10 Reasons to SELF RESPOND: Email - Phone - Mail

1. Our Town received \$865.00 per Individual last year (\$4,325 for a family of 5)
2. Our Town needs more population to offset the losses from the economy & Virus impact
3. Additional Funds can be used for additional Road improvements
4. 71% of all Operating Income for the Town is based on our relative Census population %
5. New Schools are determined by and supplemental funded based on the Census
6. Voting Districts, State Representatives and US Representatives are based on Census
7. Federal Highway funding is based on the Census
8. Billions of dollars in federal funding to communities across the country—for hospitals, fire departments, school lunch programs are based on the Census

VERY HIGH FIRE DANGER

As of press time the fire danger in the Star Valley continues to run at the Very High level. At this level fires start easily from all causes, spread rapidly and intensify quickly. Spot fires are a constant danger. Fires burning in heavy fuels may quickly develop high-intensity

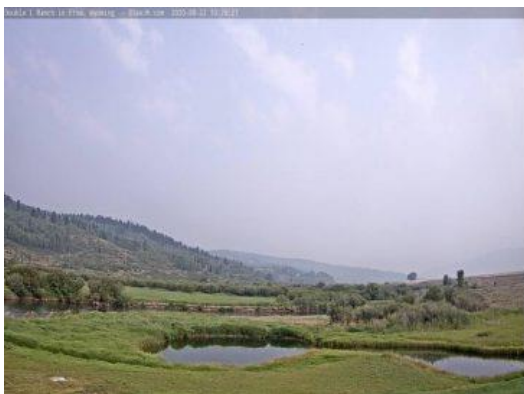


characteristics, such as long-distance spotting and fire whirlwinds.

The Energy Release Component continues to run above 60 and because of that ALL recreational fires are prohibited within the Town of Star Valley Ranch.

The most notable weather event for the summer thus far has been the considerable smoke that covered much of the area for several days originating from the extensive fires in California. 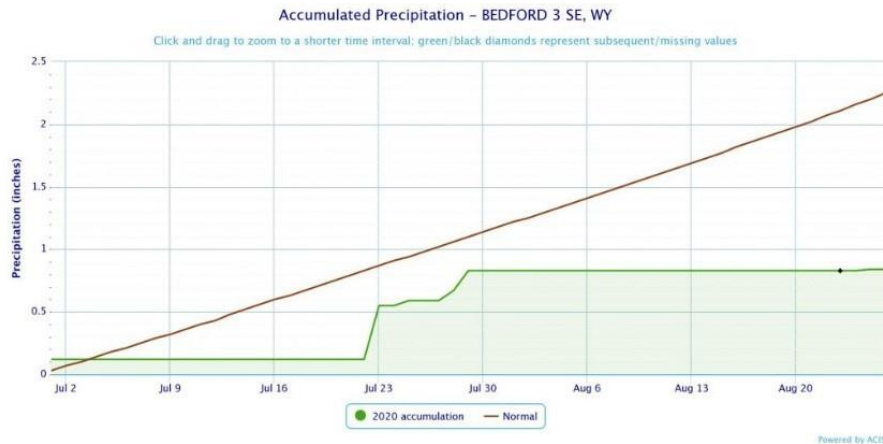
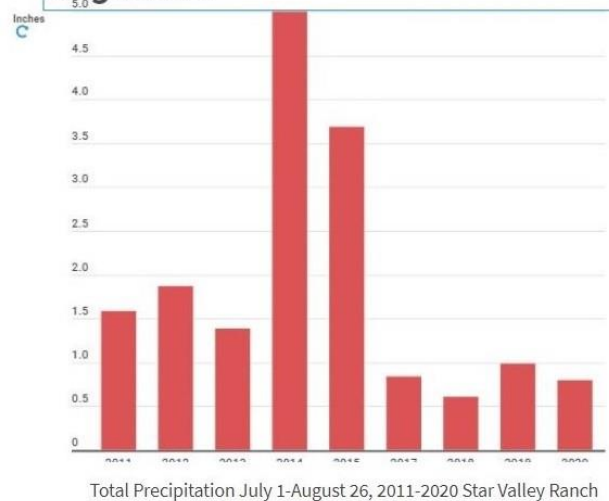

Due to deadline constraints this article will cover the period from July 1-August 26th to compare this year with the past 9 years. The observations are taken in Star Valley Ranch on Vista Drive near the National Forest boundary.

It has been the fourth driest summer after a couple wet ones in 2015-2016. The average for the period is around 2 inches about double the observed amount of the past 4 summers. The lack of Monsoon moisture making it this far north is the primary reason for the limited thunderstorms in our area.

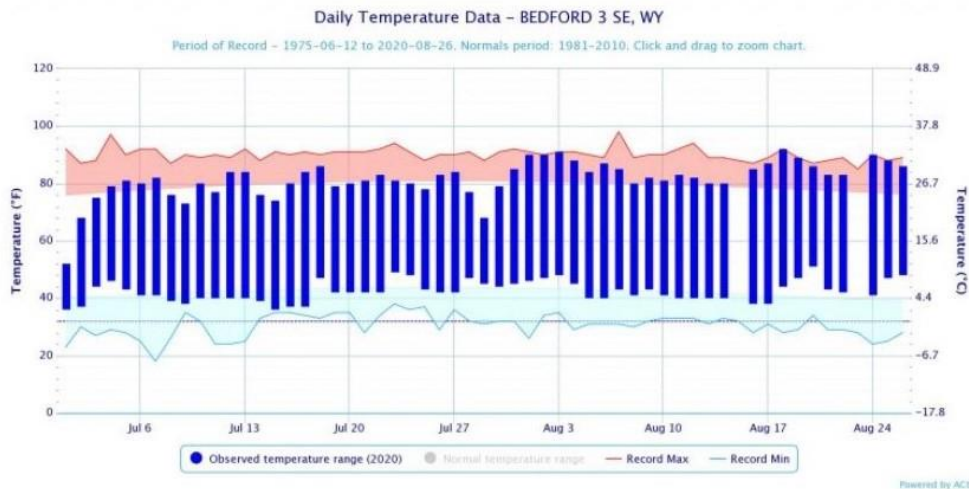
The official climate station in the area is located 3 SE of Bedford where the comparison of normal with this summer's precipitation total is compared.

Bedford 3SE precipitation July 1-August 26 2020

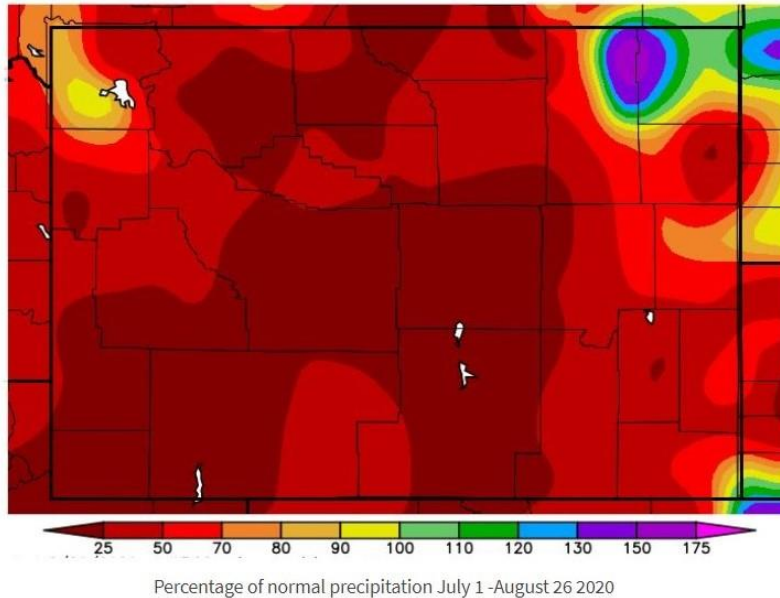
With the absence of cooling showers, particularly in the month of August, daytime temperatures have been warm with several daytime record highs set at the Bedford 3 SE station.
