Code Red

With the possibility of the disease COVID-19 affecting our community and the potential for spring flooding, Lincoln County Emergency Management is encouraging area residents to take advantage of its CODE RED notification system. The system is designed to notify people in the event of an emergency. The system works through the 911 Emergency program. The limitation is that it only goes out to landlines unless you go in and input your cell phone or email. With this program, messages can be sent out geographically within moments.

811 – Call Before You Dig



BEFORE YOU DIG... Calling 811 is the most important step! Wyoming law requires that you call at least 2 business days before you intend to dig. Call 811 (or if you are calling from out of-state 1-800-849-2476) Whether you are planning to do it yourself or hire a professional, smart digging means calling 811 before each job.

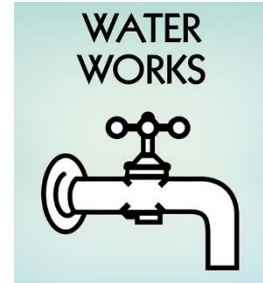

Water Improvement Project 2019

Knife River Construction will begin working on Water Improvement Project 2019 again this year, from this spring through November of 2020. They will be working in different parts of Town to install fire hydrants and new water lines. Please be aware that they will be working on Vista West Drive, Cedar Drive, Vista East Drive, Sugarloaf Drive, Walnut Drive, Green Canyon Drive, Oak Drive, Cedar Creek Drive (from Eastwood to Hardman), Lilac Drive, Holly Drive, Tumbleweed Lane, Barberry Way, West Elkorn Drive and Muddy String.

Town Road Right of Way

With Water Improvement Project 2019 starting in the Spring of 2020 the Town road right of way will be utilized for the new water line and fire hydrants. Citizens need to remove any landscaping that is in the road right of way. Town Ordinance 5.04.020 allows the Town to remove the landscaping at your expense or you may remove the landscaping yourself. The Town is not liable for damage to any landscaping on the Town road right of way.

New/Old Town Hall Update



As many of you may know the Town is in the process of purchasing the old Town Hall at 171 Vista Drive. The Town Council will not finalize the purchase until everything is completed per our contract with the owner. That includes the additional parking lot for the new mail center which will be located on the lower level.

Material should not be placed along the road until July 1st in lengths not greater than 8 feet. This should only be natural wildland fuels; no construction waste or other trash.
