

North First Avenue) through the generosity of the artist as part of the City's <u>Revolving Sculpture Loan</u>

Pennsylvania Street, and was sponsored by Destination Sturgeon Bay through the generosity of private citizens and local businesses. This piece was produced entirely by the staff of Fincantieri Bay Shipbuilding in Sturgeon Bay.



Bronze Eagle Monument, design rendered by Wisconsin artist Mark Mille and cast by Domus Dei Sud foundry in Rome, Italy sits atop the Veterans Memorial at Sturgeon Bay's City Hall, 421 Michigan Street.



Woolly by Carl Vanderheyden, roams the Sturgeon
Bay Segment of the Ice Age Trail in Bay View Park,
10 West Larch Street, and was a generous gift to the City
of Sturgeon Bay from local citizens and businesses.

Owl and Bass (the string variety, not the fish). Local legend has it that a former Municipal Services director bartered a season at the City's Farmer's Market at no charge in exchange for a woodcarver's creation from the remains of a tree that had to be removed from Martin Park, 207 So. Third Avenue. The identity of the woodcarver may be lost to history. The double bass instrument is perfectly fitting as this park contains a bandstand and is home to the City's summer concert series "Harmony by the Bay". The reason for including the owl? Whooooo knows?



Tree Sturgeon. The 2020's brought the heartbreaking loss of Countless mature trees all over Door County. Rolling with Mother Nature's punches, this tall sturgeon was created in the backyard of a private residence at 221 Louisiana Street. This wood carvingis best viewed from the public parking lot on Second Avenue between Louisiana and Michigan Streets. As this piece is privately owned, please be respectful of the resident's privacy and enjoy the view from the parking lot.



<u>Centennial Capsule.</u> This piece, donated by the Fred Peterson Foundation, is made of Aluminum and was fabricated by the former Peterson Builders of Sturgeon Bay in 1976. It identifies the location of a time capsule buried on that spot in Martin Park, 207 So. Third Avenue, which will be unearthed and its contents and history revealed by the City Administrator in 2076.



It's a ZOO out there! This collection of painted metal, exotic animals and their pelican friend are displayed on the west lawn of a private home at 221 Louisiana Street. These unusual pieces are much loved by young and old alike, but as they are privately owned, please be respectful of the resident's privacy and remain on the Louisiana Street sidewalk as you view them.

Program's featured artist was Sister Bay fused glass artist Gary Chaudoir and also featured Door County woodworker Joel McOlash. The installation incorporates fused glass circles framed by wood and planter boxes to enhance the south wall of the Jodi Rose

Studios / Enclave by Jodi Rose Studios, 120 So. Madison Avenue, and is easily viewed from the adjacent sidewalk and south-side parking lot.

Paint by Number CommUNITY Mural

by Wisconsin artist(s) <u>Erin LaBonte</u> in collaboration with <u>Don Krumpos</u>, <u>Gabby Krumpos</u>, and Community Members at Bayside Bargains, <u>14 South Madison Street</u>, on the corner of Madison and Maple Streets. The mural was sponsored by the Sturgeon Bay Historical Society and Door County Granary Project through the generosity of a private donor to honor the historic Teweles & Brandeis Granary. The mural is on the north and west sides of the building and is <u>best viewed from Maple</u> Street.



UW Sea Grant 50th Anniversary Mural

by Wisconsin artists <u>Erin LaBonte</u> and <u>Don Krumpos</u>, and scientist and teacher <u>Jody Henseler</u>, displayed at City Hall, **421 Michigan Street**, and commissioned by the University of Wisconsin Sea Grant in celebration of their 50th anniversary.



North Pierhead Light, Sturgeon Bay Canal was created by local artist and painter <u>Aaron Holland</u> and adorns the east wall of the BP gas station, 253 Michigan Street, on the corner of Third Avenue and Michigan Street. The mural faces and is best viewed from Third Avenue.




<u>Fruits of Sturgeon Bay</u> by Wisconsin artist <u>Santos Zingale</u> was commissioned during the nation's Great Depression by the U.S. Treasury Department's Section of Fine Arts for the U.S. Post Office, Sturgeon Bay. The full mural hangs in the post office lobby, <u>359 Louisiana Street</u>, above the Postmaster's door. The post office is on the corner of Louisiana Street and Fourth Avenue. This piece removed, restored by Wisconsin artist and conservationist <u>Anton Rajer</u>, and reinstalled in 1984.




Left half of mural

<u>Tambourine</u> was designed by musician <u>pat</u>
<u>mAcdonald</u> and painted by Eau Claire, WI artists
<u>Jason Anhorn</u> and <u>Steve Bateman</u>. The mural was
commissioned by the Holiday Music Motel for
their Tambourine Collaboratory Building at <u>59</u>
North Second Avenue. Though the building is
located on the corner of Second Avenue and
Louisiana Street, the mural covers the south and
west sides of the building and <u>is best viewed</u>
from First Avenue.



Twin Murals - maritime and agricultural
scenes by Door County native Jessie Kalmbach
Chase once flanked the stage of the old
Sturgeon Bay High School auditorium.
The murals are now under the care of the
Miller Art Museum and are on display in the
Sturgeon Bay Branch of the Door County
Library, 107 South Fourth Avenue, on the corner
of South Fourth Avenue and Nebraska Street.





<u>Catch and Release</u> by <u>Meg Lionel Murphy</u>, a Sturgeon Bay native, adorns the <u>front of The Hours</u>, 41 W. Maple Street, a gallery just one block west of Madison Avenue in west Sturgeon Bay. Be sure to look around the corner of the building, as a <u>second mural faces the alley to the west</u> (see below).



<u>Tug</u> also by Sturgeon Bay native <u>Meg Lionel Murphy</u>, Embellishes the <u>west side</u> of The Hours, 41 W. Maple Street and <u>is best viewed from the alley off Maple Street to the</u> west of the building.



<u>Steel Bridge Sturgeon???</u> by <u>XXXXX</u> was commissioned by the Popelka Trenchard Gallery & Glass Studio and is painted on the brick front of the building, 64 So. Second Avenue, on the corner of Second Avenue and Nebraska Streets in the <u>Steel Bridge Creative District.</u>
