Work Description. (Required to process permit)

Plan Review Required.

All projects over 3500 square feet require an electrical load calculation. If the electrical system requires more than 400 amperes for the service or feeder, the applicant shall submit a detailed set of plans and specifications with the application for an electrical permit for any wiring or alteration to an electrical system and if the calculated floor area in a building is more than 3,500 square feet. The fees for an electrical projects requiring plan review will be calculated based on the final approved documents released for construction. Alternative energy sources require plan review and verification that the existing service equipment is adequate for such an installation is required at the time of application.

General

Electrical work shall not be started until the application for permit has been filed. All installations shall be in conformance with Michigan Electrical Code. No work shall be concealed until it has been inspected. When ready for an inspection, call the inspector providing at least 48 hrs in advance plus job location and permit number.

Issuance of Permits

This is an application only. Permits will be issued after review by the authority having jurisdiction. Work shall not commence until the permit is issued or by permission of the AHJ. No permit shall last longer than 180 days from the initial date or the last inspection

Applications and Extensions

The authority having jurisdiction may grant a single 180-day extension of the original permit time period of 180 days, upon presentation of the permittee of a satisfactory reason for failure to start or complete the work or activity authorized by the permit.

Homeowner Affidavit

I hereby certify the electrical work described on this permit application shall be installed by myself in my own home in which I am living or about to occupy. All work shall be installed in accordance with the Electrical Code and shall not be enclosed, covered up, or put into operation until it has been inspected and approved by the Electrical Inspector. I will cooperate with the Electrical Inspector and assume the responsibility to arrange for necessary inspections.

Applicant Signature

Section 23a of the State Construction Code Act of 1972, 1972 PA 230, MCL 125.1523A, prohibits a person from conspiring to circumvent the licensing requirements of this state relating to persons who are to perform work on a residential building or a residential structure. Violators of section 23a are subjected to civil fines.

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Complete application on back side

1. Application fee is non-refundable and required on all electrical permit applications.
2. Individual permits are required for multifamily units served by a separate entrance. Duplex, Townhouse, etc.
3. See Plan Review Section.
4. Service rated transfer switches require service and feeders fees with their respective amperage.
5. Enter the number of items being installed, multiply by the unit price and total for fee.
6. When installing a site service in a park, the permit application must include the application fee, service, the number of park sites and a final inspection. When setting a HUD mobile home in a park, a permit must include the application fee, service, feeder and a final inspection. These shall be done by a licensed electrical contractor.
8. When setting a HUD mobile home or a manufactured home on private property, a permit must include the application fee, service, feeder and a final inspection.
