**9E. PROPERTY MANAGEMENT SERVICES CONTRACT FOR TINA-PACIFIC NEIGHBORHOOD (HOUSING AUTHORITY)**

The City of Stanton Housing Authority published a Statement of Qualifications (SOQ) for qualified firms to provide property management services for the 31 Housing Authority - owned properties known as Tina-Pacific Neighborhood Development Plan Project (Tina-Pacific Neighborhood). Of the three proposals received, staff is recommending that the City Council allocate funds and enter into an agreement for consultant services with Quality Management Group.

**RECOMMENDED ACTION:**

1. Housing Authority Board find that this item is not subject to California Environmental Quality Act ("CEQA") pursuant to Sections 15378(b)(5) (Organizational or administrative activities of governments that will not result in direct or indirect physical changes in the environment); and
2. Authorize the City Manager to enter into an agreement for consultant services in the amount not to exceed \$86,000 with Quality Management Group for the property management services of the Tina Pacific Neighborhood; and
3. Appropriate \$10,000 from the available fund balance in the Housing Authority Fund (#285) to fund the estimated cost for Fiscal Year 2019-20.

Additionally, it is necessary to adopt a Resolution pertaining to materials prepared by any candidate for a municipal election, including costs of candidate statements.

## 10. PUBLIC HEARINGS

### 10A. AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF STANTON ADOPTING AN ORDINANCE TO ADD REGULATIONS AND ZONING STANDARDS RELATING TO COMMERCIAL CANNABIS BUSINESSES CHAPTER 5.77 (COMMERCIAL CANNABIS BUSINESSES) AND AMEND TITLE 20 (ZONING) OF THE STANTON MUNICIPAL CODE AND DETERMINING THE ORDINANCE TO BE EXEMPT FROM CEQA

On November 5, 2019, Ordinance No. 1091 was passed, approved and adopted by vote of the people of the City of Stanton. The ordinance established a tax on cannabis businesses operating within the City. The purpose of this ordinance is to implement regulation for permitting and regulating commercial cannabis businesses.

#### RECOMMENDED ACTION:

1. City Council conduct a public hearing; and
2. Find that Resolution No. 2020-21 and Ordinance No. 1100 are statutorily exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) under California Business and Professions Code section 26055, subdivision (h).
3. Adopt Resolution No. 2020-21, entitled:

A public hearing to consider a 5- and 7- story mixed-use building consisting of 300 apartment units, a 6,313 square foot commercial space and a 6-story parking structure, common and private open space, and associated improvements at 12736 Beach Boulevard. Applications include General Plan Amendment GPA19-01, Zoning Code Amendment ZCA19-04, Development Agreement DA19-01, Site Plan and Design Review SPDR-800, and Planned Development Permit PDP19-02.

**RECOMMENDED ACTION:**

1. City Council conduct a public hearing; and

5. Adopt Resolution No. 2020-16 approving Planned Development Permit PDP19-02 and Site Plan and Design Review SPDR-800 to construct a new mixed-use development including a 300-unit apartment community with a commercial component; and
6. Set Ordinance Nos. 1101 and 1102 for second reading at the regular City Council meeting on June 23, 2020.

**11. UNFINISHED BUSINESS**

**11A. REVIEW OF PROPOSED CHANGES TO CR&R SERVICES / CHARGES AND APPROVAL OF A PROPOSITION 218 NOTICE**

This item was reviewed at the City Council meeting on May 26th and continued due to changes proposed by CR&R to their proposals.

CR&R has requested a modification of the collection of waste for the single family residences from a two-cart to a three-cart system. The change is due to their inability to continue to separate recyclables from other trash at their Material Recovery Facility. They have also requested the ability to charge additional fees due to these changes.

Additionally, CR&R have requested to begin to charge for the collection of food waste and recyclables from commercial customers. Currently there is no charge for these services.

Finally they have requested for Consumer Price Index increases to their other commercial services.

These changes are required to be approved through the Proposition 218 process. The attached Proposition 218 Notice (Notice) is a requirement of the process. Staff is asking for the Council's review/approval of the changes to the services and rates and of the Notice. Also due to questions by the Council, staff has provided information regarding the evergreen clauses in other waste contracts in Orange County.

**RECOMMENDED ACTION:**

1. City Council declare that the project is categorically exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act ("CEQA") under Section 15308 – Action by regulatory agencies for protection of the environment; and

**12A. ADOPTION OF THE FISCAL YEAR 2020/21 OPERATING AND CAPITAL BUDGET FOR THE CITY OF STANTON AND STANTON HOUSING AUTHORITY; ADOPT THE FISCAL YEAR 2020/21 APPROPRIATIONS LIMIT; ADOPT FISCAL YEAR 2020/21 GENERAL FUND RESERVE POLICY; AND APPROVE FISCAL YEAR 2020/21 INVESTMENT POLICY; AND APPROVE SECOND AMENDMENT TO THE LAW ENFORCEMENT SERVICES AGREEMENT FOR FISCAL YEAR 2020/21 (COUNTY OF ORANGE)**

On May 12, 2020, the City Council held a budget study session to review the Fiscal Year 2020/21 Proposed Operating and Capital Budget. Since then, the Fiscal Year 2020/21 Proposed Operating and Capital Budget has been revised to reflect two changes for the General Fund's proposed budget:

- Transferring one full-time employee from the Public Works Department to the Administration Department, resulting in unfunding the Senior Facilities Maintenance Worker position and funding an Information Technology Specialist position; and
- Appropriating \$40,000 for a consultant to perform a city-wide user fee study and cost allocation plan.

These two changes resulted in total proposed expenditures for the General Fund increasing by \$49,850 to \$24.0 million in Fiscal Year 2020/21. Attachment A reflects the General Fund's revised Fiscal Year 2020/21 Proposed Budget.

The appropriations that are set forth in the accompanying resolutions reflect the proposed Operating and Capital Budget for Fiscal Year 2020/21. These budget resolutions provide total operating appropriations of \$29.1 million and total capital appropriations of \$4.2 million for the City (Attachment B) and \$661,555 in total operating appropriations for the Stanton Housing Authority (Attachment C).

**12B. URGENCY ORDINANCE TO AUTHORIZE THE CITY MANAGER TO GRANT EMERGENCY TEMPORARY USE PERMITS, FOR THE TEMPORARY USE OF PRIVATE PROPERTY, PRIVATE PARKING LOTS AND PUBLIC SIDEWALKS FOR COMMERCIAL BUSINESSES INCLUDING FOOD SERVICE AND OUTDOOR SEATING AREAS**

As commercial businesses in the City begin to re-open, it is critical that they do so in a manner where social distancing is maintained to limit the spread of COVID-19. Therefore, Staff recommends the City Council adopt an urgency ordinance authorizing the City Manager to grant emergency temporary use permits, for the temporary use of private property, private parking lots, and public sidewalks for commercial businesses including food service and outdoor seating areas.

**RECOMMENDED ACTION:**

1. City Council find that pursuant to California Environmental Quality Act (“CEQA”) Section 15301, Existing Facilities, this ordinance is categorically exempt; and
2. Approve Urgency Ordinance No. 1103, entitled:

**“AN URGENCY ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF STANTON, CALIFORNIA AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO GRANT EMERGENCY TEMPORARY USE PERMITS TO ALLOW COMMERCIAL BUSINESSES, INCLUDING FOOD SERVICE AND OUTDOOR SEATING AREAS, TO OPERATE ON PRIVATE PROPERTY, PRIVATE PARKING LOTS AND PUBLIC SIDEWALKS AND TEMPORARILY WAIVING TEMPORARY USE PERMIT REVIEW FEES FOR EMERGENCY TEMPORARY USE PERMITS”;** and

**12C. CREATION OF STANTON SMALL BUSINESS RELIEF GRANT PROGRAM UTILIZING CARES ACT FUNDING FROM THE COUNTY OF ORANGE**

The Orange County Board of Supervisors has authorized the distribution of \$75 million that it received from the Coronavirus Relief Fund directly to cities. Each supervisorial district received \$15 million and allocated it among cities based on the 2010 Census population figures, giving Stanton a little more than \$934,000. The Stanton Economic Recovery Committee met on Wednesday, June 3, 2020, and recommends up to \$7,500 for eligible Stanton small businesses.

**RECOMMENDED ACTION:**

1. City Council declare that the project is exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (“CEQA”) under Section 15061(b)(3) as the activity is covered by the general rule that CEQA applies only to projects which have the potential for causing significant effect on the environment. Where it can be seen with certainty that there is no possibility that the activity in question may have a significant effect on the environment, the activity is not subject to CEQA; and
2. Authorize the Stanton Small Business Relief Program.

At this time the Orange County Fire Authority will provide the City Council with an update on their current operations.
