

MOUNT AIRY-SURRY COUNTY AIRPORT AUTHORITY MINUTES

A meeting of the Mount Airy-Surry County Airport Commission was held on February 17, 1969 at the airport with Raymond A. Smith, John McKenzie, and Howard O. Woltz, Jr. being present. Dave McGavock reported on the status on Mount Airy aviation. He reported that the hangar doors had been installed on the 80' x 80' storage hangar. He reported that the doors on the T-hangar still do not function properly.

The commission approved paying Crawford Door Company \$4055.65 as payment in full, and that Varco be paid \$2500.00. This would leave a balance due in the amount of \$1036.00. Howard O. Woltz, Jr. was instructed to write Varco informing them that the balance due would be held until the doors on the T-hangar are made satisfactory. The commission approved a final payment to E. R. Short & Sons in the amount of \$14,642.38 upon receipt from E. R. Short & Sons of their pledge to the airport commission in the amount of \$1000.00.

Howard O. Woltz, Jr. was instructed to arrange a loan with Northwestern Bank in the amount of \$13,000.00 to cover these payments.

Raymond A. Smith reported that the final payment to be received from the FAA should be in the amount of \$16,264.97, and that the \$13,000.00 loan can be repaid upon receipt of this payment.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned.

Mount Airy-Surry County Airport Authority Minutes

A meeting of the Mount Airy-Surry County Airport Authority was held on February 17, 1962 at the airport with Raymond A. Smith, John Coltrane, and Howard O. Wolke, Jr. being present. The meeting reported on the status of Mount Airy aviation. It was reported that the banner doors had been installed on the T-hanger above hangar. He reported that the doors on the T-hanger still do not function properly.

The committee approved paying Crawford Tool Company \$6057.61 as payment in full, and that Vance be paid \$2500.00. This would leave a balance due to the amount of \$10384.00. Howard O. Wolke, Jr. was instructed to write Vance informing that the balance he would be held until the doors on the T-hanger are well along. The committee approved a final payment to R. T. Short & Sons in the amount of \$14,642.32 upon receipt from R. T. Short & Sons of their pledge to the airport committee in the amount of \$100,000.

Howard O. Wolke, Jr. was instructed to remove a loan with Western Bank in the amount of \$13,000.00 to cover these payments.

Raymond A. Smith reported that the final payment to be received from the FAA should be in the amount of \$11,384.00, and that the \$13,000.00 loan can be repaid upon receipt of this payment.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned.

MOUNT AIRY - SURRY COUNTY AIRPORT
COMMISSION

A meeting of the Mount Airy - Surry County Airport Commission was held at 8:00 P.M. Monday, May 5, 1969, at the office of Dixie Exposaic, Inc. with Floyd Pike, Chairman, presiding, and with R. A. Smith, Howard O. Woltz, Jr., John Banner, Jr., Sandy McGavock and Dave McGavock attending.

Finances were reviewed by R. A. Smith and the remaining uncollected pledges were assigned to members of the Commission for one final effort at collection.

Mount Airy Aviation Company presented bills they had paid totaling \$444.14 for ramp sealer, barn door rail and weekly bills. It was agreed that these were proper expenses of the Commission and reimbursement was authorized unanimously.

The Commissioners approved payment to Holcomb Hardware in the amount of \$195.96 for shrubbery upon Bill Holcomb's guarantee to replace any shrubs that die before becoming established.

The Commissioners approved the bill of Pike Electric Company in the amount of \$3,453.21 for payment - said bill being for installation of wiring in the hangar buildings and some replacement of runway lighting.


Purchase of a 5-gallon per hour water cooler for the office was approved.


The progress of Mount Airy Aviation was reviewed and the Commissioners expressed approval of the progress being made.
