Sec. 90-18. - Violation of Chapter or rules; penalties.

Unless otherwise specified under this Chapter, a violation of this part or rules promulgated under this Chapter is a misdemeanor civil infraction. A political subdivision having adopted a local ordinance in conformity with this Chapter may provide that any violation of the ordinance is a misdemeanor. Any person convicted of reckless operation of a vessel as defined in MCL 324.80147, or of operating a motorboat while under the influence of alcoholic liquor or narcotic drugs, or with any amount of a controlled substance listed in schedule 1 under section 7212 of the public health code, 1978 PA 368, MCL 333.7212, or a rule promulgated under that section, or of a controlled substance described in section 7214(a)(iv) of the public health code, 1978 PA 368, MCL 333.7214, in his or her body, in addition to any other penalty, may be refused by the court having jurisdiction of the violation the right of operating any motorboat on any of the waters of this state for a period of not more than 2 years.

Sec. 90-67. - Same—Motorboats by children.

- (a) Except as otherwise provided in this section in addition to the requirements of subsection (b), a person less than 12 years of age shall not operate a motorboat that is powered by a motor or motors totaling more than 6 horsepower on the waters of this township unless all both of the following conditions are met:
 - (1) He or she has been issued and is in possession of a boating safety certificate.
 - (2<u>1</u>)He or she is under the direct supervision of a person on board the motorboat who is 16 years of age or older <u>and who, if born on or after July 1, 1996, has been issued a boating safety certificate</u>.
 - (32)The motorboat he or she operates is powered by a motor totaling no more than 35 horsepower.
- (b) Subject to subsection (d), a person who is born on or after July 1, 1996 shall not operate a motorboat that is powered by a motor or motors totaling more than 6 horsepower on the waters of this township unless the person has been issued and is in possession of a boating safety certificate.
- Except as otherwise provided in this section, a person 12 through 15 years of age may operate a motorboat on the waters of this township only if that person complies with either of the following:
 - (1) He or she is accompanied by at least one person 16 years of age or older.
 - (2) He or she is in possession of a boating safety certificate issued after he or she has satisfactorily completed a department approved course in boating safety.
- (c) A person operating a motorboat as described in this section shall present the boating safety certificate issued to him or her upon the demand of any peace officer who identifies himself or herself as a peace officer. A person who violates this subsection is guilty of a misdemeanor.

- (d) An individual who, under subsection (c), displays an electronic copy of his or her boating safety certificate using an electronic device is not presumed to have consented to a search of the electronic device. This state, an employee of this state, a peace officer, or an entity employing the peace officer is not liable for damage to or loss of an electronic device that occurs as a result of the peace officer's viewing an electronic copy of a boating safety certificate as provided in this section, regardless of whether the peace officer was in possession of the electronic device at the time the damage or loss occurred This section does not apply to the operation of a motorboat that is powered by a motor totaling no more than six horsepower.
- (e) Beginning July 1, 2012, a person who is born on or after July 1, 1996 shall not operate a motorboat on the waters of this township unless the person has been issued and is in possession of a boating safety certificate.

Sec. 90-69. — Reckless operation by operator or person being towed.

- (a) If a person carelessly and heedlessly operates a vessel upon the waters of this township in disregard of the rights or safety of others, or without due caution and circumspection, or at a rate of speed or in a manner that endangers or is likely to endanger a person or property, that person is guilty of <u>the misdemeanor of</u> reckless operation of a vessel_ and is subject to the penalties described in subsection (c) of this section.
- (b) If a person who, while being towed on water skis, water sled, surfboard, or a similar contrivance upon the waters of this township, carelessly and heedlessly navigates, steers, or controls himself in disregard of the rights or safety of others, or without due caution and circumspection and in a manner that endangers or is likely to endanger a person or property, that person is guilty of <u>the misdemeanor of</u> reckless operation of the contrivance that he or she controls, and is subject to the penalties described in subsection (c) of this section.
- (c) Upon a person's conviction under this section, the court may issue an order prohibiting that person from operating a vessel on the waters of this township for a period of not more than two years. Upon a person's subsequent conviction under this section, the court shall order that person to participate in and complete a marine safety educational program approved by the department of natural resources. An order issued pursuant to this subsection is in addition to any other penalty authorized under this article.

Sec. 90-67. - Same—Motorboats by children.

- (a) In addition to the requirements of subsection (b), a person less than 12 years of age shall not operate a motorboat that is powered by a motor or motors totaling more than 6 horsepower on the waters of this township unless both of the following conditions are met:
 - (1) He or she is under the direct supervision of a person on board the motorboat who is 16 years of age or older and who, if born on or after July 1, 1996, has been issued a boating safety certificate.
 - (2) The motorboat he or she operates is powered by a motor totaling no more than 35 horsepower.
- (b) Subject to subsection (d), a person who is born on or after July 1, 1996 shall not operate a motorboat that is powered by a motor or motors totaling more than 6 horsepower on the waters of this township unless the person has been issued and is in possession of a boating safety certificate.
- (c) A person operating a motorboat as described in this section shall present the boating safety certificate issued to him or her upon the demand of a peace officer who identifies himself or herself as a peace officer. A person who violates this subsection is guilty of a misdemeanor.

(d) An individual who, under subsection (c), displays an electronic copy of his or her boating safety certificate using an electronic device is not presumed to have consented to a search of the electronic device. of Chapter 46 (Fire Prevention and Protection) to read as follows:

THE CHARTER TOWNSHIP OF VAN BUREN ("Township"), COUNTY OF WAYNE, MICHIGAN ORDAINS:

Sec. 46-31. - Adoption.

- (a) The 2021 edition of NFPA 1 (Fire Prevention Code) and the 2021 edition of NFPA, 101 (Life Safety Code), 2021 appendices and documents adopted by Chapter 2 of that NFPA Code, and the 2021 edition of the International Fire Code (IFC), one copy of which is on file and is open to inspection by the public in the office of the township clerk, be and hereby is adopted and incorporated into this article as fully as if set out at length herein, and from the date on which this article shall take effect, the provisions thereof shall be controlling within the jurisdictional limits of the township fire department. The same are hereby adopted as the code of the township fire department for the purpose of prescribing regulations governing conditions hazardous to life and property from fire or explosion and providing for issuance of permits and collection of fees.
- (b) In the event of a conflict between any of the provisions of the Fire Prevention Code and the National Fire Codes, as adopted in (a) of this section, and any other provision of this chapter or any other local ordinance, resolution, rule or regulation, the local provision shall control. In the event of a conflict between any of the provisions of the Fire Prevention Code and the National Fire Codes, as adopted in division (a) of this section, and any State law, rule or regulation, the stricter standard shall control.
