

On August 25, 2022 deputies from the Stokes County Sheriff's Office responded to the residence on Flat Shoals Road in the Germanton area of Stokes County on a reported Breaking and Entering.

Upon arrival officers located Stephanie Spooner at this location and were able to obtain charges on her for this incident. During the investigation information was obtained that a white male, later identified as Mark Edward Selvey, would be the second individual who had fled on foot and subsequently was also charged with this incident.

During the investigation, detectives were able to obtain additional information about other break-ins within Stokes County involving these two individuals and developed leads that stolen property would be located at the suspects residence located on Robin Road in Walnut Cove, NC.

On September 9th, 2022 detectives executed a search warrant at that location at which time we were able to seize stolen property from various break-ins reported around Stokes County, to include the Westfield, Germanton and Walnut Cove Communities.

- Possession of Methamphetamine (2 counts)
- Possession of Drug Paraphernalia (1 count)
- Carrying a Concealed Weapon (2 counts)

Stephanie Spooner:

- Breaking and Entering (4 counts)
- Larceny after Breaking and Entering (4 counts)
- Possession of Stolen Property (2 counts)
- Injury to Real Property (3 counts)
- Felony Conspiracy (3 counts)
- Injury to Personal Property (1 count)
- First Degree Trespass (1 count)

Mr. Selvey was given a \$150,000.00 secured bond.

Mrs. Spooner was given a \$30,000.00 secured bond.
