Vaccines for Children (VFC):

Provides immunizations at no cost to eligible children, under the age of 19 (Badger Care, Native American/American Indian, uninsured, or underinsured)

To schedule an appointment or ask eligibility questions for VFC and VFA, call our Public Health Nurse at (715) 538-2311 ext. 225.

Car Seat Program:

Car seat safety education and installation assistance for all Trempealeau County families (by appointment) *car seats available for qualifying families

Safe Sleep Program:

- Education for parents and/or caregivers. (by appointment)
- *Approved portable cribs available for qualifying families

Communicable Disease Investigation:

Follow-up on communicable diseases including blood-borne, tick-borne, waterborne, or foodborne illnesses, viral infections, and sexually transmitted infections

Narcan:

NARCAN[®] is a life-saving medication used to reverse opioid overdoses. The Trempealeau County Health Department offers Narcan, along with training and education, to community partners and the general public upon request—such as school nurses, social services, libraries, taverns, and others who serve or interact with the public.
