6F. AGREEMENT WITH CAMP FIRE INLAND TO OFFER OUT-OF-SCHOOL TIME YOUTH PROGRAMMING CONSULTING SERVICES

The City was awarded a five-year Families and Communities Together (FaCT) Grant to offer programs and services at the Stanton Community Services Center, with the assistance of the approved four funded partners. One of the funded partners, Camp Fire OC, merged with Camp Fire Inland creating a name change in the original proposal and subsequently signed and agreed upon FaCT contract. However, there are no changes to the programmatic and budgetary funds of the original proposal. As a result, the status of Camp Fire Inland changed from a funded partner to a professional consultant within the FaCT Grant under the advisement of County Contract Services.

There is no change in the grant funding or any additional costs to the City.

- 1. The City Council declared that the project is exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act ("CEQA") under Section 15061(b)(3) as the activity is covered by the general rule that CEQA applies only to projects which have the potential for causing significant effect on the environment. Where is can be seen with certainty that there is no possibility that the activity in question may have a significant effect on the environment, the activity is not subject to CEQA, and
- Authorized the City Manager to sign a professional consultant services agreement with Camp Fire Inland for the duration of this fiscal year not to exceed \$5,200 and up to three additional one year terms not to exceed \$11,600 per year, per the FaCT grant funds.

6G. EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT PERFORMANCE GRANT

The Orange County Sheriff's Department was awarded the Emergency Management Performance Grant (EMPG) FY15-16, from the California Governor's Office of Emergency Services (CalOES). Included in this grant is a sub award for the City in the amount of \$5,821. The EMPG grant is intended to assist local agencies in executing the Orange County OA's Emergency Operations Plan (EOP). The grant performance period is July 1, 2015 through June 30, 2016.

The City Council declared that the project is exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act ("CEQA") under Section 15061(b)(3) as the activity is covered by the general rule that CEQA applies only to projects which have the potential for causing significant effect on the environment. Where is can be seen with certainty that there is no possibility that the activity in question may have a significant effect on the environment, the activity is not subject to CEQA, and
- 2. Approved the County of Orange Governing Body Resolution Form and Addendum authorizing the City Manager to execute the agreement and other documents required by the County of Orange for participation in the EMPG program on behalf of the City Council.

6H. RESOLUTION AMENDING THE STANTON CRIMINAL BACKGROUND CHECK PROCESS

The attached Resolution makes changes to the current background check procedures by allowing the City to also access federal level criminal history information as opposed to only state level criminal history information.

APPROVAL OF A COOPERATION AND CONTRIBUTION MAINTENANCE AGREEMENT FOR THE NEW TRAFFIC SIGNAL AT THE INTERSECTION OF MAGNOLIA AVENUE AND WINSTON ROAD

REPORT IN BRIEF:

The City of Anaheim recently constructed a new traffic signal at the intersection of Magnolia Avenue and Winston Road. One corner of the intersection is within the City of Stanton. The attached agreement allocates 25% of the costs for ongoing maintenance to be paid for by the City of Stanton.

RECOMMENDED ACTION:

- City Council declare this project to be categorically exempt under the California Environmental Quality Act, Class 1, and Section 15301(c); and
- 2. Approve the attached agreement titled "Cooperation and Contribution Agreement for Energy and Maintenance of Traffic Signal and Safety Lighting".

BACKGROUND:

On November 17, 2015, the City of Anaheim completed construction on the Magnolia Avenue and Winston Road Traffic Signal Safe Route to School Project. The scope of work included the installation of a new traffic signal near Magnolia High School at the intersection of Magnolia Avenue and Winston Road, including traffic signal poles, signal heads, signal controller, and cabinet, conduit, pull boxes, conductors, accessible pedestrian signals, fiber optic communication facilities, traffic signing and striping, and installation of associated electronic equipment. This project improved the safety and efficient movement of vehicular and pedestrian traffic through Magnolia Avenue at Winston Road.

ANALYSIS/JUSTIFICATION:

It is common for intersections to be within two different jurisdictions and shared

maintenance agreements are very common to allocate the ongoing costs. Out of the 19 other signals within the City, 12 of them have similar agreements. Many of these are the intersections along Beach Boulevard in which Caltrans takes the lead on maintenance and then bills the City.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The costs for maintenance are minor in nature. For several similar intersections in size such as Knott/Cerritos and Katella/Magnolia the annual costs for these intersections have been approximately \$750 for the previous 12 months.

ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT:

This project was categorically exempt under the California Environmental Quality Act, Class 1, and Section 15301(c).

LEGAL REVIEW:

The City Attorney has determined that this agreement must be approved by the City Council.

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, ANAHEIM and STANTON desire to install a traffic signal and highway safety lighting (hereinafter "SIGNAL"), at the intersection of Magnolia Avenue and Winston Road; and

WHEREAS, portions of that intersection are within ANAHEIM and STANTON respectfully; and

WHEREAS, the ANAHEIM is willing to pay one hundred percent (100%) of the costs of construction of SIGNAL and share in the cost to operate and maintain the SIGNAL once constructed (hereinafter referred to as the "Project").

NOW, THEREFORE, FOR AND IN CONSIDERATION OF THE PROMISES, COVENANTS AND CONDITIONS HEREIN CONTAINED, THE PARTIES HERETO AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

I. <u>DESIGN AND CONSTRUCTION</u>

1. ANAHEIM shall:

- A. Prepare the detailed plans, specifications and estimate for the Project. The SIGNAL shall include a fully-actuated, solid state, modular controller and will be interconnected with the adjacent system of signal controllers.
- B. Have jurisdiction, during the period of construction, over the construction area at the intersection, including that portion within STANTON.
- C. Be designated as the contracting and construction agent for the parties to do and perform all acts necessary or required in order to construct the Project in accordance with the plans and specifications, including material control, inspection of the construction work, and to execute and deliver all documents necessary or required in connection with the construction and completion of said Project, including notice of final inspection, certificate of day labor, equipment and material cost, and certification of completion of the Project.
- D. Include in the Project all reasonable remedial measures required by STANTON. Such measures shall be in writing and delivered to ANAHEIM, prior to ANAHEIM's acceptance of the contract work.
- E. Be designated responsible agency pursuant to the California Environmental Quality Act ("CEQA").
 - F. Pay for all design and construction costs of the Project.

2. STANTON shall:

- A. Approve plans and specifications as to design and construction features affecting the construction, operation, and maintenance of that portion of the Project in STANTON, which approval shall not unreasonably be withheld.
- B. At all times, during construction of the Project, have access to the work for the purpose of inspection thereof, and should STANTON deem any remedial measures to be necessary prior to ANAHEIM's acceptance of the work, STANTON shall notify ANAHEIM thereof in writing.

II. MUTUAL RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE PARTIES

- 1. The Parties agree to the following mutual responsibilities:
- A. The Parties shall cooperate and coordinate their staff, contractors, consultants, in providing the services and responsibilities required under this Agreement to the extent practicable with respect to the performance of the Project.
- B. The Parties agree to work together in good faith, using reasonable efforts to resolve any unforeseen issues and disputes arising out of the performance of this Agreement.
- C. This Agreement may only be modified or amended upon written mutual consent of all Parties. All modifications, amendments, changes and revisions of this Agreement in whole or in part, and from time to time, shall be binding upon the Parties, so long as the same shall be in writing and executed by the Parties.
- D. This Agreement shall be governed by all applicable federal, state and local laws Parties warrant that in the performance of this Agreement, each shall comply with all applicable federal, state and local laws, statutes and ordinances and all lawful orders, rules and regulations promulgated thereunder.

III. MAINTENANCE

ANAHEIM shall maintain said SIGNAL and intersection safety lighting in operation after such installation. However, the maintenance and operation costs thereof shall be borne by the parties hereto as follows: seventy-five percent (75%) borne by ANAHEIM and twenty-five percent (25%) borne by STANTON. ANAHEIM shall invoice STANTON for STANTON'S 25% share of the costs once each month and STANTON shall pay ANAHEIM within thirty (30) days following receipt of said invoice. Costs shall include regular monthly maintenance, emergency maintenance, extraordinary maintenance, replacements and electrical power.

IV. GENERAL PROVISIONS

A. Neither STANTON nor any officer or employee thereof shall be responsible for any damage or liability occurring by reason of anything done or omitted to be done by ANAHEIM under or in connection with any work, authority, or jurisdiction delegated to

ANAHEIM under this AGREEMENT. Pursuant to Government Code Section 895.4, ANAHEIM shall fully indemnify and hold STANTON harmless from liability imposed for injury (as defined by Government Code Section 810.8) occurring by reason of anything done and omitted to be ANAHEIM under or in connection with any work, authority, or jurisdiction delegated to ANAHEIM under this AGREEMENT.

- B. Neither ANAHEIM nor any officer or employee thereof shall be responsible for any damage or liability occurring by reason of anything done or omitted to be done by STANTON under or in connection with any work, authority, or jurisdiction that has hereby assumed by STANTON and not delegated to ANAHEIM under this AGREEMENT. Pursuant to Government Code Section 895.4, STANTON shall fully indemnify and hold ANAHEIM harmless from liability imposed for injury (as defined by Government Code Section 810.8) occurring by reason of anything done and omitted to be STANTON under or in connection with any work, authority, or jurisdiction that has hereby been assumed by STANTON under this AGREEMENT.
- C. All contractors providing services for the Project shall designate both STANTON and ANAHEIM as additional insureds as their interests may appear on insurance applicable to the Project, and shall agree to defend, indemnify and hold STANTON and ANAHEIM harmless from any and all liability arising out of or incident to the completion of the Project. ANAHEIM, as lead agency, shall verify that the requirements of this Section are satisfied.
- D. ANAHEIM and STANTON shall maintain a complete set of records in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles. Upon reasonable notice, the Parties shall permit the authorized representatives of the Parties to inspect and audit all work, materials, payroll, books, accounts, and other data and records for a period of four (4) years after final payment, or until any on-going audit is completed. For purposes of audit, the date of completion of this Agreement shall be the date of ANAHEIM's payment of STANTON'S final billing (so noted on the invoice), if applicable, under this Agreement. The Parties shall have the right to reproduce any such books, records, and accounts.

E. This writing constitutes the entire agreement and understanding between the parties with respect to the subject matter hereof, and supersedes all oral or written representations or written agreements which may have been entered into between the parties.

If any provision of this Agreement shall be held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect the other provisions hereof, and to this extent, the provisions of this Agreement are intended to be and shall be deemed severable. The Parties shall agree, if reasonably practicable, upon provisions which are equivalent from an economic point of view to replace any provision which is determined to be invalid.

- F. This Agreement shall be governed and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of California.
- G. This Agreement shall commence on the effective date as set forth below. This Agreement shall automatically terminate as to all parties sixty (60) days after any party has given written notice, by mail or personal delivery, to all the other parties. Notice shall be complete when received in the offices of the respective City Clerks of all the other parties.
- H. Any notice sent by first class mail, postage paid, to the address and addressee, shall be deemed to have been given when in the ordinary course it would be delivered. This would exempt them from normal fees and allow them to operate as a church located at 10591 Flower. In addition, the Planning Commission has granted them a Conditional Use Permit (C73-4) to operate as church with the R-M (Medium Density Residential) Zone, located at 10591 Flower Street.

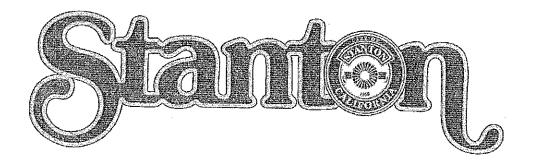

SECTION 1. The Planning Commission does hereby find and determine that an application was duly filed by Rev. W. S. Dunn of the Metaphysical Fellowship Church with respect to the real property described as follows:

Lots 22 and 23, Block 12 of the Stanton Townsite tract as recorded in Book 8, Page 11, Miscellaneous Maps; also identified as Assessor's Parcel No. 79-334-7, and 10591 Flower Street, Stanton;

- No activities shall be conducted outside the building, or a congregating of groups of people outside of the building.
- All other City and State Codes, except as specifically waived by this application, concerning the physical church structure, shall be adhered to.

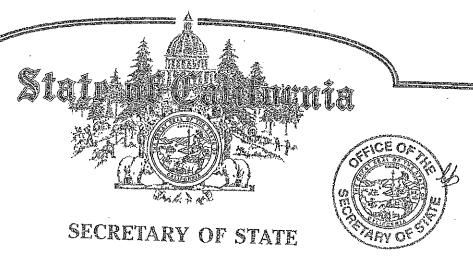

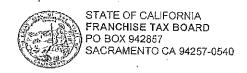

Pastor Sanchez, 3352 Glenholy Dr., Anaheim, stated their congregation is rapidly growing and in need of more room. They are presently holding services in the Stanton Community Hall. They wish to bring the mobile classroom onto the property for one or one and one-half years, thus prolonging the time they can acquire more land to expand their facilities. He described the trailer as 10' x 25', divided into two rooms to be used only for Sunday School classrooms.

Chairman Romagnino stated he is reluctant to allow the use of mobile classrooms, however, if granted, he feels it should be only for one year, at which time any extention could be considered in light of existing circumstances.

It was the consensus that approval should be for one year, extendable for one additional year, with the maximum set at two years.

Pastor Sanchez was questioned whether the coach would be skirted. He replied that they had not intended to. It was felt that the coach's skirting would enhance the appearance as well as prevent debris from collecting under it.

In discussion of lack of parking provisions, Pastor Sanches stated Foster and Kleiser's lease for their billboard located in their parking lot is up this year and it is the Church's intention to terminate that lease.

There was no one present to speak in opposition to this proposal.

The hearing was closed.

Moved by Rookstool, seconded by Aspinall that the Planning Commission adopt Resolution No. 296 approving Conditional Use Permit No. C-76-1 subject to the following conditions.

ORDINANCE NO. 1048

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF STANTON, ADDING CHAPTER 10.32 TO TITLE 10 OF THE STANTON MUNICIPAL CODE REGARDING PEDESTRIAN CROSSINGS ON BEACH BOULEVARD BETWEEN GARDEN GROVE BOULEVARD AND STARR STREET

WHEREAS, the City of Stanton ("City") is a city organized under the laws of the State of California, with a duty and interest in protecting the public health, safety, and welfare within the City; and

WHEREAS, in 2015, there were eight traffic fatalities in the City, seven of which occurred on Beach Boulevard. A number of those traffic fatalities on Beach Boulevard occurred when pedestrians crossed the roadway outside of a controlled intersection; and

WHEREAS, pedestrian crossings along a busy roadway outside of a controlled intersection pose a health and safety hazard to pedestrians and motorists; and

WHEREAS, Vehicle Code Section 21961 authorizes the City to adopt ordinances prohibiting pedestrians from crossing roadways in areas other than at designated crosswalks; and

WHEREAS, in order to preserve the public health, safety, and welfare, the City wishes to prohibit pedestrians from crossing that portion of Beach Boulevard, between Garden Grove Boulevard and Starr Street, unless the crossing is made at a designated crosswalk.

NOW THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF STANTON DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. <u>Incorporation of Recitals</u>. The City Council hereby finds that all of the foregoing recitals and the staff report presented herewith are true and correct and are hereby incorporated and adopted as findings of the City Council as if fully set forth herein.

SECTION 2. <u>CEQA.</u> The City Council finds that this ordinance is not subject to the California Environmental Quality Act ("CEQA") pursuant to CEQA Guidelines Sections 15060(c)(3) because this activity is not a project as defined by Section 15378 of the CEQA Guidelines, California Code of Regulations, Title 14, Chapter 3, and pursuant to CEQA Guidelines Section 15061(b)(3) because it can be seen with certainty that it will not have a significant effect or physical change to the environment.

SECTION 3. Chapter 10.32. Chapter 10.32 of Title 10 of the Stanton Municipal Code is hereby added to read as follows:

"Chapter 10.32 Pedestrian Crossing

10.32.010 Crosswalks-Use required.

- A. No pedestrian shall cross a roadway other than by a crosswalk on that portion of Beach Boulevard between Garden Grove Boulevard and Starr Street.
- B. Any person violating any provision of this Section 10.32.010 shall be guilty of an infraction, and upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by the applicable fine(s) established by Municipal Code Section 1.10.030 (Punishments)."

SECTION 4. <u>Severability</u>. If any section, subsection, subdivision, sentence, clause, phrase, or portion of this Ordinance for any reason is held to be invalid or unconstitutional by the decision of any court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Ordinance. The City Council hereby declares that it would have adopted this Ordinance, and each section, subsection, subdivision, sentence, clause, phrase, or portion thereof, irrespective of the fact that any one or more sections, subsections, subdivisions, sentences, clauses, phrases, or portions thereof be declared invalid or unconstitutional.

SECTION 5: Location and Custodian of Records. The documents and materials associated with this Resolution that constitute the record of proceedings on which these findings are based are located at Stanton City Hall, 7800 Katella Ave., Stanton, California 90680. The City Clerk is the custodian of the record of proceedings.

SECTION 6. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in full force thirty (30) days from and after its passage. The City Clerk shall certify to the adoption of this Ordinance and cause the same to be posted in the three (3) designated posting places within the City of Stanton within fifteen (15) days after its passage.

SUBJECT: CREATION OF ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT INCENTIVE PROGRAMS

REPORT IN BRIEF:

Requesting authorization to move forward with economic development incentive programs to enhance the City's business environment. This resolution would implement economic development incentive programs for business retention and attraction efforts.

RECOMMENDED ACTION:

- 1. City Council declare that the project is exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act ("CEQA") under Section 15061(b)(3) as the activity is covered by the general rule that CEQA applies only to projects which have the potential for causing significant effect on the environment. Where it can be seen with certainty that there is no possibility that the activity in question may have a significant effect on the environment, the activity is not subject to CEQA; and
- 2. Adopt Resolution No. 2016-08 approving economic development incentive programs for business retention and attraction.

BACKGROUND:

In 2013, the City Council approved an Economic Development Plan for business retention and attraction, which included the development of financial assistance programs to entice businesses to expand and improve their properties. At the time, two programs were created, which included the Improvement Rebate Program and the Fee Deferral Program. Subsequently, the City Council adopted a Strategic Plan in 2015, with a stated goal to enhance and continue economic development programs. With the additional funds generated from the voter referendum for the one cent sales tax, two additional programs are being proposed to provide incentives to improve commercial properties and help implement the Livable Beach Boulevard Mobility Plan.

ANALYSIS/JUSTIFICATION:

The proposed economic development programs have been designed to enhance the City's

business environment by offering a variety of incentives. The objectives of the programs encourage businesses to choose Stanton as a place to open and/or relocate their business, stimulate private investment to strengthen the commercial areas, and encourage local businesses along Beach Boulevard to implement elements of the Livable Beach Boulevard Mobility Plan in an effort to enhance the appearance of the streetscape.

PROGRAM ELIGIBILITY: To be eligible to participate in the incentive programs, the applicant must be the legal property owner(s) of the commercial property to be improved or a new and existing business located within City boundaries. However, only new businesses would be eligible to participate in the Fee Deferral Program. There are certain requirements to qualify and be eligible to participate in the programs, which include: completing an application for the program that is being applied for; existing businesses would need to hold a valid City business license with no outstanding Code or Building and Safety violations; the applicant would have to demonstrate that the project benefits the City through either local job creation, revenue generation, and/or through the provision of needed services.

The following provides a brief description of the full Economic Development Plan. Included is a description of the two proposed and two existing programs:

PROPOSED NEW PROGRAMS:

Exterior/Façade Improvement Rebate Program – The program is designed to stimulate private investment with high quality building improvements that help improve the physical appearance and safety of individual businesses and commercial buildings throughout the City. Through this program, the City shares the cost of improving building exteriors and adding security measures, thereby promoting joint private/public action and investment. These noticeable improvements and safety measures help to attract customers, leverage private investment from owners, and inspire improvements to neighboring buildings.

The program would provide rebates on a first-come, first-served basis. The rebate recipient would be required to provide 50% matching funds. A maximum rebate amount of \$5,000 for single storefront and \$10,000 for multi-tenant buildings would be available to approved property owner(s) or business owner(s) located within City boundaries. Program funds are to be used for exterior building improvements or security measures visible from primary streets and may be utilized to pay for security personnel to protect said improvements for up to one year. City staff must approve architectural plans prior to commencement of work and/or contract prior to hiring security guard services.

Livable Beach Boulevard Mobility Implementation Rebate Program – The City developed the Livable Beach Boulevard Mobility Plan to begin revitalizing the now autooriented corridor. The plan guides the way the City plans and implements new mobility and public realm enhancement projects. The revitalization and beautification of Beach Boulevard requires the complementary participation of the private-sector, through the

establishment and expansion of new retail businesses and the development of new mixed-use projects.

In an effort to proactively revitalize Beach Boulevard and accomplish the implementing actions developed for and identified in the Mobility Plan, this rebate program awards matching funds on a first-come, first-served basis. The rebate recipient would be required to provide 50% matching funds. A maximum amount of \$15,000 is available to each approved property owner(s) or business owner(s) located along Beach Boulevard. Program funds are only to be used for items identified in the Implementing Action Plan within the Livable Beach Boulevard Mobility Plan. City staff must approve architectural plans prior to commencement of work.

EXISTING PROGRAMS PREVIOUSLY IMPLEMENTED:

- Fee Deferral Program This program was implemented in February 2013 and has yet to be utilized. There are significant upfront costs in establishing a business including: the lease/purchase price of the building, construction cost if tenant improvements are needed, equipment costs, and purchase of items to be stocked. To assist in reducing the upfront costs for businesses, this program defers fees for building and planning permits. Qualified fees to be differed include conditional use permit fees, precise plan of development fees, minor precise plan of development, all other planning entitlements, building permit fees, and building plan check fees. Applicants must pay 55% of the fees at the time of the planning entitlement submittal, building plan check, and building permit issuance. The remaining 45% of the fees may be deferred for three years with a simple interest rate (prime rate). As a condition of the request for deferment of fees, the property owner and/or applicant shall provide at least one form of security for the entire amount of fees deferred.
- Improvement Rebate Program This program was implemented on February 2013 and has been utilized eight times. Upon completion of a construction project, the program reimburses Building and Planning permit fees equal to 45% of the dollars spent locally on construction related materials. To qualify, both the improvement project location and business from which materials are purchased from shall be located within City boundaries. The program has been designed to encourage participants to purchase their construction related materials from local City businesses. By reimbursing fees, eligible participants can further invest in their actual improvements and in return stimulate construction by reducing the cost of the project. Monies saved on permit fees can be redirected into property improvements and thereby increase property values, improve neighborhoods, and beautify commercial storefronts.

MARKETING: Program Marketing and outreach to the business community will be through direct mailings, site visits with businesses, City and Stanton Business Alliance websites, social media accounts, press releases with newspapers, City newsletter, public counter handouts, emails, local cable channel, City Hall marquee sign, and other such circulating mediums.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The programs have been previously budgeted for fiscal year 2015-16 and 2016-17. The Exterior/Façade Improvement Rebate Program has been budgeted for \$15,000 for each fiscal year and the Livable Beach Boulevard Mobility Implementation Rebate Program has been budgeted for \$30,000 for each fiscal year. Program funds would come from the Business Relations account (102-4400-610210).

ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT:

In accordance with the requirements of CEQA, this project has been determined to be exempt under Section 15061(b)(3).

RESOLUTION NO. 2016-08

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF STANTON, CALIFORNIA, APPROVING ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT INCENTIVE PROGRAMS

WHEREAS, staff has developed two new economic development incentive programs, which include the Exterior/Façade Improvement Rebate Program and the Livable Beach Boulevard Mobility Implementation Rebate Program; and

WHEREAS, in 2013 the City Council approved an Economic Development Plan for business retention and attraction, which included the Improvement Rebate Program and the Fee Deferral Program; and

WHEREAS, with the additional funds generated from the voter referendum one cent sales tax, two additional programs are being proposed to provide incentives to improve commercial properties and help implement the Livable Beach Boulevard Mobility Plan; and

WHEREAS, the primary objectives of the programs are to encourage businesses to choose Stanton as a place to establish and/or relocate their business, stimulate private investment to strengthen the commercial areas, and encourage local businesses along Beach Boulevard to implement elements of the Livable Beach Boulevard Mobility Plan; and

WHEREAS, the programs would encourage an economic environment where business and employment are created, attracted, and retained; and

WHEREAS, the programs would improve the appearance and safety of commercial complexes in deteriorated conditions; and

WHEREAS, business and economic development can play a key role in providing a balanced economy for a local government; and

WHEREAS, the City has adopted a Strategic Plan that identifies providing a strong local economy as one of the City's top six objectives, and specifically identifies expanding the economic development programs as a key goal and objective.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF STANTON, CALIFORNIA, AS FOLLOWS:

1. <u>Section 1</u>. <u>Incorporation of Recitals</u>. The foregoing recitals are true and correct and are hereby incorporated and made an operative part of this Resolution.

- 2. <u>Section 2</u>. <u>CEQA</u>. The City Council finds that this project is exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act ("CEQA") pursuant to Section 15061(b)(3) as the activity is covered by the general rule that CEQA applies only to projects which have the potential for causing significant effect on the environment. Where it can be seen with certainty that there is no possibility that the activity in question may have a significant effect on the environment, the activity is not subject to CEQA.
- 3. Section 3. Adoption of Programs. The City Council of the City of Stanton hereby adopts the modifications to the Economic Development Plan to provide two new programs, which include the Exterior/Façade Improvement Rebate Program and Livable Beach Boulevard Mobility Implementation Rebate Program. In 2013, the City started an economic development plan to stimulate businesses in the City, and such plan included the Fee Deferral Program and the Improvement Rebate Program. The updated Economic Development Guidelines, which provides the parameters of the City's economic development incentive programs, including the two new programs, is attached as Exhibit "A," and incorporated herein by reference.
- 4. <u>Section 4</u>. <u>Severability</u>. The provisions of this Resolution are severable and if any provision of this Resolution is held invalid, that provision shall be severed from the Resolution and the remainder of this Resolution shall continue in full force and effect, and not be affected by such invalidity.
- 5. <u>Section 5</u>. <u>Effective Date</u>. This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption.
- 6. <u>Section 6</u>. <u>Certification</u>. The Mayor shall sign this Resolution and the City Clerk shall certify to the adoption thereof.

Economic Development Plan Guidelines



ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT PLAN

GUIDELINES

The City of Stanton is committed to supporting the development of vibrant and attractive commercial areas. The City's pro-business environment embraces the philosophy that our economic future and prosperity rely on progressive, mutually beneficial partnerships. Our proactive, business friendly government offers an aggressive combination of resources to businesses considering expanding or relocating into our community. Stanton's Economic Development Plan for Business Retention and Attraction is a multi-faceted approach that has been designed to enhance the City's business environment by offering a variety of incentive programs. Various types of assistance will be available to eligible businesses under the economic development programs. The parameters of the components of each program are set forth below.

PROGRAM OBJECTIVES:

- Encourage businesses to choose Stanton as a place to open or relocate their business.
- Encourage an economic environment where business and employment are created, attracted and retained.
- Stimulate private investment in high quality building improvements that contribute to the overall strength of Stanton's commercial areas.
- Improve the appearance and safety of commercial complexes in deteriorated conditions.
- Encourage local businesses along Beach Boulevard to implement elements of the Livable Beach Boulevard Mobility Plan in an effort to enhance the appearance of the City's streetscape.

Assist with the implementation of the Livable Beach Boulevard Mobility Plan goals, which include: Congestion relief; Efficient movement of people, goods, and services; Safe and healthy communities; Pedestrian, bicycle, and transit mobility and access; Public stakeholder participation; Community input and outreach; Measures to reduce air pollution and greenhouse gas emissions; and Conservation of energy and other natural resources.

PROGRAM LIST:

- Fee Deferral Program;
- Improvement Rebate Program;



- Façade Improvement Rebate Program; and
- Livable Beach Boulevard Mobility Implementation Rebate Program

ELIGIBILITY TO PARTICIPATE:

All businesses applying for the programs shall meet the following requirements to qualify and be eligible to participate:

- All new and existing businesses located within City boundaries are eligible to participate in the programs. However, only new businesses are eligible to participate in the Fee Deferral Program.
- With the exception of the Improvement Rebate Program, residential projects are ineligible from participating. However, commercial/retail components of mixed-use projects may be considered eligible. The City Manager and Community Development Director will have final determination on whether a business is eligible to participate, based on its benefit to Stanton and its impact on City services and infrastructure.
- The applicant must be the legal property owner(s) of the commercial property to be improved or a new or existing business with a current City of Stanton business license. However, business owner(s) must have the property owner(s) consent before any improvements are made. In addition, the application must be signed by the property owner(s). Please note, that the applicant must show adequate documentation to verify property ownership or operation of business.
- Applications will be considered from those planning to purchase a building as well as those that intend to lease a building.
- Existing City businesses must hold a current City business license and must be in compliance with all municipal and building codes and be free of any outstanding violations.
- To participate in the programs, the applicant must provide a project description and indicate how the project would benefit the community through either local job creation, revenue generation, and/or through the provision of needed services.



PROGRAM PROCEDURES:

- Obtaining application. Applications are available at City Hall, as well as the City's website (<u>www.ci.stanton.ca.us</u>) and the Stanton Business Alliance website (<u>www.StantonBusinessAlliance.com</u>).
- 2. Submit project description and application. In order to be considered for funding, a project description and complete application must be submitted and approved prior to the beginning of work. Be sure to provide a detailed description detailing all exterior improvements and an itemized estimate of costs. Be as specific as possible. Project descriptions may contain improvements beyond what would be funded by the grant. If applicable, the application must include conceptual architectural plans.
- 3. **City staff will review applications.** When an application is received, the application will be reviewed by Economic Development staff to determine eligibility.
- 4. City staff will contact applicant to set onsite meeting. After receipt of an application, a meeting with the applicant may be required to obtain more detailed information about the project, discuss the proposed scope of work and determine a timeline for improvements.
- 5. **Determination.** Applicants will be advised within ten (10) working days whether or not the application meets eligibility requirements. If the application is chosen, the applicant will be required to execute an agreement, in a form substantially similar to Attachment "A," with the City in which the applicant agrees to, among other things, receive the City grant and indemnify the City for any damages or claims related to any rehabilitation work and/or improvements made to the property using City grant money. Applicants shall also agree to indemnify the City against any claim or liability arising out of any failure or alleged failure to comply with prevailing wage laws, if prevailing wages are required.
- 6. **Planning and Building approval.** If planning and/or building review are required, the applicant is responsible for submitting plans that meet all municipal and building code requirements.
- 7. **Obtain permits.** The selected construction firm that is selected shall obtain all necessary building permits. The construction firm will also need to provide evidence of a valid City business license or obtain a new business license prior to commencement of work. Building permit final will be held pending an



inspection by Planning Division staff. The applicant shall contact staff to request an inspection of the improvements and to ensure improvements were completed within the approved scope of work.

- 8. **Complete work.** After receiving all required approvals and permits, the applicant shall complete the improvements within twelve (12) months. If necessary, the applicant shall be responsible for contacting City staff to request an extension. Please note, that an extension is not guaranteed.
- 9. **Submit invoices, receipts and proof of payment.** If applicable, the applicant shall save all documentation of the improvements as required and submit to the City within 30 days of project completion or building permit final.

INCENTIVE PROGRAMS:

■ FEE DEFERRAL PROGRAM — Planning and Building Division fees may often be a barrier to the establishment of new businesses. Due to the extent of the fees, entrepreneurs must often acquire loan financing to pay for those fees, and these costs are in addition to the lease/purchase price of the building, construction cost if tenant improvements are needed, equipment costs, and purchase of items to be stocked. To qualify, the applicant must agree to retain the activity being deferred (i.e. planning and/or building division fees such as entitlement application fees and/or permit fees) for the three year term of the deferral being guaranteed. Sale or transfer of the business or the removal of the business from the City of Stanton will constitute a default of the deferral.

Businesses must pay 55% of the fees at the time of the planning entitlement submittal, building plan check, and building permit issuance. The remaining 45% of the fees will be deferred for three years with a simple interest rate. The prime rate is determined by City's Director of Finance. The three years begin on the date of the Certificate of Occupancy. The annual installment payments must be paid off by the third anniversary date of the Certificate of Occupancy. If the date happens to fall on a weekend, the payment must be made on the following work day. Late fees would accrue for late payment and revocation of permits could be considered if payment is three or more months past due. If applicant fails to pay the deferral fees in full before the end of the fifth day after it's due, the applicant will pay the City a late charge of \$50.00, plus \$10.00 for each additional day the deferral remains unpaid. In the event that deferred fees are not paid on or before the time agreed upon or the business leaves



Stanton, the fees will be due and payable in full, less any prior payments. If the fees are not paid as specified, steps will be taken to collect against the security posted.

As a condition of the request for deferment of fees, the property owner(s) and/or applicant will be required to enter into a Security Agreement and provide at least one other form of security for the payment for the entire amount of fees deferred. The Security Agreement will need to be recorded by the property owner(s) and/or applicant in the Office of the County Recorder of Orange County and, shall constitute a lien for the payment of the deferral fees which shall be enforceable against successors in interest to the owner. Other acceptable forms of security would include a letter of credit and/or a UCC lien on machinery, equipment, or other fixtures. Security of payment is required in order to obtain a favorable lien position to assist in ensuring loan repayments. In certain cases, the City Manager and Community Development Director may consider other forms of financial security.

> Fees Eligible For Deferral Consideration:

- Conditional Use Permit Fees;
- Precise Plan of Development Fees;
- Minor Precise Plan of Development;
- Tentative Tract Maps;
- Tentative Parcel Maps;
- Building Permit Fees; and
- Building Plan Check Fees

> Fees Ineligible For Deferral Consideration:

- School Fees;
- Sewer Impact Fees;
- Business License Fees; and
- Investigation For Compliance (IFC) Fee

> Program Requirements/Conditions:

Economic Development staff may impose additional requirements/conditions.



■ IMPROVEMENT REBATE PROGRAM — Upon completion of a construction project, the program reimburses Building and Planning permit fees equal to 45% of the dollars spent locally on construction related materials. The program has been designed to encourage participants to purchase their construction related materials from local City businesses. By reimbursing fees, eligible participants can further invest in their actual improvements and in return stimulate construction by reducing the cost of the project. Monies saved on permit fees can be redirected into property improvements and thereby increase property values, improve neighborhoods, and beautify commercial storefronts.

To qualify, both the improvement project location and business from which materials are purchased from shall be located within City boundaries. There must be a nexus between the permitted work and the receipts provided for local purchases. Reimbursements will be reimbursed at 100% when supported by receipts from Stanton business for improvement related materials, but not to exceed \$3000 per property. Reimbursement must be requested and supporting documentation submitted within 18 months of permit issuance. Improvements are to be inspected and in compliance with City codes.

Reimbursing fees only apply to Building and Planning permit fees. Fees for preconstruction work such as engineering, soils testing, architect services, surveying and non-City fees such as school, utility, sanitation, and other State fees shall not be eligible for reimbursement. Contractors are not eligible participants. Eligible participants include the commercial property owner or business owner. If a tenant occupied business requests assistance through the program, the legal property owner of the building must agree to the improvements. Applicants will be responsible for selecting a contractor, acquiring all required City permits, maintaining high construction standards, and adhering to all City procedures. The following provides guidance on eligible improvements, but is not exhaustive:

- Electrical:
- Energy Saving Upgrades;
- Façade Improvements;
- HVAC;



- Installation of New Equipment;
- Plumbing;
- Roofing;
- Seismic Retrofit;
- Sign Installation or Replacement; and
- Tenant Improvements to Existing Buildings
- Program Requirements/Conditions:
- Economic Development staff may impose additional requirements/conditions.

City staff must approve architectural plans prior to commencement of work and/or contract prior to hiring security guard services.

> Façade Improvement prioritize:

- Rehabilitation, restoration and remodeling of existing storefronts;
- Painting building exterior;



- Anti-graffiti coating;
- Parapet modifications;
- Installation of awnings;
- Improving public safety lighting, fencing or other approved security measure; and
- Hiring security guard services

➤ If these priorities are met in a grant project budget and design, then the grant may also include the following:

- Adding or improving business signs;
- New exterior lighting for signage;
- New windows and doors:
- Window treatments;
- Landscaping;
- Decorative pavers; and
- Decorative masonry walls

Funds provided MAY NOT be used for the following:

- Improvements made to the interior building:
- Correction of City codes or regulations;
- Residential uses (not including mixed uses);
- Improvements underway or already completed;
- General business and operating expenses; and
- Purchases of non-bolted down fixtures or equipment that would not stay with the building

Program Requirements/Conditions:

- A minimum of three bids will be required for City staff review and approval. City approval is subject to factors including the bid price and qualifications of the proposed contractor.
- The applicant shall pay the selected construction firm in full for all work that is completed. Once the job is completed and all



- documentation is provided to the City, a check for 50% of the matching funds will be provided directly to the applicant.
- All required permits must be paid for by the contractor, and upon completion of the work, the City will reimburse 100% of the permit fees to the contractor. Permit fees shall not be included in the quoted job price.
- 100% of the rebate funds will be provided at completion of project after receipts/invoices have been submitted and the final project is approved by the Building Division.
- Rebate funds may only be used to pay for the cost of materials and services necessary to carry out the rehabilitation work for which the funds are approved. Cost or fees that exceed the combined City grant and applicant's matching funds are the sole responsibility of the applicant.
- Up to 25% of the project funds may be used for design services directly related to qualified improvements.
- Property owner(s) are responsible for upkeep and property maintenance. By accepting grant funds, the applicant commits to properly maintain all improvements and to keep storefronts, as well as sides and back of buildings, clean and free of graffiti.
- The applicant shall agree to post a banner or sign, provided by the City, on the building or in the window advertising the program. The applicant shall agree to post the banner or sign during construction and for not less than four weeks after completion of the project.
- Economic Development staff may impose additional requirements/conditions.

- All required permits must be paid for by the contractor, and upon completion of the work, the City will reimburse 100% of the permit fees to the contractor. Permit fees shall not be included in the quoted job price.
- 100% of the rebate funds will be provided at completion of project after receipts/invoices have been submitted and the final project is approved by the Building Division.
- Rebate funds may only be used to pay for the cost of materials and services necessary to carry out the rehabilitation work for which the funds are approved. Cost or fees that exceed the combined City grant and applicant's matching funds are the sole responsibility of the applicant.
- Up to 25% of the project funds may be used for design services directly related to qualified improvements.
