Trash and Recycling

16 Buddtown Road open for recycling from 9 am to 3 pm, Monday through Friday. The first Saturday of the month from 8 am to 12 noon is trash drop off day – no construction material or metal will be accepted.

Trash cans should not be more than **45** gallons and must have a **detached** lid. Trash in can should weigh no more than **65** pounds. The bags should not weigh more than **50** pounds. Trash should be placed on the curb after 6 pm on the previous day. No more than 5 pieces of trash at one time – including 1 piece of furniture. No metal or electronics will be collected.

Take a walk on the wild side right here in Southampton



Eagle Walk is located right off 46 Mill Street, Vincentown, Burlington County, NJ -The walk takes about 1 hour and covers 1.7 trail miles. You can see the creek along the way. It is not a difficult walk so bring the children. Terrain is creek and

woodlands.

There is a small parking

lot for your convenience. After your walk, consider having a picnic at the Vincentown Mill Pond.

The Vincentown Mill Pond

The Vincentown Mill Pond has long been the centerpiece of the community of Vincentown. The creation of an early saw mill and grist mill along the South Branch of the Rancocas was essential to the growth and development of Vincentown. On December 2, 2005, a formal ribbon cutting ceremony was held to celebrate the opening of a



new \$2.5M dam and bridge on Race Street in Vincentown. A previous temporary dam, which the new structure replaced, was constructed in 1996 after the earlier dam failed in 1994. That dam had originally been constructed in 1891, with the main spillway being constructed in 1919. Reconstruction of that dam took place in 1924. The 1996 reconstruction was not without controversy. Some citizens felt that the reconstruction of the dam was an unnecessary expense. Other citizens argued for the historic, recreational, health, safety, ecological, and economic value of the dam to the community, and set up a citizen's committee to ensure that the dam would be restored. The temporary dam of 1996 is what resulted. The new Race Street dam and bridge opened in 2005.
