Please be Firewise and be careful with Fire!

August is our hottest month and usually has the highest fire danger! Please be careful! Remember, during fire season, it is **prohibited** to:

- 1. Conduct open burning of any trash, tree trimmings, leaf and grass clippings, or other such debris.**
- 2. Discharge fireworks**
- 3. Have a recreational fire that is not in a metal, masonry or stone enclosure with a spark arresting screen**



When the Energy Release Component (ERC), as measured by the Teton Interagency Fire Center, averages 60 or more over a three-day period, then all recreational fires are banned.

Lee Hansen – SVR Town Council Candidate

I'm Lee Hansen and I am seeking re-election to the Town Council of Star Valley Ranch. Linda and I have been residents of Wyoming for 37 years, 18 of which have been here on the Ranch. My first involvement with the Town's activities was serving on the Planning and Zoning Board, covering a span of almost 10 years. During that time, our building code requirements were established, plus the Board took the lead on many of the ordinances that set the standards that guide the town today. The last two years, I have been the Council liaison to the Water Board. This Board has the critical function of ensuring that the town meets its financial obligation to maintain sufficient funding to repay the loans we have taken on in the complete upgrade of our water system.



During the past 4 years, we have taken many important steps to maintain the lifestyle that the citizens of our community love. First and most important, we have maintained a sound financial foundation for our Town. Managing our spending is crucial when the sources of revenue are controlled by the State of Wyoming and Lincoln County especially during some very uncertain times. Both the pandemic and the curtailment of carbon usage were huge concerns for possible impacts to our sources of revenue. My goal has been, and will continue to be, to maintain control of our spending by requiring a thorough evaluation of all proposed projects before proceeding.

The next important item in the process of creating trust with our citizens is to receive and send prompt and accurate information. I pledge to be a fair and honest conduit of communication to and from our citizens of Star Valley Ranch. Some of the most recent items that are foremost on the minds of our citizens are fire protection, short-term rental permitting, control of nuisances, the condition and maintenance/upgrade of our roads, and the completion of our water system upgrade, just to name a few. Of these, our most pressing work is to complete the upgrade to our water system. The rules keep shifting and funding options are different from what they were just a few years ago. I will continue to work to ascertain the best option available to the town. Once this is complete, we can focus on what is the best option for putting our roads into a condition that will be acceptable to most of our residents.

The issue of fire protection is presently getting a lot of attention. The cost has escalated significantly, over 5 times, in a short period of time with no significant change to the protection we are being provided. While citizen sentiment is to maintain fire protection at any cost, questions must be asked, and evaluations must be made.

Finally, maintaining the environmental integrity of our town, specifically in encouraging our residents to be proactive in the proper maintenance of their septic systems, needs to be a top priority. This is increasingly important because of all the new building taking place as well as for any potential developments around our borders.

Kathleen Buyers – SVR Town Mayor Candidate

Don Baillie – SVR Town Mayor Candidate

Hello, my name is Don Baillie and I am running for the office of Mayor for the Town of Star Valley Ranch.

My wife Judy and I have called the Town of Star Valley Ranch home since 2003, both of us are lifelong residents of Wyoming residing in Cheyenne before moving to Star Valley Ranch. We are and have always been year-round residents.

I am currently a Town Councilman, having been elected in 2018. My service with the Town started with Planning and Zoning Board in June 2010 and I served as chairman until June 2015. I took a short leave and rejoined the Board then served until I was elected to the Town Council.



During my time as a Councilman, I have served as the liaison to the Planning and Zoning Board and the Natural Recourse Board. I have been heavily involved in the development and passage of the ICC Building Codes from 2006 Edition to the 2018 Edition, Liquor Licensing, Contractor Registration, and the Nuisance and Short-Term Rental ordinances. I also lead the effort to go from a manual paper system of logging building inspections to an electronic system using a phone or tablet. I also lead the effort to Codify Town Ordinances.

The Town's water projects are winding down, with the transmission line on Vista Drive our primary project needing replacement. The Town is currently seeking grants through the ARPA program for replacement of this line. As the Town continues to grow decisions will need to be made about water storage, possible additional tanks, and maintenance of the tanks and wells. The town has a software program to control pumps, valves and to gather real time data. The data gathering side of this program is not being used. The Water Board, staffed by talented people, is not getting this needed information. This information is needed to assist the Council in the decisions of well and storage tank maintenance, minimize rate increases, identify future needs and location of major components of the system.

Roads are the major concerns of residents, dust, potholes, failed pavement or lack of pavement. We need funding to manage any significant upgrade to our roads. One way to do this would be the 6th penny tax. I would support this as Mayor and would work to make this happen if this is an approach that the Town would like to pursue.

Water Projects



This month's newsletter is an overview of the remaining water system upgrade and replacement projects as well as details of the Vista Drive Mainline ARPA project.

First, what Water Projects remain to be completed?

Today's estimated cost to complete our water system is under \$5,000,000, but will continue to rise as costs escalate. So, time is of the essence to complete the changes as soon as reasonable.

These remaining upgrades and additions are made up of the following general projects:

Vista Drive

(Mainline - Green Canyon tank to Vista West connection + two cul-de-sacs)

Ridgecrest Drive

(Line and cul-de-sac)

Hardman Road

(Middle Branch to Hardman Circle)

Eastwood Way

(Upgrade line)

Prater Canyon Drive

(Fire Hydrant upgrades & supporting lines)

Second, what's going on now?

The Town has made application for funding of the Vista Drive Project.

Total estimated cost is a little under \$2.2 million, made up of:

1. **GRANT:** ARPA Funds requested (64%) is just under \$1.4 million
2. **MATCH:** Town's Matching Funds (36% gives us 4 of a possible 5 ranking points) will be about \$787,000 consisting of:
 - a) previously awarded, unused, ARPA funds of \$288,000 and
 - b) the balance of approximately \$500,00 from our Water System Reserve.

(This funding does not have a direct impact on our current rates, as there is not a loan repayment component. However, the System Reserve funds will have to be replaced by our rates.)

The American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) is federal funds designated for Water and Sewer Projects across the nation. The State Land & Investment Board is administering these funds in the state of Wyoming. Our State's total share is \$50,000,000.

The rules for application and approvals are unique to just these funds. Applications will be ranked based on an overall point system. There are no loans associated with these specific funds. We have noticed the rules and guidelines are being refined from time to time, details can be found online at Wyoming Administration Rules:
