ITEM NO: 2

SUBJECT: Consideration and Necessary action on an Ordinance Amending Section 6 of Chapter 21 of Title VI of the Selma Municipal Code Entitled Graffiti. *Second Reading, Public Hearing and Adoption*

DISCUSSION: The proposed amendment to the current graffiti ordinance will authorize the City to remove graffiti either through its own forces or by requiring the property owner to remove the graffiti. The proposed amendment allows the City to repair, remove or paint over the graffiti, as appropriate, in the event the property owner fails to do so within 72 hours of receiving notice of the need to do so.

The City's current Ordinance on graffiti is at Chapter 21 of Title 6 and it does not provide any means of allowing the City to remove graffiti if the property owner does not. The summary abatement of nuisance provisions of Title I, Chapter 21 of the Municipal Code does include graffiti as a nuisance subject to the abatement procedures prescribed by that chapter. Because that chapter provides for an appeal of the notice to abate a public nuisance, including graffiti, relying on that provision could result in the graffiti being present much longer than 72 hours. Accordingly, to have an enforceable mechanism for requiring the removal of graffiti within 72 hours and to allow for the City to remove the graffiti through its own forces in the event the property owner fails to do so, it is necessary, by virtue of Government Code §38772, 38773.2 and 38773.6, to enact an ordinance which imposes this obligation on the property owner, and gives notice that the City will remove the graffiti if the property owner does not.

By amending Section 6, Chapter 21 of Title VI, the attached ordinance provides for a mechanism by which the City may require a property owner to either remove the graffiti present on his property within 72 hours of receiving notice from the City of the need for removing the graffiti by making it unlawful for anyone to maintain graffiti on his or her property for a period longer than 72 hours after receiving notice of the need to abate the graffiti from the City.

Given that the State Legislative has determined that graffiti is a public nuisance, it is appropriate to enforce a requirement on property owners to remove graffiti from their property within 72 hours of receiving notice to do so from the City. Imposing a lien against the real property, for the cost of removing the graffiti however, is an imposition that requires a longer notice and an opportunity to be heard. At minimum imposing a lien on property requires that the property owner be given a much longer notice of intent to impose the lien (at least 30 days) and allowing the property owner to appeal to an independent hearing officer. For that reason, the proposed ordinance, provides for the same right to appeal a

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notice of the intent to assess a lien as are applicable to an administrative citation for violation of the Municipal Code.

RECOMMENDATION: Waive Second Reading, Conduct Public Hearing and Adopt Ordinance Amending Section 6 of Chapter 21 of Title VI of the Selma Municipal Code.

ORDINANCE NO. 2018-

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SELMA AMENDING CHAPTER 21 OF TITLE VI OF THE SELMA MUNICIPAL CODE ENTITLED GRAFFITI

The City Council of the City of Selma, California the ("City") does ordain as follows:

WHEREAS, current City ordinance prohibits graffiti and provides for its removal from public property by City forces, and on private property, but only by the person responsible for applying it or his or her parents if the person is a minor or by the City with the consent of the property owner; and

WHEREAS, the City Council finds that graffiti is a public nuisance and destructive of the rights and values of property owners as well as the entire community and that unless the City, or the property owner where the graffiti is located acts to remove it either from public or private property, the graffiti tends to remain, other properties become targets of graffiti and entire neighborhoods are affected and become less desirable places in which to be, all to the detriment of the City; and

WHEREAS, Government Code §§38772, 38773.2 and 38773.3 specifically authorize an ordinance by a city requiring a property owner to remove, or pay the cost of the City's removal of graffiti unless removed by the property owner following of receipt of notice as provided for by this ordinance.

NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of Selma does hereby ordain as follows:

Section 1. Recitals. The foregoing recitals are true and correct and incorporated herein by this reference.

Section 2. Section 6 of Chapter 21 of Title 6 of the Selma Municipal Code is hereby amended to read as follows:

6-21-6 Removal:

(A) General: Any person applying graffiti within the City shall have the duty to remove same in a manner approved by the City and the property owner within 24 hours after notice by the City or a public or private owner of the property involved. Failure of any person to so remove graffiti shall constitute an additional violation of this Chapter.

Consistent with Civil Code §1714.1, where graffiti is applied by minors, the parent or guardian shall be responsible for such removal or payment of cost thereof.

(B) Public Property: Whenever the City Manager or his designee representative determines that graffiti exists upon property owned by the City, it shall be removed as soon as possible. When the property is owned by a public entity, other than the City, the removal of the graffiti may be authorized by the City Manager or his representative, and removal undertaken by the City only after securing the consent of the public entity having jurisdiction over the property.

Property Owner Responsibility: It is unlawful for any person who is the (C)owner of or in possession and control of real property or who is otherwise primarily responsible for control of the property or repair or maintenance of property in the City of Selma to permit property that has been defaced with graffiti to remain defaced for a period of 72 hours after service, by personal delivery or by certified mail or following the posting, at a conspicuous place on the property where graffiti is located, written notice to the owner and to any lessee, occupant or other person having possession of real property within the City that graffiti must be removed within 72 hours of the date of the service of the notice. The notice shall apprise the property owner or other lessee or person in possession of the real property that the graffiti must be removed, repaired or painted over and that a failure to do so is cause for the City or its contractor to enter upon the property and to abate the public nuisance by removing or painting over the graffiti located on the property. If the property owner or responsible party in possession fails to remove the offending graffiti within the time specified by this Section, the City may paint, repair or otherwise remove the graffiti and the cost thereof shall be assessed upon the property as a lien in the manner provided for by this Section.

(D) Cost Recovery: Whenever the City is required to abate graffiti as a public nuisance as allowed by this Section, the City may recover pursuant to California Government Code §38773, the cost of such abatement through the assessment of a lien against the property on which the nuisance was maintained. Prior to the recordation of a lien against such property for the recovery of abatement and related administrative costs, the City shall, in accordance with §38773.1 or 38773.5 of the Government Code provide written notification, by registered or certified mail, to the property owner that a lien will be assessed against the property and such costs will continue as a lien upon the property until it paid. On receipt of such notification, a property owner may, within the time and in the manner prescribed by Chapter 20 of Title I of this Code appeal the proposed assessment of the lien on the property by filing an appeal with the City Manager in the manner specified by Section 8 of Chapter 20 of Title I of this Code and may pursue all appeal rights provided for by that Chapter. Following the conclusion of any such appeal, or if the notice is not timely appealed, the lien as proposed by the notice shall be recorded against the real property.

Notwithstanding any term or provision to the contrary in any oral or (E) written lease or rental agreement. property management, maintenance or similar agreement granting possession or control of the real property to another, an owner or owners of real property in the city of Selma in the possession or under the control of any other person, leasee, tenant, property manager, caretaker or custodian of any type shall be deemed to have consented to the removal of graffiti from the real property by such leasee, tenant, property manager, caretaker, custodian or other person in possession or control of the real property, upon the issuance of a notice to remove the graffiti to such person, leasee, tenant, property manager, caretaker or custodian. The property owner or owners shall be deemed to have constructive knowledge of a notice to remove graffiti from the real property that has been posted on the property or served on any person lawfully in possession or control of the property including any leasee, tenant, property manager, caretaker or custodian. It shall be unlawful for any owner of real property in the city of Selma to take any adverse action against a person lawfully in possession or control of the property for having complied or attempted to comply with a notice to remove graffiti on the property issued by the city of Selma.

Section 3. California Environmental Quality Act: The City Council having considered the Staff Report and all public comments, has determined that the amendment is not a project under the California Environmental Quality Act because the amendment has no potential for resulting in a physical change in the environment. Since the amendment is not a project, no environmental documentation is required.

<u>Section 4</u>. Severability: If any section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance is for any reason held to be invalid or unconstitutional, the decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of the Ordinance. The City Council hereby declares that it would have passed this Ordinance, and each section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase thereof, irrespective of the fact that any one or more sections, subsections, sentences, clauses or phrases have been declared invalid or unconstitutional.

Section 5. Effective Date and Posting of Ordinance: This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force thirty (30) days from and after the date of final passage. The city Clerk of the City of Selma shall cause this Ordinance to be published at least once within fifteen (15) days after its passage in The Selma News with the names of those City Council Members voting for or against the Ordinance.

SUBJECT: Consideration and necessary action on an Ordinance of the City of Selma Adding Chapter 29 to Title VI of the Municipal Code to Regulate Smoking and Tobacco Product Use; Second Reading, Public Hearing and Adoption.

DISCUSSION: A. The Proposed Ordinance

On March 19, 2018, the Council received a presentation sponsored by the Fresno County Department of Public Heath promoting an ordinance that prohibits smoking in or near public parks. The Department of Public Health has further provided a proposed ordinance which has been altered to fit the City of Selma and which prohibits smoking in public parks, in addition to any other "recreational area" defined to mean an area owned or controlled or used by the City of Selma and open to the general public for recreational purposes including parks, playgrounds, sports fields, walking paths, bike trails and skateboard parks. The ordinance prohibits smoking in those areas in addition to other public places being used as a public event such as a parade, farmer's market or other festival open to the general public. (See proposed 6-29-1(d); proposed 6-29-2). Pioneer Village fits none of the definitions, and is specifically included as a recreational area for that reason.

The ordinance does not prohibit smoking at any other location other than one owned or controlled or used by the City. The provision of proposed 6-29-4(d), although phrased to apply to any person, employer or non-profit entity, includes the City and requires the City erect appropriate signs notifying persons of the prohibitions against smoking in recreational areas or other areas used by the City and within 25 feet thereof. The ordinance does not impose any requirement on any person, employer or non-profit entity using an unenclosed area if it is not being used by the City or is not owned or controlled by the City. The requirements for the placement of signs, therefore, apply only to the City.

Although the provision states that the presence or absence of a sign is not a defense to a charge of smoking or the use of a tobacco product in violation of the ordinance, to make the ordinance enforceable, there does need to be signage erected at appropriate locations as mandated by Section 6-29-4(d).

Otherwise, although one is presumed to know what the law is, in a criminal enforcement proceeding, (violation of the ordinance is an infraction) a person clearly has a defense to the type of citation that could be issued under this ordinance if there is no sign because he has not received what the law characterizes as the constitutionally required "fair notice" of the prohibitions of the ordinance. Consequently, code enforcement, Police or any other officer

of the City cannot consistent with law, take enforcement action, by issuance of a citation, or otherwise unless and until the signs are erected and in place.

The penalties and enforcement clause (at 6-29-5) is standard for most provisions of this type and makes the remedies and enforcement mechanisms provided cumulative", meaning the City can enforce the ordinance by issuing a citation in accordance with the citation issuance procedures currently in the Municipal Code. The fine proposed to be imposed for the infraction is \$100. Higher fees or penalties could be obtained (up to \$1,000) by filing a civil action, which would be likely reserved for what are repeat offenders.

B. Revisions to Proposed Ordinance

Although the ordinance prohibits smoking in public places other than Parks and Recreation areas such as at a parade or farmers market open to the public, it would not be practical to install permanent signage as such areas are used for other activities besides public events, which typically last for a temporary period of time. Accordingly, temporary signage or other notification is required to be provided to those attending public events by the person or entity sponsoring the event.

The provision at subdivision (d) of 6-29-4 provides for the posting of signage at the "point of ingress" to the particular area and in the case of a City park, there is typically no specific point of ingress. The posting of a sign at the point of ingress, therefore, to most City parks would mean posting a sign in the most conspicuous point at each area in which a park may be entered which, for a park surrounded by City streets would mean posting no less than 4 signs along the frontage of each street where it meets the park.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF SELMA ADDING CHAPTER 29 TO TITLE VI OF THE MUNICIPAL CODE TO REGULATE SMOKING AND TOBACCO PRODUCT USE *************************

The City Council of the City of Selma does ordain as follows:

SECTION I. FINDINGS.

The City Council of the City of Selma hereby finds and declares as follows:

WHEREAS, tobacco use causes death and disease and continues to be an urgent public health challenge, as evidenced by the following:

- 480,000 people die prematurely in the United States from smoking-related diseases every year, making tobacco use the nation's leading cause of preventable death; and
- Tobacco use can cause disease in nearly all organ systems and is responsible for 87 percent of lung cancer deaths, 79 percent of all chronic obstructive pulmonary disease deaths, and 32 percent of coronary heart disease deaths; and

WHEREAS, secondhand smoke has been repeatedly identified as a health hazard, as evidenced by the following:

- The U.S. Surgeon General concluded that there is no risk-free level of exposure to secondhand smoke; and
- The California Air Resources Board placed secondhand smoke in the same category as the most toxic automotive and industrial air pollutants by categorizing it as a toxic air contaminant for which there is no safe level of exposure; and
- The California Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) included secondhand smoke on the Proposition 65 list of chemicals known to the state of California to cause cancer, birth defects, and other reproductive harm;and

WHEREAS, exposure to secondhand smoke anywhere has negative health impacts, and exposure to secondhand smoke occurs at significant levels outdoors, as evidenced by the following:

• Levels of secondhand smoke exposure outdoors can reach levels attained indoors depending on direction and amount of wind and number and proximity of smokers; and

- Smoking cigarettes near building entryways can increase air pollution levels by more than two times background levels, with maximum levels reaching the "hazardous" range on the United States EPA's Air Quality Index; and
- To be completely free from exposure to secondhand smoke in outdoor places, a person may have to move nearly 23 feet away from the source of the smoke, about the width of a two-lane road; and

WHEREAS, exposure to secondhand smoke causes death and disease, as evidenced by the following:

- Since 1964, approximately 2.5 million nonsmokers have died from health problems caused by exposure to secondhand smoke; and
- Secondhand smoke is responsible for an estimated 41,300 heart disease-related and lung cancer-related deaths among adult nonsmokers each year in the United States; and
- Exposure to secondhand smoke increases the risk of coronary heart disease by about 25 percent to 30 percent and increases the risk of stroke by 20 percent to 30 percent; and

WHEREAS, tobacco use and exposure to secondhand smoke impose great social and economic costs, as evidenced by the following:

- Between 2009 and 2012, the total annual economic burden of smoking in the United States was between \$289 billion and \$332.5 billion; and
- From 2005 to 2009, the average annual health care expenditures attributable to smoking were approximately \$132.5 billion to \$175.9 billion in direct medical care costs for adults and \$151 billion in lost productivity; and
- The total annual cost of smoking in California was estimated at \$548 per resident or between \$2,262 and \$2,904 per smoker per year; and
- California's Tobacco Control Program saved the state and its residents \$134 billion in health care expenditures between the year of its inception, 1989, and 2008, with savings growing yearly; and

WHEREAS, laws restricting the use of tobacco products have recognizable benefits to public health and medical costs with a review of over 80 peer-reviewed research studies showing that smoke-free policies effectively do the following:

• Reduce tobacco use: tobacco use is reduced by median of 2.7 percent; and

- Reduce exposure to secondhand smoke: air pollution is reduced by a median of 88 percent and biomarkers for secondhand smoke are reduced by a median of 50 percent; and
- Increase the number of tobacco users who quit by a median of 3.8 percent; and
- Reduce initiation of tobacco use among young people; and
- Reduce tobacco-related illnesses and death: there is a 5.1 percent median decrease in hospitalizations from heart attacks and a 20.1 percent decrease in hospitalizations from asthma attacks after such laws are passed; and

WHEREAS, laws restricting electronic smoking devices use also have benefits to the public as evidenced by the following:

- Research has found at least ten chemicals known to the State of California to cause cancer, birth defects, or other reproductive harm, such as formaldehyde, acetaldehyde, lead, nickel, and toluene; and
- More than one study has concluded that exposure to vapor from electronic smoking devices may cause passive or secondhand vaping; and
- The use of electronic smoking devices in smoke-free locations threatens to undermine compliance with smoking regulations and reverse the progress that has been made in establishing a social norm that smoking is not permitted in public places and places of employment; and
- The State of California's Tobacco Education and Research Oversight Committee (TEROC) "opposes the use of e-cigarettes in all areas where other tobacco products are banned;" and

WHEREAS, smokeless tobacco is not a safe alternative to smoking and causes its own share of death and disease, as evidenced by the following:

- Smokeless tobacco use is associated with oral, esophageal, and pancreatic cancers; and
- Smokeless tobacco is associated with increased risk for heart disease and stroke, stillbirth and preterm delivery, and Parkinson's disease; and

WHEREAS, cigarette butts are a major and persistent source of litter, as evidenced by the following:

• In 2007, it was estimated that Americans consume 360 billion cigarettes each year; and

- 55.7 percent of smokers admit to littering cigarettes in the last month; and
- In an observational study of nearly 10,000 individuals, after cigarettes were smoked, 45 percent of cigarettes ended up as litter; and
- In 2011, 22.6 percent of all debris collected from beaches and coastal areas are smoking related products; and
- Cigarette butts are often cast onto sidewalks and streets, and frequently end up in storm drains that flow into streams, rivers, bays, lagoons, and ultimately the ocean; and

WHEREAS, cigarette butts pose a health threat to young children, as evidenced by the following:

- In 2012, American poison control centers received nearly 8,648 reports of poisoning by the ingestion of cigarettes, cigarette butts, and other tobacco products and 84.5 percent of these poisonings were in children ages five and younger; and
- Children who ingest cigarette butts can experience vomiting, nausea, lethargy, and gagging; and

WHEREAS, state law prohibits smoking within 25 feet of playgrounds and tot lots and expressly authorizes local communities to enact additional restrictions; and

WHEREAS, there is broad public recognition of the dangers of secondhand smoke and support for smoke-free air laws, as evidenced by the following:

A 2008 survey of California voters found that 97 percent thought that secondhand smoke is harmful, 88 percent thought secondhand smoke was harmful even outdoors, 65 percent were bothered by secondhand smoke, and 73 percent support laws restricting smoking in outdoor public places; and

WHEREAS, as of April 2014, at least 131 local jurisdictions in California prohibit the use of electronic smoking devices in specific locations; and

WHEREAS, as of January 2015, there are at least 348 California cities and counties with local laws restricting smoking in recreational areas; and

WHEREAS, there is no Constitutional right to smoke;

NOW THEREFORE, it is the intent of the City Council, in enacting this ordinance, to provide for the public health, safety, and welfare by discouraging the inherently dangerous behavior of smoking and tobacco use around non-tobacco users, especially children; by protecting the public from exposure to secondhand smoke where they live, work, and play; by reducing the potential for children to wrongly associate smoking and tobacco use with a healthy lifestyle; and by affirming and promoting a healthy environment in the City of Selma.

SECTION II. Chapter 29 is added to Section VI of the Selma Municipal Code to read as follows:

"6-29-1 DEFINITIONS. The following words and phrases, whenever used in this Chapter shall have the meanings defined in this section unless the context clearly requires otherwise:

- (a) "Electronic Smoking Device" means an electronic device that can be used to deliver an inhaled dose of nicotine, or other substances, including any component, part, or accessory of such a device, whether or not sold separately. "Electronic Smoking Device" includes any such device, whether manufactured, distributed, marketed, or sold as an electronic cigarette, an electronic cigar, an electronic cigarillo, an electronic pipe, an electronic hookah, or any other product name or descriptor.
- (b) "Public Place" means any place, publicly or privately owned, which is open to the general public regardless of any fee or age requirement.
- (c) "Reasonable Distance" means a distance of twenty-five (25) feet in any direction from an area in which Smoking is prohibited.
- (d) "Recreational Area" means any area that is owned, controlled or used by the City of Selma and open to the general public for recreational purposes, regardless of any fee or age requirement. The term "Recreational Area" includes but is not limited to parks, picnic areas, playgrounds, sports fields, golf courses, walking paths, gardens, hiking trails, bike paths, riding trails, swimming pools, roller- and ice-skating rinks, skateboard parks, amusement parks, and beaches. The term "Recreational Area" shall also include Pioneer Village.
- (e) "Smoke" means the gases, particles, or vapors released into the air as a result of combustion, electrical ignition, or vaporization, when the apparent or usual purpose of the combustion, electrical ignition, or vaporization is human inhalation of the byproducts, except when the combusting or vaporizing material contains no tobacco or nicotine and the purpose of inhalation is solely olfactory, such as, for example, smoke from incense. The term "Smoke" includes, but is not limited to, tobacco smoke, Electronic Smoking Device vapors, cannabis smoke, and crack cocaine smoke.

- (f) "Smoking" means inhaling, exhaling, burning, or carrying any lighted, heated, or ignited cigar, cigarette, cigarillo, pipe, hookah, Electronic Smoking Device, cannabis or any plant product intended for human inhalation.
- (g) "Tobacco Product" means:
 - (1) Any product containing, made, or derived from tobacco or nicotine that is intended for human consumption, whether Smoked, heated, chewed, absorbed, dissolved, inhaled, snorted, sniffed, or ingested by any other means, including, but not limited to cigarettes, cigars, little cigars, chewing tobacco, pipe tobacco, snuff; and
 - (2) Any Electronic Smoking Device.
 - (3) Notwithstanding any provision of subsections (1) and (2) to the contrary, "Tobacco Product" includes any component, part, or accessory intended or reasonably expected to be used with a Tobacco Product, whether or not sold separately. "Tobacco Product" does not include any product that has been approved by the United States Food and Drug Administration for sale as a tobacco cessation product or for other therapeutic purposes where such product is marketed and sold solely for such an approved purpose.
- (h) "Unenclosed Area" means any area that is not an Enclosed Area.

6-29-2 PROHIBITION OF SMOKING AND TOBACCO PRODUCT USE IN UNENCLOSED AREAS

- (a) Smoking and the use of Tobacco Products is prohibited in the Unenclosed Areas of the following places within the City of Selma:
 - (1) Recreational Areas;
 - (2) Other Public Places, when being used for a public event, including but not limited to a farmers' market, parade, craft fair, festival, or any other event open to the general public, provided that Smoking is permitted on streets and sidewalks used only as pedestrian or vehicular thoroughfares, unless otherwise prohibited by this Chapter.
- (b) Nothing in this Chapter prohibits any Person, Employer, or Nonprofit Entity with legal control over any property from prohibiting Smoking and Tobacco Product use on any part of such property, even if Smoking or the use of Tobacco Products is not otherwise prohibited in that area.

6-29-3 REASONABLE SMOKING DISTANCE REQUIRED

- (a) Smoking in all Unenclosed Areas shall be prohibited within a Reasonable Distance from any doorway, window, opening, crack, or vent into an Enclosed Area in which Smoking is prohibited, except while the Person Smoking is actively passing on the way to another destination.
- (b) Smoking in Unenclosed Areas shall be prohibited within a Reasonable Distance from any Unenclosed Areas in which Smoking is prohibited under this Chapter, except while the Person Smoking is actively passing on the way to another destination and provided Smoke does not enter any Unenclosed Area in which Smoking is prohibited.

6-29-4 OTHER REQUIREMENTS AND PROHIBITIONS

- (a) No Person, Employer, or Nonprofit Entity shall knowingly permit Smoking or the use of Tobacco Products in an area which is under the legal or de facto control of that Person, Employer, or Nonprofit Entity and in which Smoking or the use of Tobacco Products is prohibited by law.
- (b) No Person, Employer, or Nonprofit Entity shall knowingly or intentionally permit the presence or placement of ash receptacles, such as, for example, ash trays or ash cans, within an area under the legal or de facto control of that Person, Employer, or Nonprofit Entity and in which Smoking or the use of Tobacco Products is prohibited by law, including, without limitation, within a Reasonable Distance required by this Chapter from any area in which Smoking or the use of Tobacco Products is prohibited. Notwithstanding the foregoing, the presence of ash receptacles in violation of this subsection shall not be a defense to a charge of Smoking or the use of Tobacco Products in violation of any provision of this Chapter.
- (c) No Person shall dispose of used Smoking or Tobacco Product waste within the boundaries of an area in which Smoking or Tobacco Product use is prohibited, including within any Reasonable Distance required by this Chapter.
- (d) Except as otherwise provided by subsection (e) of this section, a Person, Employer, or Nonprofit Entity that has legal or de facto control of an area in which Smoking and the use of Tobacco Products is prohibited by this Chapter shall post a clear, conspicuous and unambiguous "No Smoking" and "No Use of Tobacco Products" or "Smokefree" and "Tobacco-Free" sign at each point of ingress to the area, and in at least one other conspicuous point within the area, unless the prohibition is established by law other than this Chapter and that law does not require the placement of signs. The signs shall

have letters of no less than one inch in height and shall include the international "No Smoking" symbol (consisting of a pictorial representation of a burning cigarette enclosed in a red circle with a red bar across it). Signs posted on the exterior of buildings to comply with this section shall include the Reasonable Distance requirement. At least one sign with the City of Selma phone number to which complaints can be directed must be placed conspicuously in each place in which Smoking is prohibited. For purposes of this section, the City Manager or his/her designee shall be responsible for the posting of signs in regulated facilities owned or leased in whole or in part by the City. Notwithstanding this provision, the presence or absence of signs shall not be a defense to a charge of Smoking or the use of Tobacco Products in violation of any other provision of this Chapter.

- (e) The City, or other sponsor of any Public Event occurring in Open Public Places shall establish temporary signage at such locations as required by the City Manager or his/her designee notifying persons of the prohibition against smoking at such Public Event.
- (f) No Person, Employer, or Nonprofit Entity shall intimidate, threaten any reprisal, or effect any reprisal, for the purpose of retaliating against another Person who seeks to attain compliance with this Chapter.
- (g) Each instance of Smoking or Tobacco Product use in violation of this Chapter shall constitute a separate violation. For violations other than for Smoking, each day of a continuing violation of this Chapter shall constitute a separate violation.

6-29-5 PENALTIES AND ENFORCEMENT.

- (a) The remedies provided by this Chapter are cumulative and in addition to any other remedies available at law or in equity.
- (b) Each incident of Smoking or use of Tobacco Products in violation of this Chapter is an infraction subject to a one hundred dollar (\$100) fine. Other violations of this Chapter may, at the discretion of the City Attorney, be prosecuted as infractions or misdemeanors when the interests of justice so require. Enforcement of this Chapter shall be the responsibility of the City Manager or his / her designee. In addition, any peace officer or code enforcement official also may enforce this Chapter.
- (c) Each incident of Smoking or use of Tobacco Products in violation of this Chapter, and the fine imposed by this Chapter may be enforced by issuance of an Administrative Citation under Chapter 20 of Title I of this Code.

- (d) Violations of this Chapter are subject to a civil action brought by the City of Selma, punishable by a civil fine not less than two hundred fifty dollars (\$250) and not exceeding one thousand dollars (\$1,000) per violation.
- (e) Causing, permitting, aiding, abetting, or concealing a violation of any provision of this Chapter shall also constitute a violation of this Chapter.
- (f) Any violation of this Chapter is hereby declared to be a nuisance.
- (g) In addition to other remedies provided by this Chapter or by other law, any violation of this Chapter may be remedied by a civil action brought by the City Attorney, including, but not limited to, administrative or judicial nuisance abatement proceedings, civil or criminal code enforcement proceedings, and suits for injunctive relief.

SECTION III. Effective date and Posting of Ordinance: This Ordinance shall take effect and be enforce thirty (30) days from and after the date of passage. The City Clerk of the City of Selma shall cause this Ordinance to be published at least once within fifteen (15) days after its passage in the Selma Enterprise with the names of those City Council Members voting for and against the Ordinance.

SECTION IV.: Severability: If any section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance is for any reason held to be invalid or unconstitutional, the decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of the Ordinance. The City Council hereby declares that it would have passed this Ordinance, and each section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase thereof, irrespective of the fact that any one or more sections, subsections, sentences, clauses or phrases have been declared invalid or unconstitutional.

SUBJECT: Consideration and Necessary Action on Resolution Directing Removal of Illegal Advertising Display Sign at 1506 Second Street, Selma, California and Assessing the Cost of Such Removal as a Lien Against the Property.

DISCUSSION:

There is a sign, commonly known as a freeway sign because it is visible from Highway 99 that has been abandoned or is not maintained or not used to identify or advertise any ongoing business and that has not been used for that purpose for a period of less than 90 days prior to April 10, 2018. The provisions of the Business and Professions Code, coupled with the City's Summary Abatement of Nuisances Ordinance allows the City Manager to declare an illegal advertising display to be a public nuisance and to require the owner to remove the sign. Under the provisions of the City's ordinances and under Business and Professions Code Section 5499.1, in the event the property owner fails to remove the sign in response to that notice, the City, or a contractor retained by the City, can remove the sign following the giving of a specified amount of notice of a hearing before the City Council to authorize the City to remove the sign and to assess the cost of doing so against the property as a lien until it is paid.

The owner of the property at the above location was notified initially on February 22, 2018, of the need to remove the sign. After failing to do so, the City served a formal notice under Business and Professions Code Section 5499.1 in the manner prescribed by that section on the property owner and further notified the property owner that a decision would be made at the time and place of this meeting whether City forces should be authorized to remove the Sign and to assess the cost of doing so against the property as a lien. The property owner had the ability and notice of the need to remove the sign, and the consequences of the failure to do so for almost a month. The sign has not been removed.

WHEREAS, formal notice to remove the illegal advertising display was given on April 10, 2018, and setting a public hearing before this Council for the purpose of determining whether the illegal advertising display shall be removed by City forces and the cost of such removal be placed as a lien against the property from which the sign is removed; and

WHEREAS, on May 7, 2018, the Council did conduct a public hearing pursuant to the Notice to Remove Illegal Advertising Display served April 10, 2018, a copy of which is attached to this resolution.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved as follows:

1. The foregoing recitals are true and correct.

2. The illegal advertising display located upon the property identified in this resolution constitutes a public nuisance and must be abated by removal of the illegal display and the property owner or other person responsible for doing so has failed to do so after receiving the notice prescribed by law.

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3. The illegal advertising display located on the aforementioned property shall be removed by City forces, or a contractor retained by the City to do so, and the cost of that removal shall be assessed against the property as a lien which will remain on the property until paid in full.

DISCUSSION:

There is a sign, commonly known as a freeway sign because it is visible from Highway 99 that has been abandoned or is not maintained or not used to identify or advertise any ongoing business and that has not been used for that purpose for a period of less than 90 days prior to April 10, 2018. The provisions of the Business and Professions Code, coupled with the City's Summary Abatement of Nuisances Ordinance allows the City Manager to declare an illegal advertising display to be a public nuisance and to require the owner to remove the sign. Under the provisions of the City's ordinances and under Business and Professions Code Section 5499.1, in the event the property owner fails to remove the sign in response to that notice, the City, or a contractor retained by the City, can remove the sign following the giving of a specified amount of notice of a hearing before the City Council to authorize the City to remove the sign and to assess the cost of doing so against the property as a lien until it is paid.

The owner of the property at the above location was notified initially on February 22, 2018, of the need to remove the sign. After failing to do so, the City served a formal notice under Business and Professions Code Section 5499.1 in the manner prescribed by that section on the property owner and further notified the property owner that a decision would be made at the time and place of this meeting whether City forces should be authorized to remove the Sign and to assess the cost of doing so against the property as a lien. The property owner had the ability and notice of the need to remove the sign, and the consequences of the failure to do so for almost a month. The sign has not been removed.

WHEREAS, on May 7, 2018, the Selma City Council, at a regularly scheduled public hearing, considered a General Plan Amendment 2017-0001 and Mitigated Negative Declaration (SCH# E201510000283) as part of submittal no. 2013-52 with other concurrent applications by Emery Vlotho. The proposal is to amend the Land Use Designation of + 6.35 acres of land located on the Northeast corner of McCall and Dinuba Avenues, Selma, CA (APN: 358-021-17); and

WHEREAS, the concurrent applications include a Zone Change from R2 & R3 to C3, Parcel Map with related site development, and Dinuba-McCall V5 Reorganization/Annexation; and

WHEREAS, the City Council conducted a public hearing, noticed in accordance with all applicable state and local laws, and considered the proposal and the staff report and recommendations together with all public testimony of interested parties; and

WHEREAS, per the Public Resources Code, Section 21080.1, Division 13, California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), the City of Selma, as lead agency, is responsible for determining whether an environmental impact report, a negative declaration, or a mitigated negative declaration shall be required; and

WHEREAS, the City Council conducted a public hearing as heretofore specified and considered the Environmental Assessment (SCH# E201510000283), which resulted in a proposed mitigated negative declaration, the proposal, and the staff report together with all public testimony of interested parties prior to finalizing their decision regarding the certification of the mitigated negative declaration; and

WHEREAS, the City Council considered the scope of the proposal, reviewed the evidence and determined that General Plan Amendment No. 2017-0001 will not have a significant impact on the environment; and

WHEREAS, changes to the project (Mitigation Measures) have been made conditions of approval to mitigate or avoid significant environmental effects, and a program for reporting on and monitoring those changes (the Mitigation Monitoring Program) has been prepared in conformance with CEQA Guidelines § 15074(d); and WHEREAS, based on substantial evidence provided in the Initial Study and the whole record before the City Council for Environmental Assessment No. 2013-52 and public comments related to the project, it has been determined that there is no possibility this project may have any significant effects on the environment. - 4. The area proposed to be zoned C3 (Commercial Services) upon annexation to the City of Selma and the Selma-Kingsburg-Fowler County Sanitation District is consistent with the orderly physical development and the health, safety, and general welfare of the City. The project includes appropriate measures which make the land use compatible with the area.
- 5. The design of the parcel map or the type of improvements will not conflict with easements, acquired by the public at large, for access through or use of property within the proposed subdivision.
- 6. 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ORDINANCE NO. 2018-___R

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING TITLE XI, CHAPTER 2, SECTION 2 OF THE SELMA MUNICIPAL CODE REGARDING THE ZONING MAP BOUNDARIES OF THE CITY OF SELMA

WHEREAS, the Zoning Boundaries Map for the City of Selma is provided for in Title XI, Chapter 2 of the Selma Municipal Code; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Selma desires to amend the Zoning Boundaries Map to prezone property ("Property") hereinafter described and currently zoned AE-20 (Agriculture Exclusive) by the County of Fresno to the C-3 (Commercial Services) district zoning which shall become effective upon annexation of the Property to the City of Selma; and

WHEREAS, the Property being prezoned is located on the north side of Dinuba Avenue between McCall and Duke Avenues, Selma, CA (APN 358-021-17); and

WHEREAS, the Property (APN 358-021-17 6.35 acres being prezoned C-3 and is consistent with the General Plan Land Use Designation; and

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SELMA DOES HEREBY ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

1. BOUNDARIES: The Zoning Boundaries Map for the City of Selma, as provided under Title XI, Chapter 2 of the Selma Municipal Code is hereby amended to prezone the subject Property to C-3.

2. ZONING BOUNDARIES MAP: Section 1 of Chapter 2 of Title XI of the Selma Municipal Code is amended to read as follows:

"11-2-2: ZONING BOUNDARIES MAP: A copy of the Zoning Boundaries Map, as amended from time to time, shall be filed in the Office of the Community Development Department of the City of Selma. A copy shall also be filed with the City Clerk of the City of Selma."

3. REQUIRED NOTICE: Notice as required herein above shall be given in accordance with Section 36933 of the Government Code of the State of California.

4. CALIFORNIA ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY ACT: The Selma City Council having considered Environmental Assessment No. 2013-52 prepared for Zone Change No. 2013-52, Parcel Map No. 2013-52, and Reorganization/Annexation ("Project") determined that the project does not have the potential to result in a significant adverse impact on the environment. The 2035 General Plan Environmental Impact Report approved which reflects the independent judgment and analysis of the entire record heretofore presented to the City Council.

5. SEVERABILITY: If any section, subsection, clause or phrase of this Ordinance is for any reason held to be invalid or unconstitutional, the decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of the Ordinance. The City Council hereby declares that it would have passed this Ordinance, and each section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase thereof, irrespective of the fact that any one or more sections, subsections, sentences, clauses or phrases have been declared invalid or unconstitutional.

6. EFFECTIVE DATE: Ordinance shall take effect thirty (30) days after adoption by the City Council of the City of Selma.



Selma's census tract is not over concentration, but due to the overall high concentration for the County of Fresno, a Public Convenience determination is required. This site once had a valid Type 20 license, so approval will not affect Selma's standing in regards to over concentration in Selma.

POLICE DEPARTMENT BI-WEEKLY COUNCIL UPDATE (4/16/18 – 5/4/18)

Crime Trends

 Although overall crime rose by 3% over the last 28 days, fueled by a significant increase in Auto Theft (11 vs 23), violent crime, since the beginning of "Operation Blue Shield" has fallen by 48%. There were no reported robberies (4 the previous month) and only two (2) reported domestic violence incidents. Auto theft and vehicle burglary rose, with twelve (12) more vehicles stolen, and six (6) additional vehicle burglaries reported during this time frame. Burglary also rose slightly, from seven (7) the previous month to ten (10) over the last 28 days.

SIGNIFICANT CALLS FOR SERVICE

- On 04/19/18, at approximately 1:50am, officers were dispatched to 2039 Merced Street, in regard to a male subject brandishing a firearm. Upon arrival, the victim said a subject, who they were able to identify, had broken a window at this location and forced entry into the residence, brandishing a firearm. The victim said the suspect was looking for his girlfriend. The suspect fled the residence prior to officers' arrival. The victim described the firearm as being a black semi-automatic handgun.
- On 04/20/18, at approximately 2:50am, an officer initiated a vehicle stop on a vehicle swerving all over the road way at north bound 99 from Floral Avenue. The driver, from Selma, was arrested for DUI. The officer searched the suspect and located an empty holster attached to his belt. Officers searched the suspect's vehicle and located a .45 caliber handgun on the front floor board of the vehicle (no CCW). The suspect was charged with possession of the weapon (no CCW permit) as well as the DUI charge.
