105.6.2	Amusement Buildings: (Mandatory Permit) An operational permit is required to operate a special amusement building.	\$ 50.00
105.6.5	Carnivals and Fairs: (Mandatory Permit) An operational permit is required to conduct a carnival or fair.	\$ 50.00
105.6.7	Combustible Dust-Producing Operations: (Mandatory Permit) An operational permit is required to operate a grain elevator, flour starch mill, feed mill, or a plant pulverizing aluminum, coal, cocoa, magnesium, spices or sugar, or other operations producing combustible dusts as defined in Chapter 2.	\$ 50.00
105.6.10	Covered and Open Mall Buildings: (Mandatory Permit)	\$ 50.00
105.6.14	Exhibits and Trade Shows: (Mandatory Permit) An operational permit is required to operate exhibits and trade shows.	\$ 50.00
105.6.15	Explosives: (Mandatory Permit) An operational permit is required for the manufacture, storage, handling, sale or use of any quantity of explosives, explosive materials, fireworks or pyrotechnic special effects within the scope of Chapter 56.	\$ 50.00
105.6.17	Flammable and Combustible Liquids: 6. (Mandatory permit). To operate tank vehicles, equipment, tanks, plants, terminals, wells, fuel- dispensing stations, refineries, distilleries and similar facilities where flammable and combustible liquids are produced, processed, transported, stored, dispensed or used. 7. (Mandatory permit). To place temporarily out of service (for more than 90 days) an underground, protected above-ground or above-ground flammable or combustible liquid tank. 8. (Mandatory permit). To change the type of contents stored in a flammable or combustible liquid tank to a material that poses a greater hazard than that for which the tank was designed and constructed. 9. (Mandatory permit). To manufacture, process, blend or refine flammable or combustible liquids. 10. (Mandatory permit). To engage in the dispensing of liquid fuels into the fuel tanks of motor vehicles at commercial, industrial, governmental or manufacturing establishments. 11. (Mandatory permit). To utilize a site for the dispensing of liquid fuels from tank vehicles into the fuel tanks of motor vehicles, marine craft and other special equipment at commercial, industrial, governmental or manufacturing establishments.	\$ 50.00
105.6.20	Fumigation and Insecticidal Fogging: (Mandatory Permit) An operational permit is required to operate a business of fumigation or insecticidal fogging, and to maintain a room, vault or chamber in which a toxic or flammable fumigant is used.	\$ 50.00
105.6.27	Liquid- or Gas-Fueled Vehicles or Equipment in Assembly Buildings: (Mandatory Permit) An operational permit is required to display, operate or demonstrate liquid- or gas-fueled vehicles or equipment in assembly buildings.	\$ 50.00

105.6.37	Private Fire Hydrants: (Mandatory Permit) An operational permit is required for the removal from service, use or operation of private fire hydrants.	\$ 50.00
105.6.38	Pyrotechnic Special Effects Material: (Mandatory Permit) An operational permit is required for use and handling of pyrotechnic special effects material.	\$ 50.00
105.6.43	Spraying or Dipping: (Mandatory Permit) An operational permit is required to conduct a spraying or dipping operation utilizing flammable or combustible liquids, or the application of combustible powders regulated by Chapter 24.	\$ 50.00
105.6.45	Temporary Membrane Structures and Tents: (Mandatory Permit) An operational permit is required to operate an air-supported temporary membrane structure, or a temporary stage canopy having an area in excess of 400 square feet (37 m ²), or a tent having an area in excess of 800 square feet (74 m ²). (SEE CODE FOR EXCEPTIONS)	\$ 50.00
105.6.49	Temporary Sleeping Units for Disaster Relief Workers: (Mandatory Permit) An operational permit is required for operation of long-term temporary sleeping units for disaster relief workers.	\$ 50.00
105.6.1	Aerosol Products: An operational permit is required to manufacture, store or handle an aggregate quantity of Level 2 or Level 3 aerosol products in excess of 500 pounds (227 kg) net weight.	\$ 50.00
105.6.3	Aviation Facilities: An operational permit is required to use a Group H or Group S occupancy for aircraft servicing or repair and aircraft fuel-servicing vehicles. Additional permits required by other sections of this code include, but are not limited to, hot work, hazardous materials and flammable or combustible finishes.	\$ 50.00
105.6.6	Cellulose Nitrate Film: An operational permit is required to store, handle or use cellulose nitrate film in a Group A occupancy.	\$ 50.00
105.6.9	Compressed Gases: An operational permit is required for the storage, use or handling at normal temperature and pressure (NTP) of compressed gases in excess of the amounts listed in Table 105.6.9.	\$ 50.00
105.6.11	Cryogenic Fluids: An operational permit is required to produce, store, transport on site, use, handle or dispense cryogenic fluids in excess of the amounts listed in Table 105.6.11.	\$ 50.00
105.6.13	Dry Cleaning: An operational permit is required to engage in the business of dry cleaning or to change to a more hazardous cleaning solvent used in existing dry-cleaning equipment.	\$ 50.00
105.6.21	Hazardous Materials: An operational permit is required to store, transport on site, dispense, use or handle hazardous materials in excess of the amounts listed in Table 105.6.21.	\$ 50.00
105.6.22	HPM Facilities: An operational permit is required to store, handle or use hazardous production materials.	\$ 50.00

105.6.23	<p>High-Piled Storage:</p> <p>An operational permit is required to use a building or portion thereof as a high-piled storage area exceeding 500 square feet (46 m²).</p>	\$ 50.00
105.6.39	<p>Pyroxylin Plastics:</p> <p>An operational permit is required for storage or handling of more than 25 pounds (11 kg) of cellulose nitrate (pyroxylin) plastics, and for the assembly or manufacture of articles involving pyroxylin plastics.</p>	\$ 50.00
105.6.44	<p>Storage of Scrap Tires and Tire Byproducts:</p> <p>An operational permit is required to establish, conduct or maintain storage of scrap tires and tire byproducts that exceeds 2,500 cubic feet (71 m³) of total volume of scrap tires, and for indoor storage of tires and tire byproducts.</p>	\$ 50.00
