# M-90 Transbay Freight Service Project

At least one major shipper in the Northeast Wisconsin region has identified increasing levels of freight that can be shipped via marine transportation across the Bay of Green Bay, instead of over the surface road network. This potential cargo movement opens up opportunities to secure public benefits of reduced roadway congestion, decreased wear and tear on roads and bridges, decreased risk of large truck safety incidents, and a more resilient and sustainable regional transportation system.

This innovative service as contemplated is a true public-private partnership. It involves a private vessel operator and privately-operated waterfront loading/unloading facilities. The benefits of the service accrue to both the public and the primary shipper, Fincantieri Marine Group (FMG), which operates at the three sites identified in the map below.



The US Secretary of Transportation has designated the M-90 Marine Highway Route throughout the Great Lakes as a route on which marine freight services such as this one can develop, with federal support. To qualify for further federal support, the planned service itself must be first designated by the US Secretary of Transportation. This process, called 'project/service designation', requires a public agency applicant to provide details of the planned service, as well as analysis of the potential benefits. FMG is seeking appropriate partnerships for this service. The next deadline for applying for a federal project/service designation is January 31, 2021.
