



**Webster Township Special Meeting between
The Board of Trustees and the Washtenaw County Road Commission
January 16, 2024, at 6:00 P.M.**

The Webster Township Special Meeting between the Webster Township Board of Trustees and the Washtenaw County Road Commission was called to order at 6:00 p.m. by Supervisor John Kingsley on January 16, 2024, at the Webster Township Hall, 5665 Webster Church Road, Dexter, MI 48130. Members present: Supervisor John Kingsley; Clerk Barb Calleja; Treasurer John Scharf; Trustees Dan Munzel, Jeff Harms, John Westman, Shelly Vrsek; Assessor Bill Sinkule; Deputy Supervisor Rick Kleinschmidt; Deputy Clerk Donna Whitney; and 8 citizens.

Call to Order

Agenda

1. Discussion on road projects for FY 2025.

Local Matching funds have been increased for the calendar year to \$75,717.

Proposed road projects by WCRC:

1. **Joy Road, Jennings Road to Pavement**-work to include drainage improvements, forestry, shaping the existing surface, and the application of 8" of 23A Limestone (C.I.P.) (approximately 5,400 tons) with associated dust control and project restoration.
Estimated project cost: \$183,000.00
2. **Chamberlin Road, Huron River Drive to North Territorial Road**- work to include drainage improvements and associated project restoration.
Estimated project cost: \$58,000
3. **Gregory Road at Cobble Lane**-Work to include drainage improvements, forestry, shaping the existing surface, and the application of 4" of 23A Limestone (C.I.P.) (approximately 700 tons) with associated dust control and project restoration.
Estimated project cost: \$70,000



Questions from the Board

Where does Walsh Road stand? WCRC recommends possibly working on smaller segments of Walsh Road and suggests starting with working on drainage first. WCRC has some quotes/estimates ready on Walsh.

Discussion on where Farrell Road stands and why it has fallen off the list? WCRC agreed that Farrell Road still needs work.

Discussion on Chamberlin and the amount and size of berms on that road. Could limestone & shape be added to the current estimate in the amount of approximately \$125,000 to the Chamberlin proposed project?

The traffic signal at Webster Church Road & N. Territorial Road should be in by spring of 2024.

WCRC was asked why Joy Rd is not a primary road. Responded that they do not know and they have no influence or input on what roads are classified.

Requests from the Board to WCRC:

Traffic control studies & information on the process to turn a road into a primary road.
