Chairman Ernest Lankford called the meeting to order.

Chairman Lankford presented the following "Thought for the Day":

Vice Chairman Inman delivered the invocation.

#### **GENERAL GOVERNMENT-GOVERNING BODY-PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE**

Chairman Lankford opened the meeting by inviting the citizens in attendance to join the Board in the Pledge of Allegiance.

#### **GENERAL GOVERNMENT – GOVERNING BODY – APPROVAL OF AGENDA**

Chairman Lankford entertained a motion to approve or amend the July 11, 2011 Agenda.

Interim County Manager Rick Morris requested to add the following to today's Discussion Agenda – Item VI (d) Job Vacancy:

Commissioner Booth moved to approve the July 11, 2011 Agenda as amended.

Vice Chairman Inman seconded and the motion carried (4-0) with Commissioner Jones absent.

Commissioner Walker noted that he had some questions regarding the Consent Agenda.

#### **Proposed Stokes Family YMCA Recreation Contract – F/Y 2011-12**

Interim Manager Rick Morris submitted the proposed Stokes Family YMCA Recreation Contract for Fiscal Year 2011-12 at the July 11<sup>th</sup> meeting with a request for approval. Interim Manager Morris included that the proposed Recreation Contract was the same as F/Y 2010-11 except for the fiscal year dates (Fiscal Year 2011-12).

#### **Proposed CenterPoint Human Services Performance Agreement – F/Y 2011-12**

Interim Manager Rick Morris submitted the proposed CenterPoint Human Services

Performance Agreement for Fiscal Year 2011-12 at the July 11<sup>th</sup> meeting with a request for approval. Interim Manager Morris included that the proposed Performance Agreement Contract was the same as F/Y 2010-11 except for the fiscal year dates (Fiscal Year 2011-12).

Commissioner Booth moved to approve the Consent Agent as presented.

Vice Chairman Inman seconded the motion for discussion.

Commissioner Walker expressed the following concerns with the items on the Consent Agenda:

- Concerned with the Proposed Family YMCA Recreation Contract being on the Consent Agenda instead of the Discussion Agenda
- Concerned with the Proposed CenterPoint Human Services Performance Agreement being on the Consent Agenda instead of the Discussion Agenda
- Do not think these contracts have ever been on a Consent Agenda before
- Couldn't understand why these were put on the Consent Agenda, recently had two other contracts that were on the Discussion Agenda first
- Feels the items should have been put on the Discussion Agenda in order for the Board to have an opportunity to discuss the items
- Discussion Agenda was set up in order to have transparency and openness
- Feels there has not been adequate discussion regarding budget Amendment #1
- Would not vote for the Consent Agenda due to these items being on the Consent Agenda instead of the Discussion Agenda
- Want to see the Board stay with the normal procedure of each item being on the Discussion Agenda first, then Action or Consent at the next meeting unless a time sensitive item

Chairman Lankford responded that there had been ample time for discussion during the recent Budget Work Sessions, the budgets for both Recreation and Mental Health have already been approved for the upcoming Fiscal Year 2011-12, and reiterated that there were no changes except for the Fiscal Year (2011-12) in both contracts as noted on the Agenda page.

Vice Chairman Inman, member of the CenterPoint Human Services Board, confirmed that the CenterPoint Human Services Performance Agreement is the same as last year except for the Fiscal Year dates. Vice Chairman Inman noted that the Performance Agreement as last fiscal year included a bi-annual review.

Commissioner Walker reiterated that Vice Chairman Inman's comments were the type comments that should be discussed on a Discussion Agenda.

Vice Chairman Inman requested Finance Director Julia Edwards to quickly review Budget Amendment #1.

Finance Director Edwards noted the following:

- Budget Amendment #1 reflects the terms of the Lease Agreement recently approved by the Board of Commissioners with Pioneer Health Services for Stokes-Reynolds Memorial Hospital, Inc.
- Pioneer Health Services will pay Stokes County a lease payment in the amount of \$500,000 per year
- Stokes County will pay Pioneer Health Services \$490,000 per year for ER Services
- Budget Amendment #1 transfers \$10,000 to a Capital Reserve Fund
- The Lease Agreement was not executed before the Fiscal Year 2011-12 Budget was adopted

Commissioner Walker noted that the discussion with Finance Director Edwards was the kind of comments that should be discussed on a Discussion Agenda.

The motion carried (3-1) with Commissioner Walker voting against the motion and Commissioner Jones absent.

## **GENERAL GOVERNMENT – GOVERNING BODY – INFORMATION AGENDA**

### **Update – Manager and Board of Commissioners**

Chairman Lankford opened the floor for updates from the Board and the Interim County Manager.

### **Mass Gathering Ordinance - Update**

Interim County Manager Rick Morris presented the following update regarding the County's Current Mass Gathering Ordinance:

- Have had discussions with Sheriff Mike Marshall regarding the current Mass Gathering Ordinance
- Feels the current Ordinance was appropriate when it was put in place (approximately 10 years ago)

- Feels it needs to be reviewed to adjust to a more business friendly approach, as discussed in the BOCC goal sessions
- With the consent of the BOCC, would like to establish a committee of county personnel and private business owners to look at all aspects of the existing Ordinance
- Would like to try to come up with an Ordinance that reflects where the County wishes to go as it relates to tourism
- Will bring an updated proposed Ordinance back for the Board's consideration
- Feel the committee can collectively come up with an Ordinance that will work for everyone
- Mr. Tom Pace, Jomeokee Campground, feels that professional promoters read the Ordinance before even contacting the County, and turns away due to the strict requirements
- Could possibly include language to look at previous events by promoters who want to come into the county

Commissioner Booth noted the following regarding the current Mass Gathering Ordinance:

- Remember when it was put in and understand why it was put in place
- Could add possibly a section for campgrounds, camping events, etc.
- Must be careful to make sure the right guidelines are in place in order to be able to handle a huge concert
- Must have the right amount of security, adequate sanitation requirements, and appropriate EMS Services, etc.
- Doesn't feel much should be taken out of the existing Ordinance
- Like the concept of the existing Ordinance

Commissioner Walker noted the following regarding the current Mass Gathering Ordinance:

- Have talk to Mr. Pace and others about the current Ordinance
- Commend the Interim Manager for being proactive and trying to deal with it from a business perspective
- Like the idea of putting together a committee that includes business owners in the County to come up with an Ordinance that best fits the County's current situation
- Would like the committee to identify different types of events
- Tourism is very important for this County and very glad the County is looking at ways to increase tourism

Vice Chairman Inman noted the following regarding the current Mass Gathering Ordinance:

- Commend the previous Boards for setting up this Ordinance to protect the public welfare, public health, and safety of the citizens of Stokes County
- Would be fine to make amendments to the Ordinance as long as the integrity of the Ordinance remains
- Agreed with Commissioner Walker and Commissioner Booth

- Also commend the Interim Manager regarding the establishment of a committee to make sure there is a “win-win” situation for everyone

Chairman Lankford noted the following regarding the current Mass Gathering Ordinance:

- Agreed with the comments from fellow commissioners
- Would be good if changes could be made to increase tourism in the County
- Would like for the Interim County Manager to proceed with establishing a committee to review the current Ordinance

Commissioner Booth reiterated the need to make sure that all things were closely reviewed before any major changes were made.

Chairman Lankford, with full consensus of the Board, directed the Interim Manager to keep the Board updated.

#### **Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant Program – Update**

Interim County Manager Rick Morris presented the following information regarding Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant Program:

- The Stokes County Sheriff’s Department intends to apply for Byrne Justice Assistance Act (JAG) funding, which will be used for the purchase of equipment. For further information, please contact Captain Kenny Norman at 336-593-2466.

#### **LGC Conference Call – School Construction Loan**

Interim County Manager Rick Morris noted that the Administration staff would be participating in a conference call this Friday, July 15<sup>th</sup> with the LGC, school administration and Financial Advisor Doug Carter regarding the School Construction Loan Application.

Interim Manager Morris noted:

- County is currently in discussions with Bond Attorney regarding the requirements
- There will need to be a Public Hearing on August 8<sup>th</sup>
- Proposed Resolution will be on the July 27<sup>th</sup> Agenda and will need to be approved at the July 27<sup>th</sup> meeting
- Will be on the LGC September 13<sup>th</sup> Agenda

Commissioner Booth questioned the delay in the application and expressed concerns

about interest rates possibly increasing.

Finance Director Julia Edwards noted the following:

- County had to wait until the budget was approved in order to be able to put on the application that the County had approved a 4% Ad Valorem Tax and set up a dedicated fund to pay for school debt, one question the LGC will ask, "How do you intend to pay for the loan"
- First application will be in September with the second application being in October
- Bids for loan rates will be on the Agenda for the last meeting in August, which will set the interest rate before the application goes to LGC
- Spoke with BB& T representative who indicates that the interest rates are currently holding
- Will also be including the purchase of the land for the new elementary school if possible in order to hopefully lower the interest rate and save dollars

Interim Manager Morris noted the following regarding the County's impoundment lot:

- Staff is still looking at expanding the impoundment lot due to the several vehicles being damaged by possibly coyotes, who are trying to get wild cats who hide in the cars
- Looking at the former prison location for a possible site
- Will provide the Board with a cost analysis regarding the current location versus the former prison location at the next meeting
- Sheriff is looking at possibly being able to fund a portion of the cost
- Have taken steps to try to eliminate the problem

Vice Chairman Inman noted that the new PART "Park and Ride Lot" in King has been completed on the old Bojangles' location (NCDOT provided the land).

Vice Chairman Inman stated that Stokes County has not contributed any County tax dollars to PART. Vice Chairman noted that he felt that the service should be a user tax and not County funds being appropriated.

Commissioner Walker confirmed that Commissioner Jones was on out of town this week.

Commissioner Booth reiterated the excellent job done by Public Buildings with the recent work done at the modular unit above the hospital which probably saved the taxpayers several, several thousand dollars.

- Provided the Board with a sample copy of the 2011 tax bill with the new 4 cent tax for New Schools/F-Tech Fund

- The section on the current bill that list the taxing district is completely filled up with the addition of the New Schools/F-Tech Fund
- Will start working with software company to redesign a new bill that will utilize updated technology and will provide the citizen with more information

Tax Administrator Jake Oakley submitted the following Late Application for Elderly and Disabled Exemption for 2011:

- Late application for Teresa R. Morse
- Taxpayer owns a Single Mobile Home located on HWY 770 with an assigned tax value of \$10,561
- Requesting acceptance of a late application for the year 2011 for the elderly and disabled exemption
- Review of her application and accompanying documentation indicate that they qualify for exemption
- Due to the circumstances of the request and discussion with Ms. Morse, Tax Administration recommends the Board of Commissioners approve the late application

The Board discussed the item with Tax Administrator Oakley.

Tax Administrator Jake Oakley submitted the following Request for Exemption- Late Application (per NCGS 105-282.1) for the Board's consideration:

Tax Administrator Oakley noted the Tax Office recommends approval for the Late Application for Request for Exemption for New Life Church.

Tax Administrator Jake Oakley submitted the following Write-Off Amounts for Deceased and Insolvent EMS, Motor Vehicle and Personal Property Bills:

- Deceased and Insolvent Motor Vehicles Bills in the amount of \$4,506.41 (129 accounts)
- Deceased Insolvent Personal Property Bills in the amount of \$4,080.31 (54 accounts)
- Deceased and Insolvent EMS Bills in the amount of \$17,125.12 (65 accounts)

Tax Administrator Oakley recommended the following Write Off of Insolvent Bills:

- Deceased Insolvent Motor Vehicles Bills in the amount of \$4,506.41 (NCGS 105-373.4(h) and NCGS105-378)
- Deceased and Insolvent Personal Property Bills in the amount of \$4,080.31 (NCGS 105-378)

- Deceased and Insolvent EMS Bills in the amount of \$17,125.12 (NCGS 105-378)

Chairman Lankford confirmed with Tax Administrator Oakley that every effort has been made to collect these insolvent bills.

Tax Administrator Oakley noted the following:

- If the State takes over the motor vehicle bills in July 2013, this will solve a big issue for the County
- The State has deferred taking over the motor vehicle bills twice, not sure if it will happen in 2013
- County will be doing a lot of advertising in 2012 to make sure the taxpayers are aware of the new billing process by the State
- It is my understanding that if a taxpayer has delinquent taxes on any vehicle, the taxpayer will not be able to renew any motor vehicle tag owned by that same taxpayer until the delinquent taxes are paid
- Interest on unpaid bills is 5% the first month and ¾% each following month until the bill is paid
- 3% of the first 5% goes to the State which is being used to implement the new program

Chairman Lankford, with full consensus of the Board, directed the Clerk to place the following on the July 25<sup>th</sup> Consent Agenda:

- Late Application for Elderly and Disabled Exemption
- Late Application for Exemption
- Write off of Insolvent EMS, Motor Vehicle, and Personal Property Bills

#### **Tax Administration Report – Fiscal Year 2010-2011**

Tax Administrator Jake Oakley presented the following Fiscal Year 2010-11 Tax

Administration Report:

- Under NCGS 105-321, the Tax Administrator was charged with the collection of Current Year taxes in the amount of \$20,744,514.00 which was based upon a 96.25% collection rate of total estimated values of \$3,592,123,717.00
- During F/Y 10-11, the Tax Administration actually billed (real/personal, all utilities, and motor vehicles) in the amount of \$21,734,205.47 in current taxes, based on a value of \$3,622,367,579.00
- The following illustration outlines the difference between the estimated (budgeted) and the actual billings relating to F/Y 10-11 budget:

You are further authorized, empowered, and commanded to collect the 2011 taxes charged and assessed as provided by law for adjustments, changes, and additions to the tax records and tax bills delivered to you which are made in accordance with law per G.S. 105-321(b). Such taxes are hereby declared to be a first lien on real property of the respective taxpayers in Stokes County, King Fire District, Rural Hall Fire District, Walnut Cove Fire District, Stokes County Service District, the Town of Walnut Cove, the Town of Danbury and the City of King per G.S. 105-354, as provided by law. This order shall be full and sufficient authority to direct, require, and enable you to garnish wages, to attach rents, cash receipts, checking accounts, and savings accounts; levy on and sell any real or personal property of such taxpayers, for and on account thereof, in accordance with law.
