The Juvenile Crime Prevention Council (JCPC) has studied the risk factors and needs of Juvenile Court involved youth in this county and hereby publishes this Request for Proposals. The JCPC anticipates expansion funds from the NC Dept. of Public Safety, Division of Juvenile Justice in the amount stated above to fund the program types specified below. Such programs will serve delinquent and at-risk youth for the state **fiscal year 2022-2023** beginning on, or after, **July 1, 2022**. The use of these funds in this county **requires a local match** in the amount specified above.

The JCPC will consider proposals for the following needed programs:

Proposed program services should target the following risk factors for delinquency or repeat delinquency:

Adjudicated youth who sometimes or regularly associate with delinquent youth and lack pro-social peers, have moderate or serious school behavioral problems, have some substance use or abuse, runaway behavior and are in need of further assessment or treatment and youth who have committed prior offenses.

Programs should address the following concerns as reported in the Needs Assessments for adjudicated youth:

Peer Domain:	Adjudicated youth who sometimes associate with delinquent peers or lack pro-social peers.
Individual Domain:	Adjudicated or at risk youth who need substance abuse assessment and/or treatment, need mental health assessments and/or treatment, runaway behavior and have a history of victimization. Increases in the severity of substance abuse and mental health issues has been observed.
Family Domain:	Adjudicated youth who have parents who have marginal parenting skills, reside in homes with domestic discord and who have family members who have past or current involvement in the criminal justice system.
School Domain:	Adjudicated or at risk youth who have multiple unexcused absences, short term or long term suspensions or who have school disciplinary problems.

Applicants are being sought that are able to address items below:

1. Program services compatible with research that are shown to be effective with juvenile offenders.
2. Program services are outcome-based.
3. The program has an evaluation component.
4. Program services detect gang participation and divert individuals from gang participation.
5. Applicants are encouraged to be innovative and submit proposals that meet multiple program needs.

Local public agencies, 501(c)(3) non-profit corporations and local housing authorities are invited to submit applications to provide services addressing the above elements.
