The Transportation Program

Our program assists Van Buren Township Seniors in getting to their doctor's appointments as well as local errands. Transportation is available Monday through Friday within a 20 mile radius.

Appointments must be scheduled between 10:00am and 2:00pm. The last pickup is 2:00pm.

Rides will be scheduled as calls are received. When making a reservation, be sure to include your phone number. Medical appointments take priority over non-medical transportation. Rides in Van Buren/Belleville are \$2.00 each way. Call for transportation at (734) 699-8945.

Staying Safe And Celebrating A Milestone

This year, the week of Sunday, October 9 marks the 100th annual Fire Prevention Week, which will be recognized across the country. In 1922, Fire Prevention Week was established by the National Fire Protection Association to educate children and adults on fire safety. The week of October 9 was chosen in commemoration of the Great Chicago Fire, which began on October 8, 1871 killing more than 250 people and burning more than 17,400 structures. With the peak months for home fires approaching, which are December through March, it is important to be mindful of information and resources that are available for the safety of our residents.

This year, the NFPA's focus for Fire Prevention Week is "Fire won't wait. Plan Your Escape." Unfortunately, today's homes burn faster than ever. You may have as little as two minutes to safely escape your home in the event of a fire, making it crucial to plan your exit from any room in your home. The NFPA recommends that families draw a map of their home by floor, marking two exit points for each room (usually one door and one window). Also, note the locations of smoke detectors in your home. Then, choose a meeting spot for everyone to meet outside of the home. Make sure to call 911 as well.

According to the NFPA, almost two-thirds of home fire deaths are a result of fires in properties without smoke alarms. To help combat this, the Van Buren Township Public Safety Department strongly encourages all residences have working smoke detectors installed. If you don't have a working smoke detector, the Fire Department offers will install one in your home for free. Simply go online and fill out a form, or call the Department at (734) 699-8928 to get one installed free of charge. Smoke alarms significantly increase your chances of surviving a deadly home fire. Make sure you have them installed in your home, and check those batteries.
