The Transportation Program

Our program assists Van Buren Township Seniors in getting to their doctor's appointments as well as local errands. Transportation is available Monday through Friday.

Appointments must be scheduled between 10:00am and 2:00pm. The last pickup is 2:00pm. Reservations must be made 48 hours in advance by calling (734) 699-8945.

Rides will be scheduled as calls are received. When making a reservation, be sure to include your phone number. Medical appointments take priority over non-medical transportation. Rides in Van Buren/Belleville are \$2.00 each way.

Welcome To Our New Space at Haggerty

On April 15th, the Van Buren Senior Center closed its doors at Township Hall. Now, the Center is preparing to open its doors at our new and temporary home, Haggerty School, until the upcoming Community Center is complete at Van Buren Township.

Preparations for the move to Haggerty School have been no small feat. It took months of preparation by the entire Senior Center staff filtering the accumulated materials from classes and programs, and then packing the supplies and equipment to be moved. Pat McBride, Senior Coordinator at the Center, as well as all of the staff and volunteers, have worked tirelessly to pack up over thirty-five years of classes and programs that were housed in Township Hall.

On May 26th, after the intense packing process, large moving trucks rolled up to Township Hall to pick up our materials and take them to Haggerty. Despite the large size of the trucks, it still took several trips to get everything moved. Wow, do we have a lot of (good) stuff!

In addition to moving equipment, some Senior Center classes were moved as well. Quirk Park became the new location for such classes as Zumba Gold, Cardio Drumming, and Tai Chi. Very soon, classes will be operational at Haggerty School, but in the meantime, class members have been going strong in the fresh air, as demonstrated by the Zumba Gold class on June 8th (see picture below).



This move has required many meetings with Senior Center staff, as well as coordinating with our Community Services Dept., I.T. Dept., the Dept. of Public Works, and our Communications Dept. in order to make this move come to fruition. Each and every department has gone above and beyond tending to the many details required to get the Center up and running. "Teamwork at its finest! I'm so honored and grateful to have had the opportunity to work alongside all of these great people," said Lynette Jordan, Senior Center Director.

As we settle in to our temporary home, the Senior Center staff would like to extend a thank you to Pete Kudlak, Van Buren Schools Superintendent, who generously offered Haggerty School as a temporary location for the Center. Also, we thank Elizabeth Renaud, Community Services Director, for seeing through both the completion of the building lease and the approval from the Township Board. Additionally, we are grateful to our Township Officials' acknowledgment of the need and importance to our community to continue the programs and services we provide to our senior members and residents.

The Senior Center staff are so excited to see the new space take shape. We are very close to announcing the opening date, and can't wait to do so. We hope to see you at the Center. Come on in, get involved and stay active!
