

Global Active Cases:

Four Stage Plan



STAGE 1: Safety and preparedness

Make workplaces safe for our essential workers.

STAGE 2: Lower-risk workplaces

Gradually reopen retail (curbside only), manufacturing & logistics. Later, relax retail restrictions, adapt & reopen schools, child care, offices & limited hospitality, personal services.

STAGE 3: Higher-risk workplaces

Adapt and reopen movie theaters, religious services, & more personal & hospit ality services. Reopen areas of highest risk: e.g. Concerts, conventions, sports arenas.

What does that mean?

Residents

Still encouraged to wear masks

- Limit unnecessary travel, shopping and exposure to other residents
 - Limit inter-county/city travel (especially with variances)
- Recommending no gatherings
- Participate in recreation activities only with members of your own household

Early Stage 2

Stay at home orders are still in effect with modifications.

Below businesses **can be open with modifications**. The state has issued guidance to help these workplaces reopen safely:

- retail (curbside and delivery only)
- related logistics and manufacturing
- office workplaces (telecommuting still recommended)
- limited services
- outdoor museums, botanical gardens
- essential businesses that did not choose to be open previously

How to Open

Businesses may use effective alternative or innovative methods to build upon the guidelines. Before reopening, all facilities **<u>must</u>**:

- Perform a detailed risk assessment and implement a site-specific protection plan
- Train employees on how to limit the spread of COVID-19, including how to screen themselves for symptoms and stay home if they have them
- Implement individual control measures and screenings
- Implement disinfecting protocols
- Implement physical distancing guidelines

What is not Open?

Everything else. The following sectors, businesses, establishments, or activities are **not permitted** to operate in the State of California at this time:

- Personal services such as hair and nail salons, tattoo parlors, gyms and fitness studios
- Hospitality services, such as bars, wineries, tasting rooms and lounges
- Entertainment venues, such as movie theaters, gaming, libraries
- Community centers, public pools, playgrounds, and picnic areas

- Religious services and cultural ceremonies*
 Nightclubs
- Concert venues
- Live audience sports
- Festivals
- Theme parks
- Hotels/lodging for leisure and tourism


*As related to gatherings and close contact situations. Online services are recommended. County has guidance on Drive-in style services.

Late Stage 2

Relax retail restrictions, adapt and reopen schools, child care, offices and limited hospitality and personal services.

This list is flexible and can change with evaluation from the State

The County will need to provide a self attestation to move into the next stage more quickly (County Variance)



County Variance

- ► Meet Readiness Criteria→ progress quicker in State Roadmap
- File County Self Attestation (County letter sent on 5/15)
- Open the state/County in a way that minimizes the risk for COVID-19
 - Limiting non-essential movement and mixing of populations
 - Delaying the opening of environments of high risk to exposure

State is the lead on reopening. Lives lost, longer recovery, revocation of licenses for businesses and denied funding for cities are all potential risks for opening too early.




County Readiness Criteria

- No more than 25 COVID-19 cases per 100,000 residents in the past 14 days, or less than 8% "test positivity rate" in last 14 days (Fresno: 567 new cases in last 14 days)
- 2) No more than 5% increase in **hospitalizations** in the last 7 days (average)
- 3) Guidance for employers and essential critical infrastructure workplaces
- 4) Availability of supplies (disinfectant, essential protective gear) to protect essential workers.
- 5) Minimum daily testing volume to test 1.5 per 1,000 residents
- Testing availability for at least 75% of residents
- 7) Sufficient contact tracing

- 8) Availability of temporary housing units to shelter at least 15% of county residents experiencing homelessness
- 9) County (or regional) hospital capacity to accommodate a surge in cases
- 10) County (or regional) hospital facilities have a robust plan to protect the hospital workforce, both clinical and nonclinical, with PPE.
- 11) Skilled nursing facilities (SNF) have >14 day supply of PPE on hand for staff
- 12) Sectors and timelines
- 13) Triggers for adjusting/reinstate modifications
- 14) Detailed plan for moving through Stage 2
- 15) Recommended Containment Plan


Local Statistics






Still have education to do:


