

# FIREWISE PROGRAM CLARIFICATION & PICKUP

NOW IS THE TIME TO BE PREPARED FOR WILDFIRE

In the June newsletter we erroneously reported that residents needed to register in order to participate in the Firewise program and annual brush pile pickup. That information was incorrect. The Town of Star Valley Ranch will pick-up brush piles from all residents regardless of formal Firewise program registration or certification. The Town will begin brush pile pickups on July 17<sup>th</sup> and continue through the 20<sup>th</sup>.



All brush should be cut in lengths of not over 8 feet and placed along the side of the roadway by your home after July 3<sup>rd</sup>. Please remember that <u>nothing may be placed on the road right of way prior to July 3<sup>rd</sup></u>.

Residents are still encouraged to obtain a fire safety inspection of their property from Lincoln County Firewise Program Director, Patty Pringle. You can reach her at (307) 679-8574.

## MAYOR'S MEMO

A FEW WORDS FROM KATHY BUYERS

Dear friends and neighbors,

As the Town begins its 2023/2024 fiscal year, we look forward to many new projects that were approved as part of the budget process.

The Public Works Department will be focusing on road maintenance grading, dust guard, trimming, mowing, and removing trees on the road right of way. They will be adding culverts in compliance with the Surface Water Study and completing small paving projects at the Town Hall parking lot, at the corners of Butte/Hardman, and at Butte/Ponderosa. Public Works will also be working on some road striping projects in Town. We have Capital projects that are still under the design stage and should be completed this fiscal year.

Water Improvement Project 21 started at West Elkhorn Circle at the end of June and will continue to complete connections on the remaining cull de sacs. After completion all road damage that was created during the project will be repaired.

Water Improvement Project 23 (WIP 23) will replace water lines on Vista from Vista West to Vista East, up Vista East to Green Canyon. Please understand that a portion of Vista Drive will go back to dirt until the completion of WIP 23. At this writing we do not have a specific timeline completed.

We are currently recruiting volunteers to serve on our Town Boards. Please email the Town Clerk at <u>clerk@starvalleyranchwy.org</u> if you are interested in helping your community. We could really use volunteers with water utility, public safety, civil engineering, and construction background.

Fireworks watching is available all over Star Valley. As a reminder Fireworks are not allowed in the Town of Star Valley Ranch (please refer to Ordinance section §92.03 DISCHARGE OF FIREWORKS).



## ROADS 101

DUST CONTROL ON OUR TOWN ROADS

Now that the summer season is upon us at the Ranch, our Town Public Works Department will begin treating our gravel roads with a road stabilizer. This stabilizer keeps gravel and other road materials in place, makes the road surfaces smoother, and controls dust. Interestingly, stabilizer application is more effective on highly traveled roads as the vehicle traffic helps beat in the product.

The road stabilizer our Public Works crews will be using is a naturally occurring mineral called magnesium chloride, a nontoxic mineral that is gathered from the Great Salt Lake in Utah. DustGard® is applied as a liquid solution on freshlybladed roads, and stabilizes roads and controls dust because of its hygroscopic properties. This means the product naturally attracts moisture from the air, keeping the ground slightly damp and preventing dust and dirt from blowing in the wind.

Dust control is beneficial for many reasons. It improves road safety by offering drivers greater traction and controlling dust that make visibility difficult. It also protects vehicles by keeping loose gravel and dust to a minimum, reducing chipped windshields, congested filters and clogged bearings. Controlling dust also improves the environment for human and animal health.

Public Works began blading roads and applying DustGard® during the last week of June. Dust control on Town roads will continue into the fall. Application usually occurs during the mornings when dampness aids in the process which begins by pulling up 4 to 6 inches of road surface, applying water, and then applying the DustGard®. Following this initial phase of the application process, the road is bladed and then DustGard® is applied again and compacted (with a roller). Water may also be applied again as needed during the compaction phase of the process. As a result, please note that roads will be wet and muddy for several days after application as the stabilizer soaks in and hardens.

## NEWS & NOTES FROM THE PLANNING & ZONING BOARD (P&Z)

#### ALL ABOUT P&Z

PLANS, PERMITS, AND MORE ...

There are new and exciting things happening with TSVR Planning and Zoning. The Town's Planning and Zoning Department consists of five board members, two Building Inspectors, and one Planning and Zoning Clerk. Currently the only full-time employee is the Planning and Zoning Clerk. Board members are citizens who volunteer their time and expertise. Currently, the Planning and Zoning Board is looking for new members. If you are interested in volunteering, please send an email to the Town Clerk at <u>clerk@starvalleyranchwy.org</u>.

One of the main duties of the Planning and Zoning Board is the approval of permits. Over the last three years the Town has issued an average of 70 permits per year. Many of these permits are for new homes, about 25-30 per year. It has been exciting to see the growth in our Town, however, managing so many permits has proved challenging. To help with this challenge and make the permit application process more convenient for our citizens, we have implemented a new online system.

This system includes the ability for citizens and contractors to go to the Town website and apply directly online for many of the different types of permits the Town issues. The online application process in now available for new residential homes, new garages, and other accessory buildings/sheds (over 350 square feet), structural modifications (such as additions), new decks or deck repairs, and additional driveway or driveway resurfacing permits. Other types of permits such as fence, smaller accessory buildings/sheds, or right-of-way permits will still need to fill out a paper application. In addition to applying for permits online the new system allows for Permit Application Fees and Building Deposits to be paid online. We are excited about the new system and hope citizens find it to be a useful tool.

2023 is on track as another busy year! I would like to take this opportunity to remind citizens to please check if a permit is required by the Town, and possibly Star Valley Ranch Association, prior to building or making improvements to their properties. Lots of information is available via our website, including Town Ordinances which include what actions require a permit and general building requirements [use this link <u>https://www.starvalleyranchwy.org/government/ordinances.php</u>].

You can also reach out to us at Town Hall anytime. We know it can be confusing, but we are happy to help!

### TSVR 2023-2024 BUDGET APPROVED

TOWN MISSION DRIVES GOAL-ORIENTED BUDGET PROCESS

At the June 13<sup>th</sup> Town Council meeting the Council approved the 2023-2024 Budget Appropriation for the Town of Star Valley Ranch. The Town's new fiscal year begins on July 1st, 2023 and concludes on June 30th, 2024.

This year's budget was created via a top-down, missiondriven planning process. Specifically, annual-goals were created to align with our Town's mission statement to ensure the Town Council drives the Town toward fulfillment of that mission. These annual goals will now be cascaded down to every member of our Town staff to ensure our people and financial resources are aligned with the overall priorities and work plan set down by the Town Council.

Here at Star Valley Ranch mail center, we have over 800 occupied mailboxes. We have 70 parcel lockers and a volume of packages ranging from 250-500 packages daily making it so every locker is used every day. We start our day in Thayne sorting packages/mail, and we can only bring as many with us from Thayne to fill the lockers that we have available. If the lockers don't have keys hanging out of them that means that the locker is occupied by a package waiting for someone to pick it up. Unfortunately, some packages get left behind due to size, lack of lockers, and need for a signature. Thanks for your understanding and cooperation!

### MORE NEWS IN BRIEF

QUICK NOTES ON TOWN OPERATIONS AS OF 30 JUNE

- Water Installation Project 2021 (WIP 21) resumed the week of 26 June on West Elkhorn. The project will continue through the summer.
- Town Hall landscaping has been completed for the year. There are now steps from the upper portion of the parking lot down to the lower portion.
- Leveling of Town property next to the old mail center is nearly complete.
- Culverts ordered for repairs on Spruce Drive and Cedar Drive following spring run-off have been received. Installation is planned for the month of July.
- The Town's road grader has been returned and the road grader that had been on loan was picked up by Caterpillar, Inc. (CAT).
- The Town's compactor/roller (purchased used about 4 years ago) continues to malfunction. The Town is working with CAT mechanics to troubleshoot issues. The roller is a necessary piece of heavy equipment that works in concert with the road grader to repair our Town roads.
- After waiting 6-months our elevator/lift at Town Hall has been repaired and certified as ADA compliant.
