Materials on, in or under the Property in violation of any Environmental Regulations. In addition, to the best of Seller's knowledge, but without any specific investigation therefor, Seller has no actual knowledge of the presence on, in or under the Property of any Hazardous materials in any way related to all or any portion of the Property or the area surrounding the Property.
- 5.1.9 As used in this Agreement, the terms "Environmental Regulations" and "Hazardous Materials" shall have the following meanings:
- (a) "Environmental Regulations" shall mean all applicable statutes, regulations, rules, ordinances, codes, licenses, permits, orders, approvals, plans, authorizations, and similar items, of all governmental agencies, departments, commissions, boards, bureaus or instrumentalities of the United States, states and political subdivisions thereof and all applicable judicial and administrative and regulatory decrees, judgments and orders relating to the protection of human health or the environment, including, without limitation:
- (i) all requirements, including but not limited to those pertaining to reporting, licensing, permitting, investigation and remediation of emissions, discharges, releases or threatened releases of Hazardous Materials, whether solid, liquid or gaseous in nature, into

the air, surface water, groundwater or land, or relating to the manufacture, processing, distribution, use, treatment, storage, disposal, transport or handling of Hazardous Materials, whether solid, liquid or gaseous in nature; and (ii) all requirements pertaining to the protection of the health and safety of employees or the public.

- "Hazardous Materials" shall mean (i) any flammable, explosive or (b) radioactive materials, hazardous wastes, toxic sub-stances or related materials including, without limitation, substances defined as "hazardous substances", "hazardous materials", "toxic substances" or "solid waste" in the Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation and Liability Act of 1980, as amended, 42 U.S.C. Sec. 9601, et seq.; the hazardous Materials Transportation Act, 49 U.S.C. Section 1801, et seq.; the Toxic Substances Control Act, 15 U.S.C., Section 2601 et seg.; the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act of 1976, 42 U.S.C. Section 6901 et seq.; and in the regulations adopted and publications promulgated pursuant to said laws: (ii) those substances listed in the United States Department of Transportation Table (49 C.F.R. 172.101 and amendments thereto) or by the Environmental Protection Agency (or any successor agency) as hazardous substances (40 C.F.R. Part 302 and amendments thereto); (iii) those substances defined as "hazardous wastes", "hazardous substances" or "toxic substances" in any similar federal, state or local laws or in the regulations adopted and publications promulgated pursuant to any of the foregoing laws or which otherwise are regulated by any governmental authority, agency, department, commission, board or instrumentality of the United States of America, the State of California or any political subdivision thereof, (iv) any pollutant or contaminant or hazardous, dangerous or toxic chemicals, materials, or substances within the meaning of any other applicable federal, state, or local law, regulation, ordinance, or requirement (including consent decrees and administrative orders) relating to or imposing liability or standards of conduct concerning any hazardous, toxic or dangerous waste, substance or material, all as amended; (v) petroleum or any by-products thereof; (vi) any radioactive material, including any source, special nuclear or by-product material as defined at 42 U.S.C. Sections 2011 at seq., as amended, and in the regulations adopted and publications promulgated pursuant to said law; (vii) asbestos in any form or condition; and (viii) polychlorinated biphenyls.
- 5.1.10 Seller has neither engaged nor dealt with any broker or finder in connection with the sale contemplated by this Agreement, Seller shall pay, and shall hold Buyer harmless from and against, any commission or finder's fee payable to any broker or finder or any other party who represents or claims to represent Seller.
- 5.1.11 Other than those express representations and warranties contained in this Agreement, Seller makes no warranty or representation, express or implied, including but not limited to, implied warranties of merchantability and fitness for a particular purpose.
- 5.1.12 Except to the extent Seller has made a specific representation and warranty with respect thereto, no document or information provided by Seller to Buyer shall constitute a representation as to the completeness or accuracy of such documents or information.

6. REPRESENTATIONS AND WARRANTIES BY BUYER.

6.1 Buyer makes the following representations and warranties in this <u>Paragraph 6</u>, each and all of which shall survive any and all inquiries and investigations made by Seller and shall survive the Close of Escrow and recordation of the Grant Deed.

- 6.1.1 Buyer has neither engaged nor dealt with any broker or finder in connection with the sale contemplated by this Agreement. Buyer shall pay, and hold Seller harmless from and against, any commission or finder's fee payable to broker or finder, or any other party who represents or claims to represent Buyer.
- 6.1.2 Buyer is a Corporation, duly organized, validly existing and in good standing under the laws of the State of California which has the power and authority to enter into this Agreement and to consummate the transactions contemplated hereby. The Buyer, and the specific, individual parties signing this Agreement on behalf of Buyer represent and warrant that the parties signing this Agreement on behalf of the Buyer have the full legal power, authority and right to execute and deliver this Agreement.
- 6.1.3 Buyer has or will make its own investigation concerning the physical condition of the Property, condition of title or any other matter pertaining to the Property, and, other than the specific representations and warranties made by Seller pursuant to this Agreement, Buyer is not relying on any representations, warranties or inducements of Seller with respect to the physical condition of the Property, condition of title to the Property, or any other matter pertaining to the Property. Accordingly, except for those specific representations and warranties of Seller set forth in this Agreement, Buyer is purchasing the Property and each and every aspect thereof in an "as-is" condition,

7. INDEMNIFICATION.

- 7.1 Subject to any other provisions of this Agreement to the contrary, each party ("Indemnitor") agrees to indemnify and hold the other party ("Indemnitee") harmless from and against any claim, loss, damage or expense, including any reasonable attorneys fees (including attorneys fees on appeal), asserted against or suffered by the Indemnitee resulting from:
 - (a) Any breach by the Indemnitor of this Agreement;
- (b) The inaccuracy or breach of any of the representations, warranties or covenants made by the Indemnitor.
- 7.2 Indemnitee shall submit any claim for indemnification under this Agreement to the Indemnitor in writing within a reasonable time after Indemnitee determines that an event has occurred which has given rise to a right of indemnification under this Paragraph 7 and shall give Indemnitor a reasonable opportunity to investigate and cure any default of Indemnitor under this Agreement and eliminate or remove any claim by a third party. Notwithstanding the foregoing, if the nature of Indemnitor's default or the third party claim is such that it would be impractical or unreasonable to give Indemnitor an opportunity to investigate and cure such default and remove such claim, Indemnitee need not give Indemnitor such opportunity.
- 7.3 If such claim for indemnification relates to a claim or demand presented in writing by a third party against Indemnitee, Indemnitor shall employ legal counsel reasonably acceptable to Indemnitee to defend any such claim or demand, and Indemnitee shall make available to Indemnitor, and its legal counsel, all records and other materials in its possession or under its control reasonably required by Indemnitor for its use in contesting such liability. If Indemnitor fails to defend any such claim or demand, Indemnitee may do so at its option, but shall not have any obligation to do so, and any attorney fees, costs and expenses incurred by

Indemnitee in the defense of any such claim shall be reimbursed by Indemnitor within ten (10) days after the date of written demand for reimbursement from Indemnitee.

8. <u>ESCROW AND CLOSING.</u>

- 8.1 As soon as possible after the full execution of this Agreement, Buyer and Seller shall open an escrow for the purpose of consummating the purchase and sale contemplated by this Agreement ("Escrow") by depositing an executed copy of this Agreement with Placer Title Company Fresno, California ("Escrow Holder"). This Agreement shall constitute escrow instructions to Escrow Holder. Seller and Buyer shall, promptly upon request by Escrow Holder, execute such additional escrow instructions as may be reasonably required by Escrow Holder, including Escrow Holder's standard printed conditions and stipulations with respect to escrows concerning the purchase and sale of real property; provided, however, that if there is any conflict between the provisions of this Agreement and the provisions of any such additional instructions, the provisions of this Agreement shall prevail. Upon delivery to Escrow of a fully executed copy of this Agreement by both parties, Escrow shall be deemed opened on the terms and conditions set forth in this Agreement.
- 8.2 Escrow shall close, and the Grant Deed shall be recorded in the Office of the County Recorder of Fresno County, California on May 20, 2015 ("Close of Escrow"), (a) Within the time set forth below, or if none is specified, prior to the Close of Escrow, Seller shall deliver to Escrow Holder, or if so indicated, to Buyer, at least one (1) day prior to the Close of Escrow, the duly executed and acknowledged Grant Deed.
- 8.3 Buyer shall, at least one (1) day prior to Close of Escrow, deliver to Escrow Holder an additional sum sufficient to cover Buyer's closing costs.
- 8.4 On the Close of Escrow, the Escrow Holder shall record the Grant Deed and shall deliver the monies and instruments to which party is entitled pursuant to this Agreement, only when the Title Company is in a position to issue its CLTA policy of title insurance subject only (i) to the Permitted Exceptions; and (ii) Title Company's standard pre-printed exceptions, with liability in the amount of the purchase price, showing title to the Real Property vested in Buyer(or as designated by Buyer) ("Title Policy").
- 8.5 Upon Close of Escrow, possession of the Property shall be delivered to Buyer subject to the Permitted Exceptions, and the following items, documents and monies shall be delivered to the parties by Escrow Holder as set forth below:
- (a) To Seller: the cash portion of the Purchase Price as set forth in <u>Paragraph 2</u> as adjusted pursuant to this Agreement and reduced by the amount of Seller's closing costs as set forth in <u>Paragraph 13.7.1</u>, below.
 - (b) To Buyer: the Title Policy.
- 8.6 Upon Close of Escrow, Escrow and title charges shall be paid in the manner provided below.
 - 8.6.1 Seller shall pay:

- (a) The cost of any and all documentary transfer tax or stamps or other sales tax.
 - (b) One-half (1/2) of the Escrow fees.
 - 8.6.2 Buyer shall pay:
 - (a) The cost of the title policy.
 - (b) All recording fees.
 - (c) One-half (1/2) of the Escrow fees.
- 8.7 Escrow Holder is authorized and instructed to debit Seller for Seller's closing costs as set forth in <u>Paragraph 8.6.1</u>, above.

9. PRORATIONS.

- 9.1 Prorations shall be made as of the Close of Escrow. All prorations shall be made on the basis of a thirty (30) day month and shall be paid in cash to Seller if it is entitled thereto, or shall be credited against the cash portion of the Purchase Price if Buyer is entitled thereto. Such prorations shall be made by Escrow Holder on the basis of a statement(s) approved by Buyer and Seller and deposited into the Escrow prior to the Close of Escrow. The date used for prorations is hereinafter referred to as the "Proration Date".
- (a) All real estate taxes and all personal property taxes due and owing as of the Proration Date, and all penalties and interest thereon, shall be paid by Seller. Current real estate taxes, special assessments and personal property taxes which are not yet due and owing shall be prorated based upon the most recent tax bill, so that the portion of current taxes allocable to the period from the beginning of such tax year through the Proration Date shall be charged to and paid by Seller and the portion of the current taxes allocable to the portion of such tax year from the Proration Date to the end of such tax year shall be charged to and paid by Buyer. Proration of taxes and assessments shall be final as of the Proration Date, regardless of the amount of taxes or assessments that actually are, or subsequently become, due.
- 10. <u>SURVIVAL OF CLOSE OF ESCROW</u>. All representations, warranties, covenants, conditions, Agreements and obligations contained in or relating to this Agreement shall survive the Close of Escrow and the recordation of the Grant Deed and shall not merge therein unless specifically stated otherwise in this Agreement.
- 11. <u>NOTICES</u>. All notices to be given pursuant to this Agreement shall be either (i) personally delivered; (ii) sent via certified or registered mail, postage prepaid; (iii) overnight courier (such as Federal Express, DHL, etc.); or (iv) by telecopy transmittal. If sent via certified or registered mail, receipt shall be deemed effective forty-eight (48) hours after being deposited in the United States mail. If sent via telecopy transmission, a confirming copy shall be sent to the sender, and receipt of the telecopy transmittal shall be deemed made twenty-four (24) hours after the sending thereof. If sent via overnight courier, receipt shall be deemed effective twenty-four (24) hours after the sending thereof. All notices to be given pursuant to this Agreement shall be given to the parties at the following respective address.

- 16. <u>COUNTERPARTS</u>. This Agreement may be executed in counterparts, each of which shall be considered an original and all of which taken together shall constitute one and the same instrument.
- 17. <u>GOVERNING LAW</u>. This Agreement has been prepared, negotiated and executed in, and shall be construed in accordance with, the laws of the State of California. Any action or proceeding relating to or arising out of this Agreement shall be filed, if a State action, in the Superior Court of the State of California for the County of Fresno, or if a Federal action, in the United States District Court for the Eastern District of California.

Consideration and Necessary Action on Resolution Designating Days and Times for Outdoor Irrigation and Establishing Other Water Use Restrictions.

DISCUSSION: At the meeting on April 20, 2015, the Council received a presentation by representatives of California Water Service Company (Cal Water) relating to the ongoing California drought and the State Mandated requirements to reduce consumption. The City's Water Conservation Ordinance sets forth four stages of water conservation and, currently, the City has implemented and maintains a Stage III Mandatory Water Conservation Requirement in accordance with SMC §8-9-6. To achieve the mandated consumption reductions imposed by the State and to conform to new regulations of the Regional Water Quality Control Board the City has determined that it is necessary to maintain the Stage III Mandatory Water Conservation Requirements and, in addition, to impose additional conservation requirements in accordance with the provisions of the Water Conservation Ordinance.

SMC §8-9-6(C) provides that once a Stage III Conservation Requirement is implemented pursuant to that section, the City Council must specify by resolution the days and times that outdoor irrigation of landscaping is permitted. The proposed resolution reduces from three to two days per week all residences, businesses, or other physical facilities within the City of every type will be allowed to irrigate lawns, gardens, landscaped areas, trees, shrubs or plants. For those having addresses ending in odd numbers, outdoor watering can only occur on Tuesdays and Saturdays of each week and for those with addresses ending in even numbers, such irrigation can only occur on Wednesdays or Sundays of each week. All outdoor irrigation is limited by the proposed resolution to occur only on the specified days and between the hours of 7:00 p.m. and 6:00 a.m.

In addition, the proposed resolution places a moratorium on all washing of cars or other motor vehicles. There are commercial car washes within the City and nearby businesses that wash trucks, trailers, boats and other larger vehicles, all of which are required to use recycled water. The ordinance prohibits anyone from washing any vehicle within the City other than at a business duly permitted to provide that service using recycled water.

During the presentation by Cal Water, questions were raised relative to the enforcement of water restrictions implemented by the ordinance and by this resolution. The ordinance essentially provides that Cal Water may issue notices of violation of the Water Conservation Ordinance but is not authorized by law to issue citations. (SMC §8-9-11). When that provision was adopted Cal Water was in fact not authorized by law to issue citations which, at that time, were always citations for infractions or misdemeanors processed through the courts.

By law, an infraction or misdemeanor citation that is prosecuted in a court of law must be issued by a sworn peace officer or other City employee specifically authorized to issue those types of citations.

The City, however, has now adopted an Administrative Citation Ordinance which allows a citation to be issued for any violation of the Selma Municipal Code, including the Water Conservation Ordinance, which are processed and prosecuted through an administrative hearing procedure conducted by the City. The Administrative Citation Ordinance specifically permits this City Council to designate any person or entity to act as an Enforcement Officer and issue administrative citations for violations of the Municipal Code. Accordingly, the proposed resolution provides that Cal Water is an authorized Enforcement Officer, that may issue administrative citations, to be processed through the City.

RESOLUTION NO. 2015-R

RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SELMA DESIGNATING DAYS AND TIMES FOR OUTDOOR IRRIGATION AND ESTABLISHING OTHER WATER USE RESTRICTIONS

WHEREAS, Chapter 9 of Title VIII of the Selma Municipal Code (SMC) the Water Conservation Ordinance of the City of Selma, provides, for implementing water conservation stages as necessary for water conservation; and

WHEREAS, the City has implemented Stage 3 mandatory water conservation requirements pursuant to Selma Municipal Code §8-9-6 and the provisions of subdivision (C) of that section require that the City Council specify by resolution the days and times that outdoor irrigation of landscaping is allowed; and

WHEREAS, California is in the fourth year of an unprecedented drought and the water purveyor in the City of Selma, California Water Service Company ("Cal Water"), has been ordered by the Regional Water Quality Control Board to reduce consumption by 32% and has been threatened with fines, which will necessarily be passed onto customers of the utility, in the event that level of conservation is not achieved.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. The foregoing recitals are true and correct.
- 2. All outdoor irrigation of lawns, gardens, landscaped areas, trees, shrubs or other plants shall occur for every residence and business and physical facilities of every type located within the City of Selma only on those days and between those times as specified in this Resolution and, in all cases, shall be done utilizing individual sprinklers, sprinkler systems, drip system irrigation, or hand held faucet filled buckets of 5 gallons of water or less, with no exceptions.
- 3. For all residences and businesses and physical facilities of every type with addresses ending in odd numbers (1, 3, 5, 7, or 9) all outdoor irrigation of lawns, gardens, landscaped areas, trees, shrubs or other plants shall occur only on Tuesdays and/or Saturdays of each week.
- 4. For businesses and residences and physical facilities of every type having addresses ending in even numbers (0, 2, 4, 6, or 8) all outdoor irrigation of lawns, gardens, landscaped areas, trees, shrubs and other plants shall only occur on Wednesdays and/or Sundays of each week.

- 5. All outdoor irrigation of lawns, gardens, landscaped areas, trees, shrubs or other plants shall occur only on the days permitted by this Resolution and shall only occur on those days between the hours of 7 p.m. and 6 a.m.
- 6. Recognizing there are commercial car washes within the City of Selma that use recycled water, the Council finds and determines that it is unnecessary and a waste of potable water to permit the washing of automobiles, trucks, trailers, boats, airplanes or other types of vehicles or mobile equipment within the City of Selma. No person may wash an automobile, truck, trailer, boat, airplane or any other type of vehicle or mobile equipment within the City of Selma other than at a business duly permitted to wash trucks, cars, boats, trailers or other vehicles using recycled water.
- 7. SMC §8-9-11 states the Cal Water may issue notices of violation of the Water Conservation Ordinance, but is not authorized by law to issue citations. However, with the subsequent adoption of the City's Administrative Citation Ordinance any person or entity designated by the City Council or the City Manager to enforce violations of the City Code is authorized to issue a citation in accordance with the law that is created by the Administrative Citation Ordinance. The City Council hereby designates Cal Water as an Enforcement Officer within the meaning of SMC §1-20-4 having the power to issue an administrative citation under Title I, Chapter 20 of the Selma Municipal Code for violations of the Water Conservation Ordinance and this Resolution.




