BACKGROUND:

California Government Code requires that the Planning Commission submit to the City Council and HCD the progress that the City has made in implementing the goals and policies of the City's Housing Element.

ANALYSIS/JUSTIFICATION:

On April 5, 2023, at their regular meeting, the Planning Commission was provided with the 2022 Housing Element Annual Progress Report and voted to recommend that the City Council accept the report. The Planning Commission acknowledged that during the 2022 calendar year, the Planning Division accepted and processed 33 applications

including administrative, discretionary, and legislative applications to the City Council. Additionally, they acknowledged that the Planning Commission conducted nine meetings and reviewed ten items. Four of the ten items were new housing developments which resulted in nine new housing units. In 2022, the Building Division issued 32 permits for new housing units.

FISCAL IMPACT:

No fiscal impact.

ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT:

This project is categorically exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act ("CEQA") pursuant to Guideline Section No. 15306 (Class 6, Information Collection). Categorical Exemptions are projects which have been determined not to have a significant effect on the environment and which have been exempted from the requirements of CEQA. Class 6 consists of projects which solely encompass information collecting and reporting, such as the annual report.

MUNICIPAL ELECTION

REPORT IN BRIEF:

Consideration for appointment to fill one (1) vacancy on the Stanton Public Safety Committee. There is currently one (1) vacancy within the Public Safety Committee due to terms expired due to the November 2022 General Municipal Election.

The Council Member holding the seat number corresponding to that numbered seat on the Committee shall be responsible for appointment of one Committee Member, with majority approval of the City Council. The terms of office shall coincide with the term of office of the Council Member or Mayor who made the appointment. Additionally, Section 2.06.030 of the Stanton Municipal Code provides that the City Council, by majority vote, may waive the requirement to interview persons previously appointed by the City Council and who are requesting re-appointment to another term.

RECOMMENDED ACTION:

- City Council find that this item is not subject to California Environmental Quality Act ("CEQA") pursuant to Sections 15378(b)(5)(Organizational or administrative activities of governments that will not result in direct or indirect physical changes in the environment);
- 2. Conduct an interview with each applicant; and
- 3. Make an appointment to fill Seat #3 Torres on the Stanton Public Safety Committee.

BACKGROUND AND ANALYSIS:

Per City Council direction at the March 7, 2023, City Council meeting, staff was directed to re-open the recruitment process to fill one (1) vacancy on the Stanton Public Safety Committee.

Section 2.06.030 of the Stanton Municipal Code requires the submission of applications and interviews prior to appointment to any position. The open recruitment process to fill one (1) seat on the Stanton Public Safety Committee began on March 13, 2023, and remained open to the public for two weeks, closing on March 27, 2023. Upon closing of the application process, applicants were notified and scheduled for interviews.

The Stanton Public Safety Committee consists of five members who meet once every three months. As part of the strategic plan, the Stanton Public Safety Committee aligns the City with its core goal of "Providing a Safe Community". The purpose of this committee is to foster and maintain effective interaction with law enforcement, fire services, emergency medical services and emergency preparedness.
