#### **New Procedure for Brush and Branch Removal**

With the increase in gas/diesel prices and the cost of operating equipment, it is necessary to change the township's process for branch and brush removal. Brush/Branches will only be picked up on the following months: **April**, **June and October**. You must call 609 859-2736 to be place on a list for brush/branch to be picked up on those months. You can take the brush/branch to Artistic Landscaping and there will be a fee for services.

#### **Leaf Collection**

Leaves will be picked up in bags only. Do <u>not</u> rake to the curb. Leaves will be picked up from <u>November 1 to</u> <u>February 28</u>. You must call 609 859-2736 to be placed on a pick up list. No more than 10 bags of leaves will be picked up. If the leaves are in the trash, your trash will NOT be picked up.

### Affordable New Jersey Communities for Homeowners and Renters (ANCHOR)

ANCHOR replaces the <u>Homestead Benefit</u> program.

This program provides property tax relief to New Jersey residents who owned or rented their principal residence (main home) on October 1, 2019, and met the income limits.

#### Filing options will be available mid-September. Check back for updates.

#### Homeowners

You are considered a homeowner if, on October 1, 2019, you:

- Owned a house.
- Owned a condominium and paid property taxes on your unit;
- Were a resident shareholder of a cooperative housing complex;
- Were a resident of a continuing care retirement community and your continuing care contract requires you to pay the proportionate share of property taxes attributable to your unit.

You **do not qualify** if your residence was completely exempt from paying property taxes or you made P.I.L.O.T. (Payments-in-Lieu-of-Tax) payments.

#### Tenants (New)

You are considered a tenant if, on October 1, 2019, you:

- Rented an apartment, condominium, or house;
- Rented or owned a mobile home located in a mobile home park.

You do not qualify if you lived in tax-exempt, subsidized, or campus housing

#### **CLOGGED PIPES AND THE DAMAGE THEY DO!**



Vincentown has seen an increase damages in the sewer system to the pipes and check valves. These are costly repairs and may increase your sewer bills. Please help prevent clogging by following a few simple suggestions.

In order to prevent the above from happening, here are

a few tips to remember:

- 1. Only toilet paper and human waste should be flushed down a toilet.
- 2. Wipes and diapers are too bulky and can easily cause a blockage.
- 3. Used in moderate amounts, toilet paper should not cause any issues, but used in excess, it can cause clogs. Quilted toilet paper can be particularly bad for creating blockages.



4. Children's toys can also cause blockages if flushed down the toilet.



- 5. Hair can build up
- 6. Soap some are made from grease or fat
- 7. Dirt can also cause clogged drains.
- 8. FOOD WASTE Food waste should never go down the drain, even when you have a garbage disposal in your sink. Instead, set up a composting pile to get rid of food waste.

With so many causes of clogged drains, the best way to fix them is to prevent them from being clogged in the first place. Never put anything you shouldn't down the drain and avoid trying to clear drains by adding more chemicals or objects. And if your clogged drains turn into an emergency requiring help call an experienced plumber.

A clogged drain can cause slow water drainage, corrosion, flooding, and, in extreme cases, sewage backup and costly repairs.



Similar to training the public in hands-only CPR, Stop the Bleed training is designed to encourage people to learn the skills necessary to save someone's life with the emphasis on how to stop traumatic bleeding. The class is 45 minutes, simple life-saving information.



#### Facts:

- · Uncontrolled bleeding is a major cause of preventable deaths
- Average time to bleed out: 2 to 5 minutes
- · Average time for 1st responders to arrive: 7 to 10 minutes
- · Bystanders can fill the gap with STOP THE BLEED
